Ms. Spann stated that he served on the Planning Commission from 1994-2021 and in honor of him she would like Councilman Gerald Greer to play happy birthday for him on his violin.

Lori Hilliard - Ms. Hilliard stated that she was a member of the board of directors for the Braxton Lee Homestead and their mission remains the same, which is to restore and save the the home. She stated that Mr. Barry Mayo had announced that he would donate the home to the county and it has now been widely announced that is not coming to fruition and that she hoped to work with the new developers.

NEW BUSINESS

2. Berm Progress Discussion

Mayor Allen stated that we thought everything was going well with the berm but this week TDOT placed a stop work order. He stated that A.O. Smith is having them remove three (3) inches of dirt from a fifty (50) foot section so there has been a setback. Mr. Biggers stated that they have a meeting tomorrow and may still be on schedule.

3. BAM Discussion

Mayor Allen stated that they met with the new developers today and they have plans to get started soon. He stated that they will do all the infrastructure work and ten (10) homes at a time. Mayor Allen stated that the homes they plan to build will not be the tall and skinnies going up. Mr. Nicholson stated that there will be 208 homes total and they will range from 1800sq ft to 2000sq ft and will be single family dwellings.

At this time, Mayor Allen read his letter of resignation aloud and stated that it was effective immediately following the adjournment of this meeting.
