Opioid Manufacturers Settlement Resolution

- On November 8, 2021, the City Council approved a resolution joining the global opioid settlement with the State of Texas through the Office of the Attorney General.
- Over the past few years, the state of Texas, along with a broad coalition of states and subdivisions, have reached final agreements with multiple companies to resolve legal claims for their role in the opioid crisis.
- The State of Texas has reached another settlement, this time with eight generic opioid manufacturers – Alvogen, Amnel, Apotex, Hikma, Indivior, Mylan, Sun, and Zydus.
- The Attorney General's office has now contacted subdivision across the state about joining the agreement.
- By signing onto the settlement agreement and executing a release, the City will be entitled to a portion of the funds that the state receives.
- The deadline join this settlement is September 30, 2025.

Opioid Manufacturers Settlement Resolution

- At this time, it is not known how much the City will receive from this settlement. The amount of the settlement depends on a variety of factors, including the number of participating entities.
- The use of opioid settlement funds are restricted to specific opioid remediation and prevention uses, including treatment and coordination of care, prevention of opioid usage, overdose prevention, and data and research. While these categories are broad, specific uses can include continuing education and training for first responders related to appropriate practices and precautions when dealing with opioids and fentanyl.
- Over the last three years, the City has received \$102,136.45 from previous opioid settlements.
- At this time, the City has not used any of the opioid funds received from the state.

Opioid Manufacturers Settlement Resolution

Approve or Deny a Resolution:

- Approving the settlement participation form to participate in the settlement of the State of Texas opioid litigation through the Texas Attorney General's Office with Alvogen, Amnel, Apotex, Hikma, Indivior, Mylan, Sun, and Zydus and authorizing the City Manager to execute all necessary documents in connection with the same
