THE CITY COUNCIL OF ANGLETON, TEXAS CONVENED IN A SPECIAL MEETING ON TUESDAY, JANUARY 12, 2021 AT 5:30 P.M., IN THE ANGLETON CITY HALL COUNCIL CHAMBERS, 120 S. CHENANGO, ANGLETON, TEXAS.

DECLARATION OF A QUORUM AND CALL TO ORDER

With a quorum present, Mayor pro-tem Wright called the Council Meeting to order at 5:36 P.M., Mayor Perez, Mayor pro-tem Wright, Council Member Booth, Council Member Gongora, Council Member Svoboda, and Council Member Townsend were present.

With a quorum present, Vice Chairman John Wright called the ABLC Meeting to order at 5:36 P.M., Members John Wright, Ellen Eby, William Jackson, Chris Peltier, and Charlyn Rodgers were present. Chairman Jason Perez and Member George Rau were absent.

With a quorum present, Chairman Chris Peltier called the Parks & Recreation Board Meeting to order at 5:36 P.M., Chairman Chris Peltier and Members Bill Ahlstrom, Clara Dannhaus, Bonnie McDaniel, Jamie Moreno, Steven Sebok, and Terry Roberts were present. Council Liaison Mark Gongora was also present.

REGULAR AGENDA

1. Discussion and possible action regarding Lakeside Park amenity funding prioritization.

Upon a motion by Council Member Booth and seconded by Council Member Townsend, Council approved the recommendations and prioritizations as follows:

Breakdown of Parks & Recreation recommendations:

Parks Staff can remove existing fencing and gravel paving

Eliminate the secondary pavilion including associated electrical

Eliminate Fitness Stations – other impacts include 4' wide sidewalk, one ADA ramp and wood fiber

Eliminate the Boardwalk - other impacts include 6' wide sidewalk

Eliminate costs of shade and ornamental trees (15 g donated trees will be provided by Trees for

Houston) – other impacts include permanent irrigation

Expand primary loop trail to 10' wide which is consistent with Freedom Park trail and new proposed parkland dedication requirements

Parks & Recreation Prioritized Additions Pending Funding: These can be priced out as bid alternates/additions.

Boardwalk - \$153,000 (includes boardwalk and additional sidewalks to the area)

Secondary Pavilion & Electrical - \$50,000

Sandy Beach - \$49,250 (includes sand, stone edge and grading)

Musical Instruments - \$15,000

North Parking - \$180,314 (includes various items listed under bid alternates)

Fitness equipment - \$23,212.50 (includes sidewalks, wood fiber, ADA ramp and fitness equipment)

Overlook - \$52,475 (includes various items listed under bid alternates)

The motion passed on a 6-0 vote.

ADJOURNMENT

The meeting was adjourned at 6:12 P.M.
