NCR Watch Desk Program	End	Do not transition to local budgets post-UASI.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • NCR Watch Desk staff is being reduced from two positions per shift to one. • DC committed to maintaining the Watch Desk function in the short term to sustain essential reporting, such as the morning report and Regional Incident Communication and Coordination System (RICCS). • Expand regional Steering Committee to determine essential products and options for distributing Watch Desk activities across local watch desks and/or the fusion centers.
