

## City Manager May Report

*The following May report will give an overview of the objectives accomplished this past month, as well as future plans:*

### Community Involvement

City staff are looking for ways to actively participate with our local schools by becoming more involved in outreach and education. This could include visiting classrooms, meeting with student groups, and helping students understand how cities function, what services local government provides, and how decisions are made. By connecting with schools, staff can help students learn about public service, community involvement, and the important role local government plays in everyday life. This effort would also help build stronger relationships between the city, students, teachers, and families while encouraging future civic engagement in our community.

### Keep Boardman Clean

The City of Boardman's garbage voucher program helped residents dispose of unwanted items and supported ongoing efforts to keep our community clean and attractive. Through the program, 181 vouchers were distributed at a total cost of \$7,800. This service provides residents with an opportunity to properly dispose of garbage and larger items, helping reduce clutter, improve neighborhood appearance, and maintain the beauty of our city. The City Council will continue to evaluate the program to ensure it remains effective, financially responsible, and available to all Boardman residents.

### Community Safety

City staff have been looking into implementing a hearings officer to help the City of Boardman handle code enforcement matters in a more efficient and consistent way. This would create a local process for reviewing code violations while still giving residents and property owners a fair opportunity to be heard. A hearings officer would listen to both the city and the property owner or resident, review the facts, and make a written decision about whether a code violation occurred and what needs to be done to fix it. This process would help address routine code issues without sending every case to court or requiring City Council to hear each matter. Using a hearings officer would help the city resolve code concerns more quickly and fairly, while still providing notice, a hearing, and the ability to appeal. It would also allow City Council to focus on larger community issues, while routine code matters are handled through a clear and professional process.

### Betterment of our Community
