## SUMMARY

The Town Administrator attended the Chief Administrative Officers (CAO) Committee Meeting held in person on October 1, 2025, at the Washington Council of Governments (COG) headquarters. The meeting covered regional updates related to human resources, transportation equity, and homeland security funding.

### Call to Order & Opening Business

- COG announced the upcoming Human Resources (HR) Conference, "*Rekindle the HR Connection: Elevating HR Professionals*," scheduled for October 22, 2025, at COG offices.
  - Action Item: COG will share registration details for the conference; CAOs may forward the invitation to staff.

### Metro Lift Briefing

Tracey Foster, WMATA's Regional Fare Programs Director, presented updates on **Metro Lift**, a reduced-fare program for **SNAP recipients** across Maryland, DC, and Virginia. The program offers a 50% fare reduction for Metrobus and Metrorail users.

- Enrollment remains low (6% of eligible adults).
- WMATA requested local support for outreach to increase participation and improve transit equity.
- Examples of successful partnerships included community-based enrollment programs through DC agencies.
- Action Items:

**FY 2025 UASI Funding & Public Safety Implications**

The **Homeland Security Executive Committee (HSEC)** briefed attendees on significant changes in **Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI)** grant funding.

- The National Capital Region (NCR)'s FY 2025 award dropped nearly 90%, from approximately \$45 million to \$4.4 million.
- This reduction will affect the sustainment of regional public safety programs and may have downstream impacts on local budgets.
- The HSEC is evaluating options to freeze most UASI-related hiring and spending while reassessing priorities and transition plans.
- Action Item: The HSEC Strategy Group will meet the week of October 6, 2025, to revise the funding strategy and timeline, with an expectation to define FY 2026 budget impacts within 45 days.

### **Next Steps & Concluding Remarks**

The next CAO Committee meeting will take place on **November 5, 2025**, at 10:00 a.m.

The meeting emphasized the importance of regional collaboration and communication among jurisdictions, particularly in addressing shared funding challenges and promoting equitable access to programs such as Metro Lift. The Town of Bladensburg will continue to stay engaged through COG forums to ensure that local needs and perspectives are represented in regional planning and resource allocation.
