Subject: City of Buchanan 2027-2031 Master Plan

Background

The City of Buchanan's current Master Plan is set to expire at the end of 2026. As required under Michigan's Planning Enabling Act, every community must maintain a current and actively used Master Plan to guide land use decisions, future infrastructure investments, economic development efforts, and overall community vision. A comprehensive Master Plan is the foundational document that informs zoning, supports pursuit of grant funding, and ensures development aligns with the goals and values of the community.

The Master Plan serves as a roadmap for the next five (5) years, helping the City proactively shape growth, protect our character, and address critical issues such as housing, transportation, recreation, and downtown revitalization. Regular updates are essential to ensure continued compliance with state law and relevance to changing community needs.

Proposal

The Southwest Michigan Planning Commission (SWMPC) has submitted a proposal to lead the development of our next 5-year Master Plan at a cost not to exceed \$20,099. SWMPC has prepared multiple Master Plans for the City over the past several five-year planning cycles.

Partnering with SWMPC also provides a significant cost advantage. Their nonprofit structure enables them to offer professional planning services at a lower cost than private firms, without compromising on expertise or process rigor. Staff believe this partnership will result in a strong, actionable plan while ensuring responsible use of taxpayer resources. The proposal was unanimously recommended by the Planning Commission for City Commission consideration and approval during its October meeting.

Recommendation

Staff recommends that the City Commission approve awarding the contract for the new 5-year Master Plan to the Southwest Michigan Planning Commission. Maintaining a current and compliant Master Plan is important to Buchanan's long-term success, economic competitiveness, and ability to secure future state and federal funding.
