Staff recommend that the City Council hold a discussion on the above topic. There are no action items for Council adoption/approval in this staff report.

#### **Background**

Council members and staff have been contacted by residents, business owners, and other “users” of Visitacion Avenue regarding their concerns about traffic flow and parking during peak use times. Concerns raised during these conversations include:

- Double parking associated with food delivery drivers, library drop offs and pick ups, and quick customer trips to various businesses
- Ignoring stop signs, typically by “rolling through” the intersection
- Residential parking on Visitacion during the day
- Lack of resources for a fulltime parking enforcement officer

#### **Discussion**

This discussion is intended to provide the Council with information about how the City approaches such issues on Visitacion. Per the oral report that will be made at the meeting, staff will:

- Share the City’s current approach to parking enforcement, and the challenges associated with such support as it relates to the size and functionality of the police department
- Provide a venue for residents and business owners to provide their feedback
- Allow the Council to discuss ideas/concepts for future research and report back

Staff recommend that, should the Council have ideas they would like further investigated, the Complete Streets Committee be engaged to assist in these efforts.
