# NON FUNDED CHALLENGE COST SHARE AGREEMENT Between LINCOLN COUNTY, WYOMING AND TOWN OF ALPINE, WYOMING And The USDA, FOREST SERVICE CARIBOU-TARGHEE NATIONAL FOREST

This NON FUNDED CHALLENGE COST SHARE AGREEMENT is hereby entered into by and between board of Commissioners, Lincoln County, Wyoming (Lincoln County, Wyoming) and the Town of Alpine, Wyoming (Town of Alpine, Wyoming), hereinafter referred to as "the Cooperators," and the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA), Forest Service, Caribou-Targhee National Forest, hereinafter referred to as the "U.S. Forest Service," under the authority: Department of Interior and Related Agencies Appropriation Act of 1992, Pub. L. 102-154.

Title: Alpine Boat Ramp and Dock Maintenance

### I. PURPOSE:

The purpose of this agreement is to document the cooperation between the parties to provide a safe, well-maintained recreational boat ramp area for the public's use in accordance with the following provisions and the hereby incorporated Operating Plan, attached as Exhibit A and Financial Plan, attached as Exhibit B.

### II. STATEMENT OF MUTUAL BENEFIT AND INTERESTS:

The Alpine Boat Ramp is located on the right bank of the Snake River and upper reaches of Palisades Reservoir adjacent to the incorporated Town of Alpine, Lincoln County, Wyoming. The Alpine Boat Ramp is a concrete slip that provides public access to Palisades Reservoir and serves as a takeout location for Snake River and Grays River floaters. The access site is subject to reservoir level fluctuations, a steep ramp slope and heavy silt loading. The access site historically was maintained through an agreement between the Caribou-Targhee National Forest and Lincoln County, Wyoming. That agreement expired in 2022, and since that time, local volunteers have maintained the access site.

The Town of Alpine, Wyoming desires to have a safe boating site that is attractive to town residents and visitors. In addition, revenue to local businesses may increase from the many boating recreationalists that come to utilize the boat ramp.



Lincoln County, Wyoming is responsible for conducting Search and Rescue operations on the Palisades Reservoir. Having a maintained boat ramp and dock closer to their duty station would enable them to respond faster and safer.

The forest Service is responsible for managing the Alpine Boat Ramp, as authorized by the Bureau of Reclamation, in a safe manner for public land and water users.

This partnership will allow for improvements to the Alpine Boat Ramp that will provide public users a new, safe dock for water recreation access, increase public use and enjoyment of the area, reduce resource damage to the area, and help prevent the spread of invasive species.

In consideration of the above premises, the parties agree as follows:

### III. LINCOLN COUNTY, WYOMING SHALL:

- A. <u>LEGAL AUTHORITY</u>. Lincoln County Wyoming shall have the legal authority to enter into this agreement, and the institutional, managerial, and financial capability to ensure proper planning, management, and completion of the project, which includes funds sufficient to pay the nonfederal share of project costs, when applicable.
- B. Perform in Accordance with the hereby incorporated Operating Plan, attached as Exhibit A, and Financial Plan, attached as Exhibit B.

### IV. THE TOWN OF ALPINE, WYOMING SHALL:

- A. <u>LEGAL AUTHORITY</u>. The Town of Alpine, Wyoming shall have the legal authority to enter into this agreement, and the institutional, managerial, and financial capability to ensure proper planning, management, and completion of the project, which includes funds sufficient to pay the nonfederal share of project costs, when applicable.
- B. Performance in accordance with the hereby incorporated Operating Plan, attached as Exhibit A and Financial Plan, attached as Exhibit B.

### C. THE U.S. FOREST SERVICE SHALL:

A. Perform in accordance with the hereby incorporated Operating Plan, attached as Exhibit A, and Financial Plan, attached as Exhibit B

To the U.S. Forest Service Program Manager, at the address specified in the agreement.

To the Cooperators, at the address shown in the agreement or such other address designated within the agreement.

Notices are effective when delivered in accordance with this provision, or on the effective date of the notice, whichever is later.



- C. <u>PARTICIPATION IN SIMILAR ACTIVITIES</u>. This agreement in no way restricts the U.S. Forest Service or the Cooperators from participating in similar activities with other public or private agencies, organizations, and individuals.
- D. <u>ENDORSEMENT</u>. Any of the Cooperators's contributions made under this agreement do not by direct reference or implication convey U.S. Forest Service endorsement of the Cooperators's products or activities.
- E. <u>USE OF U.S. FOREST SERVICE INSIGNIA</u>. In order for the Cooperators to use the U.S. Forest Service insignia on any published media, such as a Web page, printed publication, or audiovisual production, permission must be granted from the U.S. Forest Service's Office of Communications (Washington Office). A written request will be submitted by the U.S. Forest Service Caribou-Targhee National Forest to the Office of Communications Assistant Director, Visual Information, and Publishing Services prior to use of the insignia. The U.S. Forest Service Caribou-Targhee National Forest will notify the the Cooperators when permission is granted.
- F. NON-FEDERAL STATUS FOR COOPERATOR PARTICIPANTS. The Cooperators agree(s) that any of their employees, volunteers, and program participants shall not be deemed to be Federal employees for any purposes including Chapter 171 of Title 28, United States Code (Federal Tort Claims Act) and Chapter 81 of Title 5, United States Code (OWCP), as the Cooperators has hereby willingly agreed to assume these responsibilities.

Further, the Cooperators shall provide any necessary training to the Cooperators's employees, volunteers, and program participants to ensure that such personnel are capable of performing tasks to be completed. Lincoln County Wyoming shall also supervise and direct the work of its employees, volunteers, and participants performing under this agreement.

- G. <u>MEMBERS OF U.S. CONGRESS</u>. Pursuant to 41 U.S.C. 22, no member of, or delegate to, Congress shall be admitted to any share or part of this agreement, or benefits that may arise therefrom, either directly or indirectly.
- H. <u>NONDISCRIMINATION</u>. The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) prohibits discrimination in all its programs and activities on the basis of race, color, national origin, age, disability, and where applicable, sex, marital status, familial status, parental status, religion, sexual orientation, genetic information, political beliefs, reprisal, or because all or a part of an individual's income is derived from any public assistance program. (Not all prohibited bases apply to all programs.) - I. <u>ELIGIBLE WORKERS</u>. Lincoln County Wyoming shall ensure that all employees complete the I-9 form to certify that they are eligible for lawful employment under the Immigration and Nationality Act (8 USC 1324a). Lincoln County Wyoming shall comply with regulations regarding certification and retention of the completed forms. These requirements also apply to any contract awarded under this agreement.
- J. SYSTEM FOR AWARD MANAGEMENT REGISTRATION REQUIREMENT (SAM). Lincoln County Wyoming shall maintain current organizational information and the original Unique Entity Identifier (UEI) provided for this agreement in the System for Award Management (SAM) until receipt of final payment. This requires annual review and updates, when needed, of organizational information after the initial registration. More frequent review and updates may be required for changes in organizational information or agreement term(s). Any change to the original UEI provided in this agreement will result in termination of this agreement and deobligation of any remaining funds. For purposes of this agreement, System for Award Management (SAM) means the Federal repository into which an entity must provide information required for the conduct of business as a Cooperative. Additional information about registration procedures may be found at the SAM Internet site at www.sam.gov.
- K. <u>AGREEMENT CLOSEOUT</u>. Within 120 days after expiration or notice of termination the parties shall close out the agreement.

Within a maximum of 120 days following the date of expiration or termination of this agreement, all reports required by the terms of the agreement must be submitted to the U.S. Forest Service by Lincoln County Wyoming.

L. <u>PROGRAM MONITORING AND PROGRAM PERFORMANCE REPORTS</u>. The parties to this agreement shall monitor the performance of the agreement activities to ensure that performance goals are being achieved.

Performance reports must contain information on the following:

- A comparison of actual accomplishments to the goals established for the period. Wherever the output of the project can be readily expressed in numbers, a computation of the cost per unit of output, if applicable.
- Reason(s) for delay if established goals were not met.
- Additional pertinent information

Lincoln County Wyoming shall submit annual performance reports to the U.S. Forest Service Program Manager. These reports are due 90 days after the reporting period.



The final performance report must be submitted no later than 120 days from the expiration date of the agreement.

M. RETENTION AND ACCESS REQUIREMENTS FOR RECORDS. Lincoln County Wyoming shall retain all records pertinent to this agreement for a period of no less than 3 years from the expiration or termination date. As used in this provision, records includes books, documents, accounting procedures and practice, and other data, regardless of the type or format. Lincoln County Wyoming shall provide access and the right to examine all records related to this agreement to the U.S. Forest Service Inspector General, or Comptroller General or their authorized representative. The rights of access in this section must not be limited to the required retention period but must last as long as the records are kept.

If any litigation, claim, negotiation, audit, or other action involving the records has been started before the end of the 3-year period, the records must be kept until all issues are resolved, or until the end of the regular 3-year period, whichever is later.

N. <u>FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT (FOIA)</u>. Public access to agreement records must not be limited, except when such records must be kept confidential and would have been exempted from disclosure pursuant to Freedom of Information regulations (5 U.S.C. 552). Requests for research data are subject to 2 CFR 215.36.

Public access to culturally sensitive data and information of Federally recognized Tribes may also be explicitly limited by P.L. 110-234, Title VIII Subtitle B §8106 (2009 Farm Bill).

- O. TEXT MESSAGING WHILE DRIVING. In accordance with Executive Order (EO) 13513, "Federal Leadership on Reducing Text Messaging While Driving," any and all text messaging by Federal employees is banned: a) while driving a Government owned vehicle (GOV) or driving a privately owned vehicle (POV) while on official Government business; or b) using any electronic equipment supplied by the Government when driving any vehicle at any time. All Cooperators, their Employees, Volunteers, and Contractors are encouraged to adopt and enforce policies that ban text messaging when driving company owned, leased or rented vehicles, POVs or GOVs when driving while on official Government business or when performing any work for or on behalf of the Government.
- P. <u>PUBLIC NOTICES</u>. It is the U.S. Forest Service's policy to inform the public as fully as possible of its programs and activities. Lincoln County Wyoming is/are encouraged to give public notice of the receipt of this agreement and, from time to time, to announce progress and accomplishments. Press releases or other public notices should include a statement substantially as follows:

"Palisades Ranger District Recreation Program of the U.S. Forest Service, Department of Agriculture"



The Cooperators may call on the U.S. Forest Service's Office of Communication for advice regarding public notices. Lincoln County Wyoming is/are requested to provide copies of notices or announcements to the U.S. Forest Service Program Manager and to U.S. Forest Service's Office of Communications as far in advance of release as possible.

- Q. <u>CONTRACT REQUIREMENTS</u>. Any contract under this agreement must be awarded following the Cooperators's established procurement procedures, to ensure free and open competition, and avoid any conflict of interest (or appearance of a conflict). The Cooperators must maintain cost and price analysis documentation for potential U.S. Forest Service review. The Cooperators is/are encouraged to utilize small businesses, minority-owned firms, and women's business enterprises.
- R. GOVERNMENT-FURNISHED PROPERTY. The Cooperators may only use U.S. Forest Service property furnished under this agreement for performing tasks assigned in this agreement. Lincoln County Wyoming shall not modify, cannibalize, or make alterations to U.S. Forest Service property. A separate document, Form AD-107, must be completed to document the loan of U.S. Forest Service property. The U.S. Forest Service shall retain title to all U.S. Forest Service-furnished property. Title to U.S. Forest Service property must not be affected by its incorporation into or attachment to any property not owned by the U.S. Forest Service, nor must the property become a fixture or lose its identity as personal property by being attached to any real property.

Cooperator Liability for Government Property.

- 1. Unless otherwise provided for in the agreement, the Cooperators shall not be liable for loss, damage, destruction, or theft to the Government property furnished or acquired under this contract, except when any one of the following applies:
  - a. The risk is covered by insurance or the Cooperators is otherwise reimbursed (to the extent of such insurance or reimbursement).
  - b. The loss, damage, destruction, or theft is the result of willful misconduct or lack of good faith on the part of the Cooperators's managerial personnel. Lincoln County Wyoming's managerial personnel, in this provision, means the Cooperators's directors, officers, managers, superintendents, or equivalent representatives who have supervision or direction of all or substantially all of the Cooperators's business; all or substantially all of the Cooperators's operation at any one plant or separate location; or a separate and complete major industrial operation.
- 2. Lincoln County Wyoming shall take all reasonable actions necessary to protect the Government property from further loss, damage, destruction, or theft. Lincoln County Wyoming shall separate the damaged and undamaged Government property, place all the affected Government property in the best possible order, and take such other action as the Property Administrator directs.



- 3. Lincoln County Wyoming shall do nothing to prejudice the Government's rights to recover against third parties for any loss, damage, destruction, or theft of Government property.
- 4. Upon the request of the Grants Management Specialist, the Cooperators shall, at the Government's expense, furnish to the Government all reasonable assistance and cooperation, including the prosecution of suit and the execution of agreements of assignment in favor of the Government in obtaining recovery.
- S. OFFSETS, CLAIMS AND RIGHTS. Any and all activities entered into or approved by this agreement will create and support afforestation/reforestation efforts within the National Forest System without generating carbon credits. The U.S. Forest Service does not make claims of permanence or any guarantees of carbon sequestration on lands reforested or afforested through partner assistance. The U.S. Forest Service will provide for long-term management of reforested and afforested lands, according to applicable Federal statute, regulations and forest plans.
- T. <u>U.S. FOREST SERVICE ACKNOWLEDGED IN PUBLICATIONS</u>, <u>AUDIOVISUALS AND ELECTRONIC MEDIA</u>. Lincoln County Wyoming shall acknowledge U.S. Forest Service support in any publications, audiovisuals, and electronic media developed as a result of this agreement.
- U. NONDISCRIMINATION STATEMENT PRINTED, ELECTRONIC, OR AUDIOVISUAL MATERIAL. Lincoln County Wyoming shall include the following statement, in full, in any printed, audiovisual material, or electronic media for public distribution developed or printed with any Federal funding.

"In accordance with Federal law and U.S. Department of Agriculture policy, this institution is prohibited from discriminating on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex, age, or disability. (Not all prohibited bases apply to all programs.)

V. <u>REMEDIES FOR COMPLIANCE RELATED ISSUES</u>. If the Cooperators materially fail(s) to comply with any term of the agreement, whether stated in a Federal statute or regulation, an assurance, or the agreement, the U.S. Forest Service may wholly or partly suspend or terminate the current agreement.



- W. <u>TERMINATION BY MUTUAL AGREEMENT</u>. This agreement may be terminated, in whole or part, as follows:
  - 1. When the U.S. Forest Service and the Cooperators agree upon the termination conditions, including the effective date and, in the case of partial termination, the portion to be terminated.
  - 2. By 30 days written notification by the Cooperators to the U.S. Forest Service setting forth the reasons for termination, effective date, and in the case of partial termination, the portion to be terminated. If the U.S. Forest Service decides that the remaining portion of the agreement does not accomplish the purpose for which the award/agreement was made, the U.S. Forest Service may terminate the award upon 30 days written notice in its entirety.
- X. <u>ALTERNATE DISPUTE RESOLUTION PARTNERSHIP AGREEMENT</u>. In the event of any issue of controversy under this agreement, the parties may pursue Alternate Dispute Resolution procedures to voluntarily resolve those issues. These procedures may include, but are not limited to conciliation, facilitation, mediation, and fact finding.
- Y. <u>DEBARMENT AND SUSPENSION</u>. Lincoln County Wyoming shall immediately inform the U.S. Forest Service if they or any of their principals are presently excluded, debarred, or suspended from entering into covered transactions with the Federal Government according to the terms of 2 CFR Part 180. Additionally, should the Cooperators or any of their principals receive a transmittal letter or other official Federal notice of debarment or suspension, then they shall notify the U.S. Forest Service without undue delay. This applies whether the exclusion, debarment, or suspension is voluntary or involuntary.
- Z. <u>COPYRIGHTING</u>. Lincoln County Wyoming is/are granted sole and exclusive right to copyright any publications developed as a result of this agreement. This includes the right to publish and vend throughout the world in any language and in all media and forms, in whole or in part, for the full term of copyright and all renewals thereof in accordance with this agreement.

No original text or graphics produced and submitted by the U.S. Forest Service must be copyrighted. The U.S. Forest Service reserves a royalty-free, nonexclusive, and irrevocable right to reproduce, publish, or otherwise use, and to authorize others to use the work for Federal Government purposes. This right must be transferred to any sub-agreements or subcontracts.

### This provision includes:

- 1. The copyright in any work developed by the Cooperators under this agreement.
- 2. Any right of copyright to which the Cooperators purchase(s) ownership with any Federal contributions.



- AA. <u>MODIFICATIONS</u>. Modifications within the scope of this agreement must be made by mutual consent of the parties, by the issuance of a written modification signed and dated by all properly authorized, signatory officials, prior to any changes being performed. Requests for modification should be made, in writing, at least 30 days prior to implementation of the requested change.
- BB. <u>COMMENCEMENT/EXPIRATION DATE</u>. This agreement is executed as of the date of the last signature and is effective through May 20, 2030 at which time it will expire. The expiration date is the final date for completion of all work activities under this agreement.
- CC. <u>AUTHORIZED REPRESENTATIVES</u>. By signature below, each party certifies that the individuals listed in this document as representatives of the individual parties are authorized to act in their respective areas for matters related to this agreement. ## **Operating Plan 2025**

This Operating Plan is hereby made and entered into by and between the Board of Commissioners, Lincoln County, Wyoming hereinafter referred to as "the County", the Town Council Alpine, Wyoming hereinafter referred to as "the Town" and the United States Department of Agriculture, Forest Service, Caribou-Targhee National Forest hereinafter referred to as the "U.S. Forest Service", as specified under the provisions of Challenge Cost Share (CCS) Agreement #25-CS-11041500-023.

### I. THE COUNTY SHALL:

- Perform routine checks on the County Search and Rescue Boat Building to ensure it is in proper functioning order. Perform any and all required maintenance on the County Search and Rescue building.
- Conduct weekly patrols at the boat ramp site. Patrols shall include a visit to
  the site to get an overall view of activities and to enforce applicable County
  laws and boater safety. Weekly patrols shall be conducted between Memorial
  Day and Labor Day.

### II. THE TOWN SHALL:

- Move the dock as the water level fluctuates during the boating season typically Labor Day to Memorial Day, or while the ramp is functional with water levels. The dock shall never extend into the current of the river; it shall always set in the stagnant water.
- 2. Remove the dock from the water by pulling it to the highest point of the ramp in the late fall, before the snow falls. The dock shall remain stored at this location during the winter.
- Remove silt from the ramp on an as-needed basis to provide a safe clear ramp necessary for vehicles to use without getting stuck in silt.
   Temporarily closing ramp of public use during silt removal for safety is allowed.

- 4. Identify, and report as needed, any hazardous conditions of operations at the site.
- 5. Provide a garbage dumpster and garbage collection services either weekly or every two weeks from Labor Day to Memorial Day.

### III. THE FOREST SERVICE SHALL:

- 1. Be responsible for pumping, cleaning and furnishing toilet paper in the vault toilet on a weekly basis, from Memorial Day to Labor Day.
- 2. Patrol the boating ramp area weekly to enforce applicable Federal laws and boater safety. Weekly patrols shall be conducted between Memorial Day and Labor Day.
- 3. Maintain the informational on-site kiosk including, painting and attaching informational signs to the bulletin boards.
- 4. Maintain the parking area at the dock site.
