**Criminal Enforcement:** March brought us several investigations, having investigated 47 cases and 6 of those cases were closed by immediate arrest. Five thefts, 2 possession of marijuana, 1 possession of paraphernalia, 3 burglaries, 2 domestic, 1 resisting law enforcement, 1 harassment, 1 Felony OWI, 1 runaway and 4 warrant arrests. We continue to investigate several cases from this and previous months. As always, we wish to remind everyone that there are still many scams or attempts. Always know who you are dealing with and never give out pertinent information over the phone.

**Traffic Enforcement:** In March officers investigated 12 vehicle crashes of these 1 resulted in personal injury and 2 leaving the scene. Officers issued 54 traffic citations, addressing speed, signal and sign violations. There were 10 of our citations that were for driving while license suspended or never receiving a license. They also issued 37 written warning tickets. As always, please drive defensively and never text and drive. Always wear safety restraints properly – **THEY DO SAVE LIVES.**
