

Burnouts are Illegal in Mississippi

- In Mississippi, performing a car burnout is illegal and can lead to charges for reckless driving or careless driving
- A newly enacted law, effective July 1, 2025, in Mississippi creates a new felony offense of aggravated reckless driving. This charge applies if a reckless driving incident results in "bodily harm" to another person, carrying more severe penalties, including potential prison time.

🚗 **After-Hours Vehicle Rules**
All registered Cruisin' participants MUST move their vehicles off the roadway at 5:00 PM each day. A grace period will be allowed, but vehicles must not block traffic. Any vehicle obstructing traffic after the grace period will be subject to towing.


🚫 **IMPORTANT EVENT RULES**

- No "burn outs" or burn out zones are authorized by the city
- No golf carts, bicycles, skateboards, or similar transportation allowed in the event area
- Service animals only permitted inside the event area
- No overnight parking inside the event area allowed unless:
- ✓ You are officially registered with Cruisin' the Coast
- ✓ Your registration card is clearly visible on your dashboard
- No double parking, trailers, car haulers, or campers in downtown/business district/parking garage parking spaces
- No parking of vehicle blocking barricades
- No Parking or blocking any sidewalk

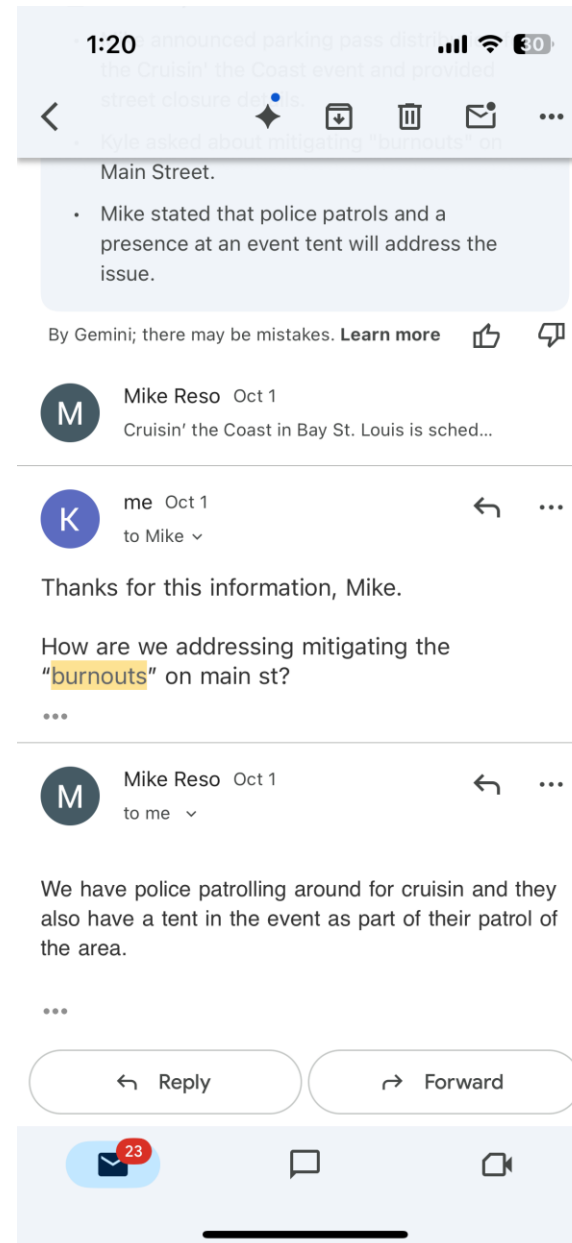

- Engineer Estimate for Ward 2 (including Main St.)
 - Base Cost per Engineer- \$905,984.00
 - Asphalt Leveling Course- \$10,100
 - Asphalt Overlay Course- \$611,600
 - Traffic Striping White- \$9,045
 - Traffic Striping Yellow- \$37,525
