**Subject:** Aidan's Pub Update

Madam Clerk,

At the 10/22/25 council meeting the council conducted a 3-month review of the (***Modification of Dancing and Entertainment License for expansion of premises to include outdoor entertainment on Fridays***). Notably, a review of police department indices displayed nineteen (19) calls of service for this establishment. At the council meeting Councilman Ley had asked for a timeline of events or pattern of events for these calls of service to the police department. **Note:** attached is a list ("Aidens Pub-notes") of events with timelines and a briefing of the issue to meet that request. Moreover, at the council meeting is what determined to have Aidens Pub ownership/management meet with my office to mitigate/address the nineteen (19) calls of service.

On Tuesday, November 4, 2025, we met with the owner Jeffery Quinlan and Michael Cockcroft in the Chiefs Office and discussed each issue at length and offered solutions to achieve desired outcomes. The Aidan's pub team requested time to develop an action plan and attached is there "**noise compliance**" list of actions items that they will take in concert with senior management oversight to garner enhanced compliance.



## Noise Remediation Measures

In effort to maintain continued compliance with local ordinances and for improved relations with our downtown surrounding neighbors, effective immediately we have implemented the following practices and protocols:

1. Loitering at front of building and parking lot will be monitored and dispersed
2. Groups engaging in loud discussion on upper and lower decks will be directed inside the building
3. Doors and windows will be closed during nights of entertainment
4. Music / noise level emanating from the building will be self-monitored via decibel readings at street level and logged for reference
5. Entertainment will make courtesy announcements at end of night instructing patrons to respect our downtown surrounding neighbors while exiting the premises
6. Bottles and glassware will be thrown in dumpster the morning following close of business

Lastly, please include their list of “noise compliance” strategies to the docket and kindly send this e-mail to the entire council to meet the request of Councilman Ley in better defining the reported issues and establishing a timeline/briefing on the calls of service...

RE: Noise Complaint

Dear Mr. Quinlan, this letter is to follow up regarding a noise complaint received on November 6, 2025. Notably, Officers responded to a report of "loud noise" at approximately 11:41 p.m. and recorded a sound reading of 53.5 dBA near the corner of Thames Street and John Street.

As you are aware, your establishment is located in a commercial zone that directly abuts a residential area. According to the Bristol Town Code (§10-38 & § 10-39), when commercial zones abut residential uses, the more restrictive residential sound level limits apply at the property line. The applicable limits for residential areas are:

- Daytime (7:00 a.m. – 10:00 p.m.): 60 dBA
- Nighttime (10:00 p.m. – 7:00 a.m.): 50 dBA

Since the complaint occurred at 11:41 p.m., the nighttime limit of 50 dBA applies. The officers reading was taken and the recorded level of 53.5 dBA exceeded the residential nighttime limit. We appreciate that your staff immediately reduced the volume upon request and that there were no further issues reported for the remainder of the night. This letter is intended as a courtesy notification to remind you that because your business abuts a residential area, sound levels should remain within the residential limits during nighttime hours to avoid potential future violations.

We encourage you to continue monitoring noise levels, particularly during nighttime operations, to ensure compliance with the Town's Noise Ordinance §10-37 and §10-38. If you have any questions or would like guidance on sound mitigation strategies, please feel free to contact the Bristol Police Department.

Thank you for your attention to this matter and your cooperation.
