**WHEREAS**, the Plan provides justification for proposed projects and budgets and can serve as a resource for those actively engaged in making Bayard a beautiful, healthy, and economically strong community; and,

WHEREAS, the Bayard community and staff have been engaged throughout the development of the Plan and have been provided the opportunity to voice opinions and provide informed input; and,

WHEREAS, this Plan was presented to the City Council on July 16, 2025 and discussed at a Council work session on September 15, 2025.

# INTERSTATE STREAM COMMISSION, THE CITY OF BAYARD, THE VILLAGE OF SANTA CLARA, AND THE TOWN OF SILVER CITY

The undersigned, being the governing board of The City of Bayard, New Mexico ("Bayard"), after public notice on November 19, 2025, as required by the Open Meetings Act, hereby adopts the following resolution as of the date of the public meeting in which a motion was duly made, seconded and voted upon.

WHEREAS, pursuant to the 2004 Arizona Water Settlements Act ("AWSA") the New Mexico Interstate Stream Commission ("NMISC" or "Commission") allocated \$1,347,343 from the New Mexico Unit Fund to Bayard for Bayard's Effluent Use Project in 2015 and 2016 ("Original Allocation");

WHEREAS, Bayard expended \$3,519.69 on the Project, leaving \$1,343,823.31 in unspent funds;

WHEREAS, on January 21, 2025, the Commission approved Bayard's request for a reallocation of the unspent money remaining from the Original Allocation for i) the inspection, testing and rehabilitation of an existing well (Well M-2576) near the Village of Santa Clara, New Mexico and ii) the design of a water transmission line from that well to the Santa Clara Booster Station ("Project") and reallocated up to \$1,343,823.31 for use toward the Project ("Reallocation Amount");

WHEREAS, the Project supports one phase of the Grant County Regional Water Project, which involves and will benefit Bayard, Silver City, and Santa Clara, by helping Santa Clara to utilize Well M-2576 through an agreement between Santa Clara and Freeport-McMoRan Chino Mines, Inc.;

WHEREAS, Bayard desires to ratify all actions in connection with the Project and Reallocation Amount and authorize Bayard to execute, enter into, and deliver the Design Funding Agreement Among the State of New Mexico Interstate Stream Commission, the City of Bayard, the Village of Santa Clara, and the Town of Silver City ("Funding Agreement") in the name and on behalf of Bayard;

WHEREAS, Bayard desires to authorize and empower a representative to execute and enter into the Funding Agreement;

### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

RESOLVED, the form and content of the Funding Agreement, as shown on the attached Exhibit A, is hereby ratified and approved.

RESOLVED, John L. Ojinaga, Mayor, is hereby authorized and empowered to execute and enter into the Funding Agreement and any and all additional necessary other documents related to the Project in the name and on behalf of The City of Bayard, upon those terms and conditions set forth in the Funding Agreement.

**OPEN MEETINGS NOTICE** 

A RESOLUTION CONCERNING GOVERNING BODY MEETINGS AND PUBLIC NOTICE REQUIRED

WHEREAS, Section 10-15-1B, NMSA 1978 provides that all meetings of a quorum of members of any board, commission or other policy-making body of any state agency, or any agency or authority or any county, municipality, district or any political subdivision held for the purpose of formulating public policy, discussing public business or for the purpose of taking any action within the authority of or the delegated authority of such board, commission or other policy-making body, are declared to be public meetings open to the public at all times, except as otherwise provided in the constitution or the provisions of the Open Meetings Act; and,

WHEREAS, Section 10-15-3A, NMSA 1978 provides that no resolution, rule, regulation, ordinance or action of any board, commission, committee or other policy-making body shall be valid unless taken or made at a meeting held in accordance with the requirements of Section 10-15-1 NMSA 1978"; and,

WHEREAS, Section 10-15-4, NMSA 1978 provides that any person violating any of the provisions of Section 10-15-1 NMSA 1978 is guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be punished by a fine of not more than five hundred dollars (\$500) for each offense; and,

WHEREAS, Section 10-15-1D requires that any meeting at which the discussion or adoption of any proposed resolution, rule, regulation or formal action occurs, and at which a majority or quorum of the body is in attendance, and any closed meetings, shall be held only after reasonable notice to the public. The affected body shall determine at least annually in a public meeting what notice for a public meeting shall be reasonable when applied to such body.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the governing body of the municipality of Bayard, New Mexico that:

The clerk <u>may</u> in addition to posting, publish one or more times in a newspaper of general circulation **within the municipality**, even though it does not maintain an office within the municipality. In addition, written notice of such meetings shall be mailed or hand delivered to federally licensed broadcast stations and newspapers of general circulation in the municipality which have provided a written request for such notice.

#### DEPARTMENT HEAD REPORTS

Maintenance Director Sam Arellano stated his department has been spraying weeds, fixing water leaks, plugged sewer lines, and PRV's. Christmas Tree is up early this year. The depot is cleaned and organized. The dugouts at the bottom field are being done. Free trash picks are being picked up. There were three maintenance workers that attended the water conference. Water tests came back good.

Wastewater Supervisor Stephen Estrada explained to the mayor and council all the issues the treatment plant is having and explained how they are being resolved.

Chuck Gray, Beautification Committee Chair stated the maintenance department is doing a great job. The city is looking really good. The committee voted at their last meeting to donate money to buy turkeys for the residents. This Sunday the committee will be having a Bingo. The committee will be handing out 6 prizes for the best lights in the city.

Cordell Jones Planning and Zoning Chair stated he has a couple of things he is having to look over but they are not allowed in city.

Police Chief Hector Carrillo stated his police officers will be patrolling the school zones with more officers. Chief Carrillo attended the Chiefs Association Conference there was a lot of information given. The Police Department received an award for the Trout Fire. The Shop with the cops has raised for 34 students from the mining district so far.

Fire Chief Gabe Gonzales read his fire report for the month. The fire department has been attending trainings. All equipment is working good. The department provided community services, by standing by at the football games and the trunk or treat.

City Clerk Treasurer Martha Salas stated she received a grant for animal shelter in the amount of \$85,000. Also she received NM Unit Fund Money in the amount of \$416,000, so the city can do the 40 year plan for the water system and \$223,000 for asset management. The city will be raffling off turkeys for Thanksgiving. Southwest Disposal donated \$250 and the Beautification Committee donated \$300. They city was able to buy 47 turkeys. The maintenance department will be delivering the turkeys on Friday.

Mayor Ojinaga thanked all the police departments for the escort of the Volleyball girls coming in to town. Wastewater Treatment Plant is looking nice.

City of Bayard Wastewater Treatment Plant Monthly Report – November–December 2025 Prepared by: Stephen Estrada, Plant Supervisor

#### 1. Employee Updates

- Both new employees are progressing quickly, becoming efficient in routine tasks such as inspections, maintenance, sampling, and testing.
- They are also learning to operate the skid steer loader and backhoe.
- I respectfully request Council approval to send two employees to training classes in Las Cruces, NM, scheduled for January 26–29, 2026. Coordination has already been made with the Maintenance Department to provide coverage if needed.

#### 2. Operational Incidents

- November 25: Multiple alarms were triggered at the effluent lift station. Pumps were failing to cycle at set levels, and the generator was starting in auto mode despite utility power being available.
- An electrician and IT technician determined the cause was a faulty PLC and Automatic Transfer Switch in MCC4.
- The part will be addressed in future upgrade projects. For now, the generator will not start automatically but remains functional in manual mode.
- December 4: The scum pump in the west clarifier failed.
- A temporary submersible pump was installed to empty the scum pump wet well.
- Quotes are currently being obtained for a replacement pump.

#### 3. Equipment & System Updates

- A new plant computer has been received and will be brought online this week.
- JCH replaced two pressure relief valves on the fresh water line.
- UV system maintenance was completed, including replacement of light bulbs and sleeves.

#### 4. Summary

The plant continues to operate effectively despite equipment challenges. Staff are adapting quickly, and proactive measures are being taken to maintain reliability. Upcoming training opportunities will further strengthen our team's capabilities.


