DC environmental will be doing all the testing for a cost of \$3,408.24 for the assessment. Three chips from Deming will be doing the cleaning of the vents the cost will be \$3,513.65 once the assessment is done. Salas just wanted the community to know what was going on with the library because all the rumors that are going around.



A RESOLUTION
ADOPTING THE FY 2026-2030 INFRASTRUCTURE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS
PLAN (ICIP)

- WHEREAS, the City of Bayard of Grant County recognizes that the financing of public capital projects has become a major concern in New Mexico and nationally; and
- WHEREAS, in times of scarce resources, it is necessary to find new financing mechanisms and maximize the use of existing resources; and
- WHEREAS, systematic capital improvements planning is an effective tool for communities to define their development needs, establish priorities and pursue concrete actions and strategies to achieve necessary project development; and
- WHEREAS, this process contributes to local and regional efforts in project identification and selection in short and long range capital planning efforts.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE City of Bayard that:

1. The City of Bayard has adopted the attached FY 2026-2030 Infrastructure Capital Improvements Plan, and
2. It is intended that the Plan be a working document and is the first of many steps toward improving rational, long-range capital planning and budgeting for New Mexico's infrastructure.
3. This Resolution supersedes Resolution No. 14-2023
