**Scope:** The Services to be provided by Consultant are based on the 2024 South Forestview Area Improvements final construction Contract Documents prepared by SEH and approved by Client on January 16, 2024.

#### CONSTRUCTION ADMINISTRATION \$155,000.00

Provide construction administration services associated with construction of the proposed improvements and coordination with the Contract Documents. Specific tasks included are:

- Coordinate execution of the Contract Documents
- Coordinate and attend a pre-construction conference
- Coordinate, attend, and facilitate neighborhood informational meeting with Contractor and SEH team in attendance after pre-construction conference - up to one (1) meeting.
- Prepare project website updates
- Review Contractor material submittals and shop drawings for compliance with the plans and specifications
- Coordinate and conduct weekly construction meetings. Up to 30 meetings.
- Project status reports (monthly during active construction).
- SWPPP monitoring
- Preparation of Contractor payment requests. Up to eight (8) payment requests.
- Review and preparation of change orders and work directives
- Serve as the liaison between City, Contractor and the Public
- Review project status, pay estimates and change orders with Utilities Commission and City Council
- Deliverables: Agendas and meeting minutes/notes, copies of pertinent project correspondence.

#### CONSTRUCTION STAKING \$115,000.00

Provide construction staking and field survey services associated with the proposed trail construction. Specific tasks included with this proposal are:

- Generate staking files for the design elements shown in the plans
- Provide construction staking (staked once) for: clearing & grubbing, removals, sanitary sewer, water, culverts, roadway centerline offsets, subgrade and aggregate/reclaim base bluetops, erosion control, construction limits, intersection street lighting, signing, pavement markings.
- Document staked point locations and elevations

Provide Contractor with construction staking information.

#### CONSTRUCTION OBSERVATION \$370,000.00

- Deliverables: Copies of pertinent project documentation.

#### CONSTRUCTION MATERIALS TESTING SERVICES \$80.000.00

We will subcontract with a geotechnical firm to conduct the necessary grading & base, concrete, and bituminous construction materials sampling and testing for the project. The assumed scope is based on the 2023 SALT MnDOT Schedule of Materials Control and the current project scope assumptions.

#### POST-CONSTRUCTION SERVICES \$40,000.00

We will complete post–construction services in accordance with City requirements. Specific tasks included with this proposal are:

- Complete record drawing survey of new or altered sanitary sewer, water and storm water pipes & services, structures and appurtenances. Record drawing survey for signs will be completed using City equipment.
- Re-establish removed or disturbed property boundary markers
- Preparation of property boundary certificate of survey
- Preparation of "Record Drawing" document
- Project closeout
- Deliverables: Electronic PDF of record drawing documents, record drawing survey point file, property boundary certificate of survey (for re-establishment of initially found property pins).

#### REIMBURSABLE EXPENSES \$40,000.00

Reimbursable expenses include vehicle mileage, vehicle and equipment charges, printing, reproductions, and postage.

#### **ASSUMPTIONS & EXCLUSIONS**

The following assumptions and exclusions were taken into consideration when preparing this contract:

- Construction Materials Testing (CMT) will be provided by Braun Intertec as a subconsultant to SEH.
   Testing services needed are based on the final construction Contract Documents construction scope, and any services needed beyond the estimated \$80,000 CMT fee would be considered Additional Services.
- Construction phase services fees are based on up 30 weeks of construction in 2024. Construction services beyond 30 weeks would be considered Additional Services.
  - Construction observation (Resident Project Representative) services beyond 2,600 hours would be considered Additional Services.
- Construction will occur in 2024 (up to 30 weeks) and 2025 (up to 2 weeks).

#### **Resident Project Representative Services**

RPR services will be provided in accordance with attached Exhibit B.

**Additional Services and Exclusions:** Services from SEH not listed above, if required or requested, can be provided to the City at our normal hourly rates.

**Schedule:** Construction substantial completion is planned for November 1, 2024. Construction final completion is planned for June 13, 2025.

Payment: The fee is hourly not to exceed \$800,000.00 including expenses and equipment.

The payment method, basis, frequency and other special conditions are set forth in the Master Agreement Exhibit A-1.

**Other Terms and Conditions**: Other or additional terms contrary to the Master Agreement for Professional Services that apply solely to this project as specifically agreed to by signature of the Parties and set forth herein: None.

This Master Agreement for Professional Services, General Conditions, Exhibits, and Attachments to Exhibits (collectively referred to as the "Agreement") represent the entire understanding between Client and Consultant and supersedes all prior contemporaneous oral or written agreements with respect to the services to be provided by Consultant hereunder. In the event of a conflict between the documents, this document and the attached General Conditions shall take precedence over all Exhibits unless alternate terms have been specifically agreed to on the SLA under "Other Terms and Conditions". The SLA shall take precedence over Exhibits. This Agreement may not be amended except by written agreement signed by the authorized representatives of each party.

**Other Terms and Conditions:** Other or additional terms contrary to the Master Agreement for Professional Services as specifically agreed to by signature of the Parties and set forth herein:

In Section IV, Paragraph C, Item No. 1 of the General Conditions of the Agreement for Professional Services, the Consultant's total liability limit shall be changed from \$500,000 to \$1,000,000.

# Payments to Consultant for Services and Expenses Using the Hourly Basis Option

The Agreement for Professional Services is amended and supplemented to include the following agreement of the parties:

#### A. Hourly Basis Option

The Client and Consultant select the hourly basis for payment for services provided by Consultant. Consultant shall be compensated monthly. Monthly charges for services shall be based on Consultant's current billing rates for applicable employees plus charges for expenses and equipment.

Consultant will provide an estimate of the costs for services in this Agreement. It is agreed that after 90% of the estimated compensation has been earned and if it appears that completion of the services cannot be accomplished within the remaining 10% of the estimated compensation, Consultant will notify the Client and confer with representatives of the Client to determine the basis for completing the work.

Compensation to Consultant based on the rates is conditioned on completion of the work within the effective period of the rates. Should the time required to complete the work be extended beyond this period, the rates shall be appropriately adjusted.

#### B. Expenses

The following items involve expenditures made by Consultant employees or professional consultants on behalf of the Client. Their costs are not included in the hourly charges made for services and shall be paid for as described in this Agreement but instead are reimbursable expenses required in addition to hourly charges for services:

- Transportation and travel expenses.
- Long distance services, dedicated data and communication services, teleconferences, Project Web sites, and extranets.
- 3. Lodging and meal expense connected with the Project.
- 4. Fees paid, in the name of the Client, for securing approval of authorities having jurisdiction over the Project.
- 5. Plots, Reports, plan and specification reproduction expenses.
- Postage, handling and delivery.
- 7. Expense of overtime work requiring higher than regular rates, if authorized in advance by the Client.
- 8. Renderings, models, mock-ups, professional photography, and presentation materials requested by the Client.
- 9. All taxes levied on professional services and on reimbursable expenses.
- 10. Other special expenses required in connection with the Project.
- 11. The cost of special consultants or technical services as required. The cost of subconsultant services shall include actual expenditure plus 10% markup for the cost of administration and insurance.

The Client shall pay Consultant monthly for expenses.

#### C. Equipment Utilization

The utilization of specialized equipment, including automation equipment, is recognized as benefiting the Client. The Client, therefore, agrees to pay the cost for the use of such specialized equipment on the project. Consultant invoices to the Client will contain detailed information regarding the use of specialized equipment on the project and charges will be based on the standard rates for the equipment published by Consultant.

The Client shall pay Consultant monthly for equipment utilization.

# Payments to Consultant for Services Using the Lump Sum Plus Expenses Option

The Agreement for Professional Services is amended and supplemented to include the following agreement of the parties:

During the course of providing its services, Consultant shall be paid monthly based on Consultant's estimate of the percentage of the work completed. # A Listing of the Duties, Responsibilities and Limitations of Authority of the Resident Project Representative

Through more extensive on site observations of the construction work in progress and field checks of materials and equipment by the Resident Project Representative (RPR), Consultant shall endeavor to provide further protection for Client against defects and deficiencies in the work of Contractor (Work); but, the furnishing of such services will not make Consultant responsible for or give Consultant control over construction means, methods, techniques, sequences or procedures or for safety precautions or programs, or responsibility for Contractor's failure to perform the Work in accordance with the Contract Documents. Contract Documents are the documents that govern or are pertinent to Contractor's Work including but not limited to the agreement between Client and Contractor, the Contractor's bid, the bonds, specs, Drawings\*, Field Orders\*, Addenda\*, clarifications, interpretations, approved Shop Drawings\* and reports collectively called the Contract Documents. The duties and responsibilities of the RPR are further defined as follows:

#### A. General

RPR is an agent of Consultant at the site, will act as directed by and under the supervision of Consultant, and will confer with Consultant regarding RPR's actions, RPR's dealings in matters pertaining to the on site work shall in general be with Consultant and Contractor keeping the Client advised as necessary, RPR's dealings with subcontractors shall only be through or with the full knowledge and approval of Contractor. RPR shall generally communicate with Client with the knowledge of and under the direction of Consultant.

#### B. Duties and Responsibilities of RPR

- Schedules: Review the progress schedule, schedule of Shop Drawing submittals and schedule of values prepared by Contractor and consult with Consultant concerning acceptability.
- Conferences and Meetings: Attend meetings with Contractor, such as preconstruction conferences, progress meetings, job conferences and other project-related meetings, and prepare and circulate copies of minutes thereof.

#### Liaison:

- (a) Serve as Consultant's liaison with Contractor, working principally through Contractor's superintendent and assist in understanding the intent of the Contract Documents; and assist Consultant in serving as Client's liaison with Contractor when Contractor's operations affect Client's on-site operations.
- (b) Assist in obtaining from Client additional information, when required for proper execution of the Work.
- Shop Drawings and Samples\*:
  - (a) Record date of receipt of Shop Drawings and Samples.
  - (b) Receive Samples furnished at the site by Contractor, and notify Consultant of availability of Samples.
  - (c) Advise Consultant and Contractor of the commencement of any Work requiring a Shop Drawing or sample if the submittal has not been approved by Consultant.
- Review of Work, Observations and Tests:
  - (a) Conduct on-site observations of the Work in progress to assist Consultant in determining if the Work is in general proceeding in accordance with the Contract Documents.
  - (b) Report to Consultant whenever RPR believes that any Work is unsatisfactory, faulty or defective or does not conform to the Contract Documents, or has been damaged, or does not meet the requirements of any inspection, test or approval required to be made; and advise Consultant of

- Work that RPR believes should be corrected or rejected or should be uncovered for observation, or requires special testing, inspection or approval.
- (c) Determine if tests, equipment and systems start-ups and operating and maintenance training are conducted in the presence of appropriate personnel, and that Contractor maintains adequate records thereof; and observe, record and report to Consultant appropriate details relative to the test procedures and start-ups.
- (d) Accompany visiting inspectors representing public or other agencies having jurisdiction over the Project, record the results of these inspections and report to Consultant.
- Interpretation of Contract Documents: Report to Consultant when clarification and interpretations of the Contract Documents are requested by Contractor and transmit to Contractor clarifications and interpretations as issued by Consultant.
- Modifications: Consider and evaluate Contractor's suggestions for modifications in Drawings or Specifications\* and report with RPR's recommendations to Consultant. Transmit to Contractor decisions as issued by Consultant.

#### 8. Records:

- (a) Maintain at the job site orderly files for correspondence, reports of job conferences, shop drawings and samples, reproductions of original Contract Documents including all Work Change Directive\*, Addenda, Change Orders\*, Field Orders, additional Drawings\* issued subsequent to the execution of the Contract, Consultant's clarifications and interpretations of the Contract Documents, progress reports, and other related documents.
- (b) Keep a diary or log book, recording Contractor hours on the job site, weather conditions, data relative to questions of Work Change Directive Change Orders or changed conditions, list of job site visitors, daily activities, decisions, observations in general, and specific observations in more detail as in the case of observing test procedures; and send copies to Consultant.
- (c) Record names, addresses and telephone numbers of all Contractors, subcontractors and major suppliers of materials and equipment.

#### 9. Reports:

- (a) Furnish Consultant periodic reports as required of progress of the Work and of Contractor's compliance with the progress schedule and schedule of Shop Drawing and sample submittals.
- (b) Consult with Consultant in advance of scheduled major tests, inspections or start of important phases of the Work.
- (c) Draft proposed Change Orders and Work Change Directive, obtaining backup material from Contractor and recommend to Consultant Change Orders, Work Change Directive, and Field Orders.
- (d) Report immediately to Consultant and Client upon the occurrence of any accident.
- 10. Payment Requests: Review applications for payment with Contractor for compliance with the established procedure for their submission and forward with recommendations to Consultant, noting particularly the relationship of the payment requested to the schedule of values, Work completed and materials and equipment delivered at the site but not incorporated in the Work.
- 11. Certificates, Maintenance and Operation Manuals: During the course of the Work, verify that certificates, maintenance and operation manuals and other data required to be assembled and furnished by Contractor are applicable to the items actually installed and in accordance with the Contract Documents, and have this material delivered to Consultant for review and forwarding to Client prior to final payment for the Work.

#### 12. Completion:

- (a) Before Consultant issues a Certificate of Substantial Completion, submit to Contractor a list of observed items requiring completion or correction.
- (b) Conduct final inspection in the company of Consultant, Client, and Contractor and prepare a final list of items to be completed or corrected.
- (c) Observe that all items on final list have been completed or corrected and make recommendations to Consultant concerning acceptance.

#### C. Limitations of Authority

Resident Project Representative:

- Shall not authorize any deviation from the Contract Documents or substitution of materials or equipment, unless authorized by Client.
- 2. Shall not exceed limitations of Consultant's authority as set forth in the Agreement for Professional Services.
- Shall not undertake any of the responsibilities of Contractor, subcontractors or Contractor's superintendent.
- 4. Shall not advise on, issue directions regarding or assume control over safety precautions and programs in connection with the Work.
- Shall not accept Shop Drawing or sample submittals from anyone other than Contractor.
- 6. Shall not authorize Client to occupy the Project in whole or in part.
- Shall not participate in specialized field or laboratory tests or inspections conducted by others except as specifically authorized by Consultant.

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# General Conditions of the Agreement for Professional Services

#### SECTION I - SERVICES OF CONSULTANT

#### A. General

1. Consultant agrees to perform professional services as set forth in the Agreement for Professional Services or Supplemental Letter Agreement ("Basic Services"). Nothing contained in this Agreement shall create a contractual relationship with or a cause of action in favor of a third party against either the Client or the Consultant. The Consultant's services under this Agreement are being performed solely for the Client's benefit, and no other party or entity shall have any claim against the Consultant because of this Agreement or the performance or nonperformance of services hereunder.

#### B. Schedule

- Unless specific periods of time or dates for providing services are specified, Consultant's obligation to render services hereunder will be for a period which may reasonably be required for the completion of said services.
- 2. If Client has requested changes in the scope, extent, or character of the Project or the services to be provided by Consultant, the time of performance and compensation for Consultant's services shall be adjusted equitably. The Client agrees that Consultant is not responsible for damages arising directly or indirectly from delays beyond Consultant's control. If the delays resulting from such causes increase the cost or the time required by Consultant to perform its services in accordance with professional skill and care, then Consultant shall be entitled to a equitable adjustment in schedule and compensation.

#### C. Additional Services

- 1. If Consultant determines that any services it has been directed or requested to perform are beyond the scope as set forth in the Agreement or that, due to changed conditions or changes in the method or manner of administration of the Project, Consultant's effort required to perform its services under this Agreement exceeds the stated fee for Basic Services, then Consultant shall promptly notify the Client regarding the need for additional services. Upon notification and in the absence of a written objection, Consultant shall be entitled to additional compensation for the additional services, and to an extension of time for completion of additional services absent written objection by
- Additional services shall be billed in accord with agreed upon rates, or if not addressed, then at Consultant's standard rates.

#### D. Suspension and Termination

- If Consultant's services are delayed or suspended in whole or in part by Client, or if Consultant's services are delayed by actions or inactions of others for more than 60 days through no fault of Consultant, then Consultant shall be entitled to either terminate its agreement upon 7 days written notice or, at its option, accept an equitable adjustment of rates and amounts of compensation provided for elsewhere in this Agreement to reflect reasonable costs incurred by Consultant.
- This Agreement may be terminated by either party upon seven days written notice should the other party fail substantially to perform in accordance with its terms through no fault of the party initiating the termination.
- This Agreement may be terminated by either party upon thirty
  days' written notice without cause. All provisions of this
  Agreement allocating responsibility or liability between the Client
  and Consultant shall survive the completion of the services
  hereunder and/or the termination of this Agreement.
- In the event of termination, Consultant shall be compensated for services performed prior to termination date, including charges for expenses and equipment costs then due and all termination expenses.

#### SECTION II - CLIENT RESPONSIBILITIES

#### A. General

- The Client shall, in proper time and sequence and where appropriate to the Project, at no expense to Consultant, provide full information as to Client's requirements for the services provided by Consultant and access to all public and private lands required for Consultant to perform its services.
- 2. The Consultant is not a municipal advisor and therefore Client shall provide its own legal, accounting, financial and insurance counseling and other special services as may be required for the Project. Client shall provide to Consultant all data (and professional interpretations thereof) prepared by or services performed by others pertinent to Consultant's services, including but not limited to, previous reports; sub-surface explorations; laboratory tests and inspection of samples; environmental assessment and impact statements, surveys, property descriptions; zoning, deed and other land use restrictions; asbuilt drawings, electronic data base and maps. The costs associated with correcting, creating or recreating any data that is provided by the Client that contains inaccurate or unusable information shall be the responsibility of the Client.
- 3. Client shall provide prompt written notice to Consultant whenever the Client observes or otherwise becomes aware of any changes in the Project or any defect in Consultant's services. Client shall promptly examine all studies, reports, sketches, opinions of construction costs, specifications, drawings, proposals, change orders, supplemental agreements and other documents presented by Consultant and render the necessary decisions and instructions so that Consultant may provide services in a timely manner.
- 4. Client shall require all utilities with facilities within the Client's Project site to locate and mark said utilities upon request, relocate and/or protect said utilities as determined necessary to accommodate work of the Project, submit a schedule of the necessary relocation/protection activities to the Client for review and comply with agreed upon schedule. Consultant shall not be liable for damages which arise out of Consultant's reasonable reliance on the information or services furnished by utilities to Client or others hired by Client.
- 5. Consultant shall be entitled to rely on the accuracy and completeness of information or services furnished by the Client or others employed by the Client and shall not be liable for damages arising from reasonable reliance on such materials. Consultant shall promptly notify the Client if Consultant discovers that any information or services furnished by the Client is in error or is inadequate for its purpose.

## SECTION III - PAYMENTS

#### A. Invoices

- 1. Undisputed portions of invoices are due and payable within 30 days. Client must notify Consultant in writing of any disputed items within 15 days from receipt of invoice. Amounts due Consultant will be increased at the rate of 1.0% per month (or the maximum rate of interest permitted by law, if less) for invoices 30 days past due. Consultant reserves the right to retain Instruments of Service until all Invoices are paid in full. Consultant will not be liable for any claims of loss, delay, or damage by Client for reason of withholding services or Instruments of Service until all invoices are paid in full. Consultant shall be entitled to recover all reasonable costs and disbursements, including reasonable attorney's fees, incurred in connection with collecting amounts owed by Client.
- Should taxes, fees or costs be imposed, they shall be in addition to Consultant's agreed upon compensation.
- Notwithstanding anything to the contrary herein, Consultant may pursue collection of past due invoices without the necessity of any mediation proceedings.

#### SECTION IV - GENERAL CONSIDERATIONS

#### A. Standards of Performance

- The standard of care for all professional engineering and related services performed or furnished by Consultant under this Agreement will be the care and skill ordinarily exercised by members of Consultant's profession practicing under similar circumstances at the same time and in the same locality. Consultant makes no warranties, express or implied, under this Agreement or otherwise, in connection with its services.
- 2. Consultant neither guarantees the performance of any Contractor nor assumes responsibility for any Contractor's failure to furnish and perform the work in accordance with its construction contract or the construction documents prepared by Consultant. Client acknowledges Consultant will not direct, supervise or control the work of construction contractors or their subcontractors at the site or otherwise. Consultant shall have no authority over or responsibility for the contractor's acts or omissions, nor for its means, methods or procedures of construction. Consultant's services do not include review or evaluation of the Client's, contractor's or subcontractor's safety measures, or job site safety or furnishing or performing any of the Contractor's work.
- 3. If requested in the scope of a Supplemental Letter Agreement, then Consultant may provide an Opinion of Probable Construction Cost. Consultant's Opinions of Probable Construction Cost provided for herein are to be made on the basis of Consultant's experience and qualifications and represent Consultant's best judgment as a professional generally familiar with the Industry. However, since Consultant has no control over the cost of labor, materials, equipment or service furnished by others, or over the Contractor's methods of determining prices, or over competitive bidding or market conditions, Consultant cannot and does not guarantee that proposals, bids or actual construction cost will not vary from Opinions of Construction Cost prepared by Consultant. If Client wishes greater assurance as to probable Construction Cost, Client shall employ an independent cost estimator or negotiate additional services and fees with Consultant.

#### B. Indemnity for Environmental Issues

 Consultant is not a user, generator, handler, operator, arranger, storer, transporter or disposer of hazardous or toxic substances, therefore the Client agrees to hold harmless, indemnify and defend Consultant and Consultant's officers, directors, subconsultant(s), employees and agents from and against any and all claims, losses, damages, liability and costs, including but not limited to costs of defense, arising out of or in any way connected with, the presence, discharge, release, or escape of hazardous or toxic substances, pollutants or contaminants of any kind at the site.

#### C. Limitations on Consultant's Liability

- 1. The Client hereby agrees that to the fullest extent permitted by law, Consultant's total liability to the Client for any and all injuries, claims, losses, expenses, or damages whatsoever arising out of or in any way related to the Project or this Agreement from any cause or causes including, but not limited to, Consultant's negligence, errors, omissions, strict liability, breach of contract or breach of warranty shall not exceed five hundred thousand dellars (\$500,000). In the event Client desires limits of liability in excess of those provided in this paragraph, Client shall advise Consultant in writing and agree that Consultant's fee shall increase by 1% for each additional five hundred thousand dollars of liability limits, up to a maximum limit of liability of five million dollars (\$5,000,000).
- 2. Neither Party shall be liable to the other for consequential damages, including, without limitation, lost rentals, increased rental expenses, loss of use, loss of income, lost profit, financing, business and reputation and for loss of management or employee productivity, incurred by one another or their subsidiaries or successors, regardless of whether such damages are foreseeable and are caused by breach of contract, willful misconduct, negligent act or omission, or other wrongful act of either of them.
- It is intended by the parties to this Agreement that Consultant's services shall not subject Consultant's employees, officers or directors to any personal legal exposure for the risks associated

with this Agreement. The Client agrees that as the Client's sole and exclusive remedy, any claim, demand or suit shall be directed and/or asserted only against Consultant, and not against any of Consultant's individual employees, officers or directors, and Client knowingly waives all such claims against Consultant individual employees, officers or directors.

#### ). Assignment

 Neither party to this Agreement shall transfer, sublet or assign any rights under, or interests in, this Agreement or claims based on this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other party. Any assignment in violation of this subsection shall be null and yold.

#### SECTION V - DISPUTE RESOLUTION

#### A. Mediation

 Any dispute between Client and Consultant arising out of or relating to this Agreement or services provided under this Agreement, (except for unpaid invoices which are governed by Section III), shall be submitted to nonbinding mediation as a precondition to litigation unless the parties mutually agree otherwise. Mediation shall occur within 60 days of a written demand for mediation unless Consultant and Client mutually agree otherwise.

#### B. Litigation - Choice of Venue and Jurisdiction

 Any dispute not settled through mediation shall be settled through litigation in the state where the Project at issue is located.

- All documents, including reports, drawings, calculations, specifications, CADD materials, computers software or hardware or other work product prepared by Consultant pursuant to this Agreement are Consultant's Instruments of Service ("Instruments of Service") and Consultant retains all ownership interests in Instruments of Service, including all available copyrights.
- 2. Consultant shall retain all of its rights in its proprietary information including, without limitation, its methodologies and methods of analysis, ideas, concepts, expressions, inventions, know how, methods, techniques, skills, knowledge and experience possessed by Consultant prior to, or acquired by Consultant during, the performance of this Agreement and the same shall not be deemed to be Work Product or Work for Hire and Consultant shall not be restricted in any way with respect thereto.

#### B. Client Use of Instruments of Service

- Provided that Consultant has been paid in full for its services, Client shall have the right in the form of a license to use Instruments of Service resulting from Consultant's efforts on the Project. Consultant shall retain full rights to electronic data and the drawings, specifications, including those in electronic form, prepared by Consultant and its subconsultants and the right to reuse component information contained in them in the normal course of Consultant's professional activities. Consultant shall be deemed to be the author of such Instruments of Service, electronic data or documents, and shall be given appropriate credit in any public display of such Instruments of Service.
- Records requests or requests for additional copies of Instruments of Services outside of the scope of services are available to Client subject to Consultant's current rate schedule.

#### C. Reuse of Documents

1. All Instruments of Service prepared by Consultant pursuant to this Agreement are not intended or represented to be suitable for reuse by the Client or others on extensions of the Project or on any other Project. Any reuse of the Instruments of Service without written consent or adaptation by Consultant for the specific purpose intended will be at the Client's sole risk and without liability or legal exposure to Consultant; and the Client shall release Consultant from all claims arising from such use. Client shall also defend, indemnify and hold harmless Consultant from all claims, damages, losses and expenses including attomeys' fees arising out of or resulting from reuse of Consultant documents without written consent.
