Sec. 25-10. Use of sidewalks for dining and other purposes by business establishments; licensing.

(c) Outside dining. No license shall be allowed for outside dining if the sidewalk is less than nine feet wide, measured from the curb to the closest point on the outside wall of the building. For sidewalks between nine feet to 12 feet in width, tTables and chairs must be placed close against the building in such a manner as to provide a minimum of seven four feet of unobstructed passage width for public use, exclusive of trees, telephone poles, planters, and utilities. For sidewalks in excess of 12 feet in width, tables and chairs must be placed close against the building in such a manner as to provide a minimum of eight and one half feet of unobstructed passage width for public use.

Sec. 25-15. Sidewalk alcohol service, licensing.

(b) Minimum required dimensions. No license shall be allowed for sidewalk alcohol service if the sidewalk is less than nine feet wide, measured from the curb to the closest point on the outside wall of the building. For sidewalks between nine feet to 12 feet in width, tables and chairs must be placed close against the building in such a manner as to provide a minimum of six four feet of unobstructed passage width for public use, exclusive of trees, telephone poles, planters, and utilities. For sidewalks in excess of 12 feet in width, tables and chairs must be placed close against the building in such a manner as to provide a minimum of six feet plus 50 percent of the width of the sidewalk beyond 12 feet of unobstructed passage width for public use. However, the width of unobstructed passage need not exceed eight and one half feet no matter the width of the sidewalk.
