Ms. Hernandez also stated that proposed is commercial billing will be handled by Waste Connections.

Matt Lowe with Waste Connections addressed Council to provide details of the contract renewal.

Council requested that surveys and education be provided to the citizens to solicit feedback from the residents.

Discussion and possible action to adopt Resolution No. 20260609-005 of the Angleton City Council, approving the finding of a public necessity by Angleton Drainage District and approving the use of eminent domain by Angleton Drainage District to condemn in fee simple a tract of 0.169 acres, more or less, of property generally located at the northwest corner of Valderas Street and Brushy Bayou in Angleton, Texas for the public purposes of drainage, flood control, and related purposes. (Item was tabled on August 11, 2026)

Discussion and possible action on approving Ordinance No. 20260908-014 adopting the 2026-2027 Fiscal Year Budget of the City of Angleton, Texas for the Fiscal year beginning on October 01, 2026, and ending on September 30, 2027; providing a severability clause; providing for repeal and penalty; and providing an effective date. THIS BUDGET WILL RAISE MORE TOTAL PROPERTY TAXES THAN LAST YEAR'S BUDGET BY \$220,153 OR 2.19%, THAT AMOUNT IS TAX REVENUE TO BE RAISED FROM NEW PROPERTY ADDED TO THE TAX ROLL THIS YEAR.

The motion passed on a 5-0 vote. Council Member Simmons was absent.

16. Discussion and possible action on approving Ordinance No. 20260908-016 amending the Utility Rate Tables in Chapter 2 Administration Article X Section 2-266 Fee Schedule of the Angleton, Texas Code of Ordinances; providing for a discount in the rates to be charged for utility services by the City of Angleton; the discount will be \$5 for the water base rate and \$5 for the sewer base rate, to be applied to Senior Citizens over the age of 65, Disabled, and Veterans with the accounts in their name; providing for repeal, providing for severability; providing for a penalty; and providing an effective date.

Susie Hernandez, Director of Finance presented the agenda item.

Upon a motion by Mayor Pro-Tem Townsend and seconded by Council Member Daniel, Council approved Ordinance No. 20260908-016 amending the Utility Rate Tables in Chapter 2 Administration Article X Section 2-266 Fee Schedule of the Angleton, Texas Code of Ordinances; providing for a discount in the rates to be charged for utility services by the City of Angleton; the discount will be \$5 for the water base rate and \$5 for the sewer base rate, to be applied to Senior Citizens over the age of 65, Disabled, and Veterans with the accounts in their name; providing for repeal, providing for severability; providing for a penalty; and providing an effective date. The motion passed on a 5-0 vote. Council Member Simmons was absent.

18. Discussion and possible action on approving Ordinance No. 20260908-018 establishing a voluntary infrastructure improvement contribution program for streets, sidewalks, and drainage; providing for voluntary contributions through City utility billing; establishing restricted uses of contributions for administration; providing for severability; and providing an effective date.

Upon a motion by Mayor Pro-Tem Townsend and seconded by Council Member Sartin, Council approved a three percent pay increase for the Municipal Judge and Associate Judge to be effective at the beginning of Fiscal year 2026-2027. The motion passed on a 5-0 vote. Council Member Simmons was absent.
