This Fireworks Agreement ("Agreement") is made this the 9^{TH} day of <u>DECEMBER</u>, 2024 by and between <u>PYRO SHOWS OF TEXAS</u>, INC., (hereinafter referred to as "**Vendor**"), and the City of Burleson, Texas (hereinafter referred to as "**City**").

For and in consideration of the mutual covenants and obligations set forth herein, the benefits flowing to each of the parties hereto, and other good and valuable consideration, the **CITY** and **VENDOR** do hereby contract and agree as follows:

1. The **City of Burleson** is a Texas home rule municipality operating under and pursuant to Article 11, Section 5 of the Texas Constitution, the laws of the State of Texas, and the Charter of the City of Burleson, Texas.

2. **CITY** intends to promote, at its own cost and expense, certain festivities celebrating Independence Day in Burleson, Texas. This Agreement deals exclusively with the scheduled pyrotechnic demonstration (the "pyrotechnic display") pursuant to the RFP 2024-024 submission, attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by reference for all purposes, on July 4, 2025 (or the alternate dates set forth in Section 7 below). The show will begin at approximately 9:30 p.m. and the duration of said display is at least eighteen (18) minutes. Said display will be produced, choreographed, and designed as approved by the **CITY**.

3. VENDOR is in charge of all aspects of the production of the pyrotechnic display and will design and choreograph the pyrotechnic display as part of the festivities and pursuant to an agreement of the parties as so enumerated herein. VENDOR will perform and execute the pyrotechnic display. In the performance of its duties hereunder, VENDOR shall provide technicians who are professional, who have received training on the proper display of fireworks, and who have been and are licensed or certified under any applicable law or regulation to conduct and operate a fireworks display.

6. VENDOR will procure all necessary permits and required inspections in connection with this Agreement and will comply with all applicable laws, rules, regulations and standards. VENDOR shall purchase and maintain during the term of this Agreement: (i)worker's compensation insurance in the amounts required by State law, and (ii) commercial general liability insurance including personal injury liability, premises operations liability, contractual liability, covering, but not limited to, the liability assumed under the indemnification provisions of this Agreement, products/completed operations, and bodily injury and property damage, with limits of liability of not less than \$5,000,000. Coverage under such policies must be on an occurrence basis, and if the commercial general liability

insurance contains a general aggregate limit, it shall apply separately to this location and to the event described herein. All such policies of insurance shall (a) be issued by a carrier which is rated A- or better by A.M. Best's Key Rating Guide (and have a financial size category rating by A.M. Best of VII or better) and licensed to do business in the State of Texas, and (b) name the City of Burleson, Texas, its officials, officers, and employees as an additional insured and contain a waiver of subrogation in favor of the City of Burleson, Texas, and (c) provide for at least thirty (30) days written notice to the City of Burleson, Texas prior to cancellation or modification. On or before June 1, 2025, **VENDOR** shall provide **CITY** with certificates of insurance evidencing such insurance policies together with the declaration page of such policies, along with the endorsement naming the City of Burleson, Texas as an additional insured.

7. In the event the pyrotechnic display described herein is canceled in its entirety and not rescheduled, except as a result of a breach of this Agreement by **VENDOR**, **CITY** agrees to pay **VENDOR** for its reasonable out of pocket expenses and production fees incurred in connection with this Agreement plus 50% of the contract amount set forth in Section 11. In such event and if **VENDOR** has previously received from **CITY** more than 50% of the contract amount, **VENDOR** shall, within 10 days of the date of cancellation, reimburse to **CITY** the difference between the amount actually paid to **VENDOR** (less any expenses and production fees incurred in connection herewith) and 50% of the contract amount.

Every reasonable effort will be made to conduct the pyrotechnic display on July 4th despite weather conditions prior to, or during, the pyrotechnic display. In the event of weather conditions that will prevent the pyrotechnic display, the **CITY** and **VENDOR** will mutually agree upon a time to decide if the pyrotechnic display will occur on July 4th, or if the pyrotechnic display will have to be rescheduled **CITY** is responsible for the cost of approved extra expenses including any additional costs incurred by or to **VENDOR**, i.e. meals, hotels, transportation, and possible airfare.

8. **VENDOR** will provide a flash drive with digital files of music to be synchronized with the pyrotechnic display.

9. [This section intentionally left blank.]

10. VENDOR assumes no responsibility for security or crowd management relating to said event. CITY must provide a safe and secure area (as reasonably defined by VENDOR) in which to properly fire the display. Furthermore, VENDOR is not liable for crowd behavior on the night of said display, but is the full responsibility of CITY. Further, VENDOR will not be responsible for any injury to persons or damage to motor vehicles within 420 feet of the FIREWORKS DISCHARGE SITE. VENDOR will present a plot plan accepted by the Burleson Fire Department and to become part of this contract. VENDOR shall be responsible for basic cleanup of the launch area to include policing of the fallout zone for any unexploded ordnance and removal of large paper debris, wood, wire,

foil, racks, mortars and firing equipment used in the setup for the pyrotechnic display. **CITY** shall be responsible for cleanup of debris located in and around fallout zone.

11. The total cost to be paid by **CITY** is <u>FORTY-THREE THOUSAND AND NO/100</u> <u>DOLLARS (\$43,000.00)</u> for all matters relative to the production of the pyrotechnic display under this agreement (provided, however, that in the event the display described in this Agreement is canceled as set forth in Section 7, the terms of Section 7 shall control). Payment to be as follows: <u>50%</u> of the total cost is due no later than May 26, 2025, and the remaining balance is due on or before July 4, 2025, or on the business day next following the Rescheduled Date (in the event the pyrotechnic display is rescheduled). Payment to be made per above schedule to the offices of **VENDOR**.

12. VENDOR' INDEMNITY OBLIGATION. VENDOR covenants, agrees to, and shall DEFEND (with counsel reasonably acceptable to the Town), INDEMNIFY, AND HOLD HARMLESS the City of Burleson, Texas and the elected officials, the officers, employees, representatives, and volunteers of the City of Burleson, Texas, individually or collectively, in both their official and private capacities (the City of Burleson, Texas and the elected officials, the officers, employees, representatives, and volunteers of the City of Burleson, Texas, individually or collectively, in both their official and private capacities each being an "Burleson Person" and collectively the "Burleson Persons") from and against any and all claims, liabilities, judgments, lawsuits, demands, harm, losses, damages, proceedings, suits, actions, causes of action, liens, fees, fines, penalties, expenses, or costs, of any kind and nature whatsoever made upon or incurred by the Town and/or any other Burleson Person, whether directly or indirectly, (the "Claims"), that arise out of, result from, or relate to: (i) services of VENDOR set forth in this Agreement (including, without limitation, the services set forth in of Sections 4, 6 and 8 of this Agreement), (ii) representations or warranties by VENDOR under this Agreement; and/or (iii) any other act or omission under or in performance of this Agreement by VENDOR, its owners, directors, officers, shareholders, managers, partners, employees, agents, engineers, architects, consultants, contractors. subcontractors, invitees, patrons, guests, customers, tenants, subtenants, licensees, sublicensees, concessionaires, or any other person or entity for whom VENDOR is legally responsible, and their respective owners, directors, officers, shareholders, managers, partners, employees, agents, engineers, architects, consultants, contractors, subcontractors, invitees, patrons, guests, customers, licensees, and concessionaires (collectively, "VENDOR Persons"). SUCH DEFENSE, INDEMNITY AND HOLD HARMLESS SHALL AND DOES INCLUDE CLAIMS ALLEGED OR FOUND TO HAVE BEEN CAUSED IN WHOLE OR IN PART BY THE NEGLIGENCE OR GROSS NEGLIGENCE OF ANY BURLESON PERSON, OR CONDUCT BY ANY BURLESON PERSON THAT WOULD GIVE RISE TO STRICT LIABILITY OF ANY KIND. However, VENDOR' liability under this clause shall be reduced by that portion of the total amount of the Claims (excluding defense fees and costs) equal to the Burleson Person or Burleson Persons' proportionate share of the negligence, gross negligence, or conduct that would give rise to strict liability of any kind, that caused the loss. Likewise, VENDOR' liability for Burleson Person's defense costs and attorneys' fees shall be reduced by that portion of the defense costs and attorneys' fees equal to

Burleson Person or Burleson Persons' proportionate share of the negligence, gross negligence, or conduct that would give rise to strict liability of any kind, that caused the loss.

VENDOR shall promptly advise the City of Burleson in writing of any claim or demand against any Burleson Person related to or arising out of VENDOR' or any VENDOR Persons' activities under this Agreement and shall see to the investigation and defense of such claim or demand at VENDOR's sole cost and expense. The Burleson Persons shall have the right, at the Burleson Persons' option and own expense, to participate in such defense without relieving VENDOR of any of its obligations hereunder.

13. Any notice or document required to be delivered hereunder may be delivered in person or shall be deemed to be delivered, whether actually received or not, when deposited in the United States mail, postage prepaid, registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, addressed to the parties at the addresses indicated below, or at such other addresses as may have theretofore been specified by written notice delivered in accordance herewith.

14. The validity of this Contract and of any of its terms or provisions, as well as the rights and duties of the parties hereto, shall be governed by the laws of the State of Texas. This Agreement shall be performable and all compensation payable in Johnson County, Texas. Venue for any action or proceeding under this Agreement lies in Johnson County, Texas. In the event there is any dispute or litigation with regard to this agreement, the successful party shall be entitled to its attorney's fees and costs.

15. The undersigned officers and/or agents of the parties hereto are the properly authorized officials and have the necessary authority to execute this Agreement on behalf of the parties hereto.

16. VENDOR expressly acknowledges CITY is a political subdivision of the State of Texas and nothing in the Agreement will be construed as a waiver or relinquishment by CITY of its right to claim such exemptions, damage caps, privileges, and immunities as may be provided by law. Neither the execution of the Agreement by CITY nor any other conduct, action, or inaction of any representative of CITY relating to the Agreement constitutes or is intended to constitute a waiver of CITY's sovereign immunity to suit.

17. It is agreed that **CITY** will have the option to extend this Agreement contract for up to two (2) additional years, in one-year intervals. To exercise this option, the **CITY** shall serve notice 30 days prior to contract termination or to the end of any one-year extension. If **CITY** exercises the option to extend this contract, the aerial drone demonstration date and the total cost shall be as listed below:

Option 1 – July 4, 2026 – Total Cost of \$44,720.00

Option 2 - July 4, 2027 - Total Cost of \$46,509.00

8. Term of Contract and Option to Extend

Any contract resulting from this RFP shall be effective <u>for twelve (12) months from date</u> <u>of award.</u> The City anticipates that contract shall be renewed pursuant to the availability of funds and at the discretion of the City. The following clauses shall be included in the contract:

A. <u>Option Clause:</u> It is agreed that City will have the option to extend the contract for up to four (4) additional years, in one-year intervals. To exercise this option, the City shall serve notice 30 days prior to contract termination or to the end of any one-year extension. The Option to Extend will not be considered if funding

is unavailable or if the contractor's past performance is not within the industry standard.

- B. Escalation Clause: Should market conditions prevail which dictate an increase,
- C. the successful contractor may submit documentation requesting permission to increase pricing no later than 30 days after receiving notice from the City of its intent to extend the agreement. Escalation may only occur at the time of renewal and only upon securing the approval of the City in writing. Requests for price adjustments must be solely for the purpose of accommodating an increase in the contractor's cost, not profits.

Vendors shall show in this quote their anticipated percent of escalation if/when the option to extend is exercised. The percent quoted will be a maximum. In addition, the percentage proposed will be a factor in determining the best value to the City. It is the average price over the period of the contract that will be the price factor considered in the evaluation of this quote. Quotes in which negative or no escalation is shown will be considered as 0% escalation.

D. <u>Price Increases Upon Extension</u>: If approved by the City, the Contractor shall modify the rates charged by the Contractor to reflect any changes shown in the comparative statement delivered to the City. The maximum increase allowed under this provision shall be four percent (4%) per year. The City shall have authority, in its reasonable discretion, to determine the validity of any change in Contractor's rates. City cannot exercise the Option to Extend with any price increases unless the Vendor completes the section of the Quote requesting anticipated percentage of annual escalation.


Check the Facts

If a 3-inch shell goes 300 feet high and has a 300 foot diameter burst, an 8-inch shell climbs 800 feet with a burst 800 feet in diameter! We've checked your venue with satellite imaging and have determined the largest fireworks that may be launched safely.


Your custom show has been designed using 4 classifications of visual effects.

Procedures



Staging equipment, site clean-up, display delays, and contract adjustment.

Crew, equipment and fireworks will arrive on site the morning of July 3rd. The crew will begin setup immediately following a general safety inspection of the area to make sure there are no hazards. Crew will be onsite until around 9:00pm on the night of the 3rd until the overnight security arrives. The remaining equipment and/or show work will take place on the morning of the 4th and will culminate in a final safety and security check before the show.

Once the show has finished, the crew will allow a sufficient cool down period to allow for any late shells to fire off should that happen. The crew will then do a thorough check of the mortars and secure any unfired shells for safe travel back to the facility. The remaining equipment will then be disassembled and loaded back into the truck for travel back to the facility. The crew will do a general cleanup of the 100' radius of the show site to remove any shell casings, wires, or other debris within that area.

In regard to dark sky, or delays, we do not script our shows with dark sky longer than 8 seconds, however there is no way to completely control the show in a manner that would keep shells from catching fire early at times and leaving small voids in the show. Pyro Shows does use a special proprietary bag that covers the racks, to help prevent this, but it the process is not a complete preventative, and some pre-fires occasionally happen. Pyro Shows sells their shows with a specific shell count and should there be a significant issue, a credit for any unfired product would be issued.

Pyro Shows Workflow

The professional fireworks industry is a very unique industry. For every show we do, whether it's a small birthday party to an extravaganza on the 4th of July, *each show* goes through a workflow of multiple layers.

Here is a *brief* summary of the attention Pyro Shows will give YOUR show!

Administrative



Once Show Directors have performed site evaluations, completed the show design process, and coordinated crews—the admin process may begin!

Lots of moving documents! Contracts, sales orders, insurance certificates, site diagrams, product summaries, regulatory information, processing paperwork for local and state permit applications. The list goes on!

Design and Scripting

Select each firework based on color, visual effect, and timing. Write the show script that goes to the field operations team and to the Pyrotech. If the show is musically accompanied, create the soundtrack. If choreographed, create the custom soundtrack and script each firework to the beat of the music.

Field Operations

Gather fireworks from storage magazines based on design script. Scan firework bar codes of each piece of product for internal inventory and ATF compliance. Pack and secure each show with all fireworks, mortar racks, fire extinguishers, PPE equipment, and postshow cleanup supplies. Once each show is "compiled", then they are loaded onto trucks.


Firework Show Day



Pyrotech Crew Chief and crew members arrive on site the morning of show (or days before the show depending on the show size). Survey and monitor fallout safety area, mark launch site safety zone, begin unloading equipment, assembling racks, placing racks in accordance to show design script. Load explosives into mortars, cover/waterproof loaded fireworks. Wire explosives, check wiring, continuity, firing system and backup firing system. Get ready for showtime! Superior Customer Service



Below is a site diagram which is a satellite image of your venue. The circles indicate the safety fallout radius. The safety distance is calculated based on the largest size firework in the show design. A site survey and satellite view confirm we are the required distances away from parking lots, roadways, occupied dwellings, and powerlines.
