#### General Items:

On April 3rd, I attended the Greenbelt Spring 2025 Economic Development Business Conference at the Crown Plaza Hotel. During the conference, Governor Moore presented Maryland's Economic Development Growth Plan, outlining strategies to drive the state's future progress.

The keynote speaker, Mr. Harry Coker, Secretary of the Maryland Department of Commerce, was joined by a panel of experts who discussed the current economic landscape in Maryland. Topics covered included the state's business work program, strategies for leveraging Maryland's asset-rich economy, and the vital role small businesses play in economic growth. The panel also explored how the state can support small businesses through contracts and growth opportunities.

Another major focus of the conference was the need to attract and retain skilled talent. As the demand for skilled employees grows, the state is working to better connect businesses with the talent they need. The panel, which included representatives from workforce development, state procurement, and affordable housing growth, also discussed various funding opportunities from the SBA, revitalization efforts, and career transit resources.
