Item Details

On April 14, 2026, the Apex Town Council unanimously adopted Resolution No. RES-2026-039 establishing the Peak Resilience and Wellbeing Task Force as a non-standing, community-based body focused on behavioral health awareness, prevention, early intervention, reducing stigma, and improving access to information, resources, and services for Apex residents. The Task Force was established to remain active through June 30, 2028, unless extended or subsequently formalized as a standing advisory body.

As originally adopted, the resolution provides for eighteen (18) official members, supplemented by additional community volunteers, representing a range of professional expertise, lived experiences, and community perspectives. The Task Force is charged with supporting educational and outreach efforts, developing culturally responsive materials, strengthening partnerships with schools, healthcare providers, community organizations, and other stakeholders, identifying gaps and barriers to behavioral health services, promoting youth and family engagement, and providing periodic reports and recommendations to the Town Council.

Since adoption of the resolution, interest in and participation with the Task Force has demonstrated an opportunity to broaden its formal membership and further expand community representation. The proposed amendment would increase the number of official Task Force members from eighteen (18) to thirty (30). This expanded membership is intended to provide additional capacity for participation and

allow the Task Force to incorporate a wider range of perspectives, experiences, and areas of expertise as it carries out its work.

No other changes to the Task Force's structure, purpose, responsibilities, governance provisions, reporting requirements, or term are proposed. The Task Force would continue operating under the framework established by Resolution No. RES-2026-039, with the membership increase representing the sole substantive amendment presented for Town Council consideration.
