Defendants should pay Smith the amount due to him to the average first year associate or attorney in Massachusetts. Plaintiff also could not grieve properly as his father died while he was at Charlotte Hungerford in Torrington and he was only home for a few hours before being hospitalized again. All Plaintiff did was go to CVS to get his prescriptions

and then went to Lukes Inn to buy Chinese Food and get a free bottle of Wine. Smith was grieving his father's death while looking up famous Jrs as he noticed Judge McConnell and JudgeBbarbadoro (I think) were both juniors. Plaintiff was looking at great performances by athletes after the death of their father or grandfather and noticed that Youtube had the wrong video of Patrick Beverly's performance after his grandfather died. Plaintiff never drinks and had a whole bottle of wine. Plaintiff was drunk but that was no reason to attack Plaintiff and barge into his home. This happened on or around May 30th 2021.

Authority For Civil Cover Sheet

The JS 44 civil cover sheet and the information contained herein neither replaces nor supplements the filings and service of pleading or other papers as required by law, except as provided by local rules of court. This form, approved by the Judicial Conference of the United States in September 1974, is required for the use of the Clerk of Court for the purpose of initiating the civil docket sheet. Consequently, a civil cover sheet is submitted to the Clerk of Court for each civil complaint filed. The attorney filing a case should complete the form as follows:

- L(a) Plaintiffs-Defendants. Enter names (last, first, middle initial) of plaintiff and defendant. If the plaintiff or defendant is a government agency, use only the full name or standard abbreviations. If the plaintiff or defendant is an official within a government agency, identify first the agency and then the official, giving both name and title.
- (b) County of Residence. For each civil case filed, except U.S. plaintiff cases, enter the name of the county where the first listed plaintiff resides at the time of filing.
