Property History

BENJAMIN TILLEY-ISAAC WILLIAMS HOUSE c 1833, c. 1900: In 1833 Benjamin Tilley, owner of a Wood Street ropewalk, built this 2-1/2story, 5-bay, gable-roof Federal house, on the site of Byfield's house. He sold it to Isaac Williams, superintendent of the National India Rubber Company, in 1872. Williams served on the Town Council, in the General Assembly, on the town's school committee, and as chairman of the Republican Party's state committee. Detailing includes a central entrance with fluted pilasters supporting a wide entablature with guttae and a projecting molding. The side porch with chamfered posts and beaded board ceiling dates from c. 1929.
