RE: City Council Direction on Disc Golf Course

Background

In November 2023, the City received a petition from members of the Breezy Point Neighborhood Alliance to remove holes 9-12 of the disc golf course expansion. The City Council considered the petition during the January 2, 2024 City Council meeting, and ultimately voted to adopt a list of recommendations provided by Councilmember Moroni (recommendations are attached).

City Council Direction

The adopted list of 22 directives are now staff's marching orders regarding the disc golf course. The first 12 items on the list are "will do" directives from the City Council. However, most of the items will require some kind of discussion by the Parks & Recreation Committee. For example, a number of the directives involve signage. While the City Council's direction was that such signage will be done, staff will rely on the Parks & Recreation Committee to help determine what sign verbiage should be.

The remaining 10 items on the attached list are items that the City Council has directed the Parks & Recreation Committee to further discuss and provide recommendations back to the City Council.

Implementation

As mentioned above, the attached list is now staff's priority when it comes to parks & recreation. Due to the extensive nature of the list and as most of the approved items will require discussion by the Parks & Recreation Committee, policy and/or ordinance amendments, and the expenditure of funds, staff will be preparing an implementation plan for the Parks & Recreation Committee to consider in February. Additionally, due to the significant number of projects currently on-going and scheduled to commence in the coming months, this list of directives will be the extent of staff's parks & recreation focus until it is complete.
