First Amendment to the Advance Funding Agreement (AFA) for Local Government Maintenance of Railroad Pavement Markings and Signs (Off-System)

Purpose of the AFA Amendment

- Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) has identified BNSF Railway and Union Pacific Railroad highway-rail grade crossings in the City of Burleson.
- TxDOT received Section 130 Federal funding for construction of projects that eliminate hazards of railway-highway crossings.
- On April 21, 2025 City Council approved a Resolution authorizing the execution of an AFA with the TxDOT for Local Government Maintenance of Railroad Pavement Markings and Signs (Off-System).
- The City and TxDOT executed the AFA on May 13, 2025.
- TxDOT is now requesting an amendment to the AFA to include one additional crossing location within the City of Burleson.

Amendment Specifics

• Adding one additional location at NE Alsbury Blvd. between Commercial Blvd. and Burleson Blvd.

Maintains Original Agreement Specifics:

- TxDOT to fund 100% of the Project.
- TxDOT will manage the delivery of the Project.
- City of Burleson will own facilities upon completion of Project and must agree to maintain the installed signage and pavement markings.
