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Second page to 9 Third School Street, request to have a accessible parking space relocated:


In reviewing this petition, I spoke with Ms. Castilloux regarding her request. Ms. Castilloux informed me that the original petitioner, Raymon Green, no longer resides at this address and that the accessible parking space in front of 9 Third School Street is no longer needed for that residence. She further stated that a resident of 14 Third School Street has been utilizing this space.

Ms. Castilloux requested that the accessible parking space be relocated closer to her residence, which is situated diagonally from the current location.

Officers have conducted multiple checks of the area to determine whether the space is actively being used. Their observations confirmed that the space is currently utilized by a vehicle owner with an active handicap placard out of 14 Third School Street. I reached out to the owner of this vehicle and was informed that he does utilize this accessible space, and it is also utilized by residents living at 11 Third School Street.

Additionally, Ms. Castilloux stated in her petition that she experiences difficulty backing out of her driveway when a vehicle is parked in front of her residence. Ms. Castilloux's driveway measures 16 feet in width, and Third School Street measures 32 feet in width. After reviewing this concern, I did not observe any conditions that would make exiting the driveway at 9 Third School Street more difficult than for other residents along Third School Street.

Given that the accessible parking space remains in active use, I do not recommend its removal without a request for an accessible parking space from 11 or 14 Third School Street. Please see photos attached.
