## B. Project Understanding and Approach

## Introduction

CSG Consultants (CSG) is pleased to submit this proposal to the City of Angels to prepare an Initial Study/Negative Declaration and provide environmental review services in accordance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) for the proposed Draft Greenhouse Reduction Plan Project. Our team will work closely with City staff, from contract execution and project inception, through to public hearings and completion of the CEQA review process. The documentation and processing will be in accordance with CEQA, Public Resources Code 21000-21177, the State CEQA Guidelines (California Code Regulations, Title 14, Division 6, Chapter 3, Section 15000-15387), the City of Angels regulations, and requirements and procedures of any other responsible Public Agency with jurisdiction by law.

## **Project Understanding**

CSG understands that the proposed project consists of the Draft Greenhouse Gas Reduction Plan (GHGRP). The intention of the environmental review for this project is to determine the GHGRP is adequate for CEQA tiering as a 'qualified plan'. A qualified plan allows a lead agency to analyze and mitigate potential environmental impacts related to greenhouse gas emissions at a programmatic level. Future projects can tier from the plan analysis, which allows for streamlined CEQA review of greenhouse gas emissions impacts for future public and private projects.

## **Approach**

With authorization to proceed, we view the project kick-off meeting as a key component for setting up a successful project review. This meeting will serve as an opportunity to discuss expectations, responsibilities, and communications procedures. The initiation of the Initial Study process will involve a review of issues, constraints, project goals/objectives, as well as the overall schedule. Based on available project information, CSG will draft the Project Description for review.

The Initial Study will be prepared in accordance with Sections 15060 to 15065 of the CEQA Guidelines and Appendix G of the Guidelines, which address the topical areas of study. The Initial Study will include an Executive Summary, Introduction, and Project Description. The environmental analysis section will identify the existing conditions baseline for each topic, short-term and long-term potential environmental impacts, and conclude the level of significance for those impacts.

Once the Administrative Draft Initial Study is completed, CSG will schedule a call/meeting to review the findings of the Initial Study and to confirm the Negative Declaration CEQA clearance for the project. The Public Review Draft Initial Study/Negative Declaration will be circulated for a 30-day review period and will be followed by the Final Initial Study/Negative Declaration documentation. CSG will attend the public hearings to present the findings to the City's decision makers to consider and take action on the CEQA determination.

## 1.0 Kick-Off and Project Description

### 1.1 Kick-Off Meeting

The work program will be initiated with a kick-off meeting with City representatives and stakeholders to discuss the scope of the environmental review in greater detail. This initial meeting will be used to confirm the parameters of the analysis, information needs, scheduling, and overall communications. Prior to the kick-off, CSG will distribute an agenda and information needs memorandum. Upon completion of the kick-off meeting, CSG will prepare meeting minutes that detail action items for the CSG team, City staff, and stakeholders. With the receipt of detailed project information and feedback from the kick-off meeting, CSG will draft the preliminary Project Description (Task 1.3) and provide any updates to the master schedule for review and approval by City staff.



#### 1.2 **Data Collection**

Following the kick-off meeting, CSG will prepare and submit a data request to obtain any further information needs. CSG will also obtain and review existing documents available from the City, including City Ordinances, the 2020 General Plan, the Zoning Code, the 2021 Greenhouse Gas Inventory, the Draft GHGRP, and other relevant documents required for the environmental analysis.

#### 1.3 **Project Description**

The Project Description will detail the proposed project characteristics and agreements/approvals that are required, based on available information. This section will include a summary of the local environmental setting, existing General Plan, GHGRP, and Zoning. CSG will submit the draft Project Description to the City for review and approval. It is assumed the City will provide one set of consolidated, vetted comments to the CSG team. CSG will revise the Project Description to address comments provided and once finalized, the Project Description will be distributed and used by the CSG team. CSG assumes that once finalized, no significant modifications will occur to the Project Description.

#### 2.0 **Initial Study/Negative Declaration**

#### 2.1 Administrative Draft IS/ND

CSG will prepare an IS/ND in accordance with the CEQA Guidelines. The IS/ND will include detailed explanations of all checklist determinations and discussions of potential environmental impacts. The analysis shall be prepared in accordance with Public Resources Code Section 21080(c) and CEQA Guidelines Section 15060 to 15065 and Appendix G of the Guidelines. Each Environmental Topical Area of Study will consider applicable regulatory requirements and guidelines as appropriate, including the General Plan, General Plan EIR, the Municipal Code, and all applicable State and federal laws. The IS/ND will include an Introduction, the Project Description, and review for the following topical areas of Appendix G:

#### 2.2 Preliminary Draft IS/ND

This scope of work assumes that the City will provide one set of consolidated, vetted comments (with tracked changes in the Word file) on the Administrative Draft IS/ND. CSG will revise the document and provide the Preliminary Draft IS/ND as a Word file, with all changes presented in track changes to assist with the final check of the document. A PDF of the Preliminary Draft IS/ND will also be provided, including all exhibits.

#### 2.3 Public Review Draft IS/ND

Following the review of the Preliminary Draft IS/ND, CSG will revise the document and prepare the Public Review Draft IS/ND for distribution. This task assumes that all substantive comments will have been raised as part of Task 2.2 above. Should hours spent on this task exceed costs identified within this scope of work, CSG will coordinate with City staff regarding the need for additional funds to incorporate all comments.

CSG will prepare the Public Review Draft IS/ND for a 30-day public review period. This scope of work assumes that CSG will provide the Public Review Draft IS/ND electronically for local distribution. CSG will prepare the Notice of Intent (NOI) and provide an electronic copy to the City. CSG will post the Public Review Draft IS/ND on the State Clearinghouse's online



portal, CEQAnet, and file the NOI, Summary Form, and Notice of Completion (NOC) to formally commence the 30-day review period.

This scope of work assumes the City will prepare and distribute the document to any identified responsible and trustee agencies and any other agencies that may be appropriate. This scope of work assumes the City is responsible for local distribution, including radius mailing, site postings, and newspaper noticing required for the project, including filing the NOI with the County Clerk's office.

#### 2.4 Responses to Comments

Section 21091(d) of the CEQA Guidelines states that a Lead Agency must consider comments received on an IS/ND during the public review period. Although not required, CSG will respond to environmental review comments received during the 30-day public review period for the IS/ND. CSG will prepare thorough, reasoned, and sensitive responses to relevant environmental issues. The draft responses to comments will be prepared for review by City staff. CSG will address one complete set of comments and will provide revisions in track changes for ease of review.

The extent of public and agency comments that will result from the public review process is unknown at this time. Should the extent of responses to comments exceed the budget estimate, additional funding may be required. The scope of work does not assume any further supplemental technical studies or extensive analysis will be required for the response to comments. If it is determined that supplemental technical analysis is required, CSG will work with the City to determine the associated scope of work and additional funding required.

#### 2.5 Final IS/ND

The Final IS/ND will consist of the Response to Comments and revisions to the IS/ND text, as determined necessary. To facilitate the review, CSG will format the Final IS/ND with underline text for any new or modified text, and "strike out" any deleted text. A "check copy" Final IS/ND will be provided for review and confirmation that the Final IS/ND is complete.

CSG will prepare the Notice of Determination (NOD) and file it with the SCH. This scope of work assumes City staff will prepare public notices for newspaper publishing and mailing as required and the City will file the NOD with the County Clerk's office within 5 days following final action. This scope of work assumes the City will be responsible for paying the County Clerk Processing fee.

## 3.0 Project Management and Meetings

#### 3.1 Project Management

The CSG Project Manager, Mr. Glenn Lajoie, AICP will be responsible for the management and supervision of the Project Team. Mr. Lajoie will direct the preparation of the CEQA document, ensuring compliance with CEQA requirements, guidelines, and the City's CEQA procedures. Documentation will be prepared in a City-approved format and will undergo internal review to ensure that it is of high quality, per industry standards, and is legally defensible. Mr. Lajoie will coordinate with the City and/or other stakeholder representatives as well as internal support staff and word processing team members to achieve the timely completion of the CEQA document. Throughout the work program, the CSG team will serve as an extension of City staff and as a resource on CEQA and environmental review matters.

Monthly invoices will include the beginning and ending dates of the billing period, serial identification of progress bills, total contract amount, all costs (by task) incurred to date (actual and percentage), estimated completion percentage for each task, and financial information for each task for that billing period.

### 3.2 Project Meetings

Close coordination with staff is essential. CSG will participate in progress/project conference calls and/or meetings. CSG will confirm assumptions before finalizing the agreement for consultant services.

Road Bridge and construction of a new bridge over Mosher Creek. The replacement bridge structure would be 55 feet and 4 inches long and 29 feet and 6 inches wide, including 10-foot lanes and three-foot shoulders in each direction. The number of spans associated with the bridge would be reduced from the current three-span configuration to a single span. The proposed structure would be supported by abutments at each bank of the creek founded on Cast in Steel Shell (CISS) or Cast in Drilled Hole (CIDH) piles. Wing walls would be constructed adjacent to the abutments and rock slope protection would be placed along the exterior of each wing wall.
