EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

In 2008, the City of Angleton permitted with the Federal Railroad Administration (FRA) and Union Pacific Railroad (UPRR) to establish a City wide Quiet Zone that included six road crossings. These crossing included State Highway 288B (South Velasco), South Anderson Street, East Orange Street, South Downing Street, East Cedar Street, and CR 428 (Buchta Road). Since its establishment, City staff has continued routine maintenance on the safety measures per the approved permit to keep the quiet zone in compliance with its safety measures including remaking pavement stripping, replacing traffic signs, replacing channelization devices, etc. The safety measures existing today are the same safety measurements that existed when the quiet zone was established.

On October 12, 2021, FRA representative, Mr. Ryan Jones, performed a detailed field audit of the six crossings and completed comprehensive review of the documents that establishment the quiet zone in 2008. On October 15, 2021, Mr. Jones contacted HDR about some of the issues found in the field (missing channelization devices) and requested documentation on the establishment of the Quiet Zone in 2008. It appears that the Notice of Intent (NOI) and the Notice of Establishment (NOE) referenced different sections of FRA criteria and needed clarification. HDR responded back with the available information the City had in regards to the documentation for the NOI and NOE and City staff address damaged channelization devices immediately. Documentation of the repairs performed to the identified areas of the quiet zone were provided. This allowed the City to maintain it quiet zone permit for the time being.


FRA and UPRR requested a meeting to go to the site and discuss the deficiencies that were noted in his October 12, 2021 inspection and identify action items required to address them. These meeting were rescheduled several times and where finally held on January 12, 2021. HDR meet with the FRA and UPRR representative and discussed newly identified deficiencies that must be addresses as soon as possible to stay in compliance to the quiet zone permit. After the meeting HDR created 6 exhibits that identify the issues that were discussed (See attachments). Copies of these were sent to the FRA and UPRR representative and they had no additional comment to these improvements.

City staff has ordered the requested signage, which should be delivered by January 28, 2022. City staff should have them installed by February 4, 2021. The City is also coordinating with TxDOT and UPRR on permitting for working in the right of way and Brazoria County for required work on Buchta Road. Updates to Council will follow on these efforts.

On January 18, 2022, a meeting was held with FRA and UPRR representative to discuss what has been done, schedule, and the City's path forward. At this meeting the FRA representative requested the City to perform new traffic counts at crossings, inventory of all measures at crossing sites, and resubmit an Affirmation Letter to the FRA on all crossings. HDR is working on getting these costs and will provide them to Council.

Furthermore, the City is evaluating the possibility of modifying its safety measures from mountable curbs with channelization devices to 10" concrete curbs and resubmitting the NOE to document these changes.


RECOMMENDATION: Continuing coordination with all entities and updating council on progress.






Remove all "white" No Train Horn Signs. They are not allowed.
