WHEREAS, the emergency medical services system consists of first responders, emergency medical technicians, paramedics, firefighters, police officers, dispatchers, educators, administrators, prehospital nurses, emergency nurses, emergency physicians, trained members of the public and other out-of-hospital medical care providers; and

WHEREAS, the members of emergency medical services teams, whether career or volunteer, engage in thousands of hours of specialized training and continuing education to enhance their life-saving skills; and

WHEREAS, it is appropriate to recognize the value and accomplishments of emergency medical services providers by designating National EMS Week, which was first formalized on November 4, 1974, by President Gerald Ford. **This year marks the 50**th **Anniversary of EMS Week**.
