#### **ACTION ITEMS**

 Discussion and any necessary action regarding approving Resolution 2025-11 canvassing returns of the city election for City Commissioner Places 3 and 4, held on May 3, 2025.

City Secretary Jessica Sutter explained that each year the city holds a general election of the governing body for 2-year terms. This year, Commissioner Place 3 and Commissioner Place 4 were expiring and placed on the General election ballot that was held on May 3, 2025. There was a total of 233 votes cast. Results of the election for Commissioner Place 3

were: Vince Moore 80 votes, Richard "Dicky" Russell 20 votes, Junior Fernandez 104 votes and Scott Ensey 26 votes. Results for Commissioner Place 4 were: Paul J. Huntington Jr. 126 votes, and Tony Patterson 82 votes. Under Section 4.5 of the City of Breckenridge Charter, the candidate receiving the largest number of votes cast at said election for the position which he or she seeks shall be declared the duly elected person to the respective office for which he or she was a candidate. Therefore, Junior Fernandez and Paul J. Huntington Jr. received the largest number of votes and have been elected to Place 3 and Place 4 respectively.

Commissioner Akers made a motion to approve Resolution 2025-11 canvassing the returns of the city election for City Commissioner Place 3 and 4, held on May 3, 2025. Mayor Bob Sims seconded the motion. The motion passed 2-0.

There being no further business, Mayor Si	ms adjourned the regular session at 5:34 p.m.
