The 2026 Officers Summit was conducted February 23–25, providing officers with targeted professional development in leadership, incident command, and operational decision making. The summit combined leadership presentations, scenario-based discussions, and collaborative EMS simulation training with the University of Montevallo Nursing Program, strengthening coordination between first responders and healthcare partners while reinforcing best practices in emergency response.

A meaningful component of the summit also focused on service to others, as officers partnered with the Falcon Flight program, working alongside students in team-based activities that emphasized encouragement, leadership, and community engagement. The summit concluded with hands on operational training, including live-fire and aerial drills, reinforcing teamwork, tactical proficiency, and the continued development of the department’s officer leadership.
