RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BURLESON, TEXAS, FOR VARIANCES OF CHAPTER 63, SIGN REGULATIONS, TO ALLOW FOR A MONUMENT SIGN APPROXIMALY EIGHTEEN (18) FEET IN HEIGHT AND WRAPPED IN METAL AT 236 LOY STREET.

- **WHEREAS**, the City of Burleson, Texas ("City"), is a home rule city acting under its charter adopted by the electorate pursuant to Article XI, Section 5 of the Texas Constitution and Chapter 9 of the Local Government Code; and
- WHEREAS, Chapter 63, Sign Regulations, of the City of Burleson Code of Ordinances (2005) regulates the location, size, construction, erection, duration, use, and maintenance of signs within the jurisdiction of the City; and
- **WHEREAS,** on April 1, 2024, an application was submitted by Jimmy Purselley (owner) asking for sign variances to allow for the installation of a new monument sign that is taller than allowed and without the required masonry wrapping, and
- **WHEREAS,** on August 19, 2024, the City Council made an inquiry into the matter and reviewed all the relevant information at a duly called public meeting, and
- **WHEREAS**, the City Council finds and determines that special conditions exist that are peculiar to the land, structure or building involved and are not applicable to other lands, buildings or structures in the same vicinity; and
- **WHEREAS,** City Council finds and determines that the strict interpretation of Chapter 63 would deprive the applicant of rights commonly enjoyed by other properties in the vicinity under the terms of Chapter 63; and
- WHEREAS, City Council finds and determines that the special conditions and circumstances do not result from the actions of the applicant(s) and such conditions and circumstances do not merely constitute pecuniary hardship or inconveniences; and
- **WHEREAS,** City Council finds and determines that granting the variance will meet the objectives of the ordinance and not be injurious to the adjoining property owners or otherwise detrimental to the public welfare; and
- **WHEREAS,** City Council finds and determines that the request will be the minimum variance necessary to alleviate the special hardship or practical difficulties faced by the applicant in meeting the requirements of Chapter 63; and
- **WHEREAS,** City Council has determined that granting the variance will be in harmony with the spirit and purpose of Chapter 63; and
 - WHEREAS, the City Council finds and determines the conditions attached to the variance, if

any, are necessary to achieve the purpose of Chapter 63.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BURLESON, TEXAS, THAT:

Section 1.

City Council hereby grants a variance to one monument sign Section 63-54(c)(5) of Chapter 63, Sign Regulations, of the City of Burleson Code of Ordinances (2005) to allow the height of one monument sign to be a maximum of 18 feet for a single tenant sign constructed along a roadway. Where the average grade of the lot on which a sign is placed is at or above the adjacent street grade, the sign shall be measured from the grade level adjacent to the sign. Where the average grade of the lot is below the he adjacent street grade, the sign height shall be measured from the adjacent street grade.

City Council hereby grants a variance to the afore-referenced monument sign to Section 63-54(f) of Chapter 63, Sign Regulations, of the City of Burleson Code of Ordinances (2005) requiring monument signs must be wrapped in masonry materials to match or compliment building, exposed sign cabinets or poles are prohibited. The two variances are granted for the same monument sign and not applicable to any additional signs that may be erected on the site in the future.

Except as otherwise specified above, all other conditions, regulations, procedures, and rules of Chapter 63, Sign Regulations, of the City of Burleson Code of Ordinances (2005), as amended, shall apply to the sign at 236 Loy Street.
