1. Report Out on Subcommittees/Committees

A. Liaison to Complete Streets & Safety Committee (CSSC) Subcommittee

The Complete Streets Safety Committee reviewed their 2025 work plan and recent accomplishments, which include:

- Completed a study on potential one-way street conversions on Mariposa and Monterey between Visitacion and Solano
- Reviewed the Baylands transportation circulation plan
- Implemented and assessed the Thomas Avenue parking pilot program

They will continue evaluating and recommending traffic-safety improvements along Visitacion Avenue and San Bruno Avenue.

Looking ahead to 2026, potential projects include sidewalk audits, intersection upgrades, and bicycle-infrastructure improvements to enhance visibility and pedestrian safety. The committee discussed several transportation and safety concerns, including a proposal to remove the median at Park Lane to address commercial truck routing issues. They also highlighted the need for sidewalk and crosswalk improvements, particularly near the South Hill and Bayshore intersection and the Bayshore and San Bruno intersection. A citywide sidewalk audit will be conducted to identify missing or damaged sidewalks and crosswalks needing upgrades, especially along Safe Routes to School corridors.

The committee also plans to focus on safety around Brisbane Elementary School, with particular attention to Glen Parkway and San Bruno Avenue. The City has received a grant to improve school-area safety and will coordinate with the County Office of Education on design and implementation.

The committee also discussed working with the Public Art Advisory Committee for updated way-finding signs in Brisbane. They also discussed looking closer at the two bus stops on Bayshore near the mobile home park and the Amazon warehouse.

Finally, the group discussed holding a workshop to clarify roles and processes between the committee and City staff. They agreed to reconvene in March to finalize their work plan and consider meeting more frequently or forming ad hoc groups to address specific projects.

Next steps #1:

They decided to create an end-of-year report to the city council to showcase their accomplishments, and to align their meetings with the city's budget cycle.

Next steps #2:

The committee plans to organize a workshop to clarify their role and responsibilities, with input from staff and experts on infrastructure, grants, and engineering solutions. They emphasized the importance of setting clear objectives and deliverables for their projects to ensure meaningful outcomes.

Next steps #3:

Staff will look at using the Notion product to assist in prioritizing and structuring their projects, similar to how the age-friendly program is used to track the progress of each project.

Next steps #4:

Staff will reach out to the County to discuss improving the safety at the entrance to San Bruno Mountain Park at the top of the mountain.

Next steps #5:

Staff will reach out to BDI regarding improving the safety for cyclists on Tunnel Avenue.
