Item Details

Since 1991, Wake County Government has maintained a comprehensive All-Hazards Emergency Operations Plan. The purpose of this Plan is to establish a comprehensive framework of policy and guidance for county and local disaster operations establishing structures, responsibilities, and authorities relating to disaster and emergency events.

The Plan complies with Homeland Security Presidential Directive 5 which states that all governmental agencies shall be compliant with the National Incident Management System (NIMS) which furnishes the foundation for organization design, materials, education, and training for Federal, State, and local governments to work effectively and efficiently together to prepare for, respond to, and recover from domestic incidents. The Town of Apex Emergency Operations Plan aligns with and supports the Wake County Emergency Operations Plan

On February 3, 2015, the Apex Town Council adopted by Resolution the Wake County Emergency Operations Plan. Since that time, minor modifications have been made to the plan.
