

## Street Maintenance Update

## Background

- City Council reaffirmed street maintenance as a priority during the FY 24-25 Budget and established the Street Maintenance Fund (SMF)
- Staff began calibrating and verifying a plan to execute the funding and provided multiple updates
  - August 2024 Infrastructure & Development Committee
  - November 2024 City Council
  - February 2025 Infrastructure & Development Committee
  - April 2025 City Council (contract awards)
- Street rehabilitation funding

\$1,653,833 - SMF

\$700,000 – General Fund M&O

\$2,353,833 – Total


### Overview

City staff executed the street maintenance program highlighted by City Council during the FY 24-25 budget process.


Work concluded summarizing the following accomplishments:

- ✓ Pressure Pave
  - All 35 segments completed
  - 58,914 square yards
  - ≈ 3.3 miles
- ✓ Mill & Overlay
  - All 12 street segments completed
  - 28,240 square yards resurfaced
  - ≈ 4 miles
- √ Crack Seal
  - All 136 locations addressed
  - 46,010 linear feet sealed
  - ≈ 8.7 miles
- √ Concrete Street Repairs (eight segments on major thoroughfares)
- **5** Total value of work completed: Over **\$2.36 million**




Eight separate projects have been completed along our major thoroughfares and collectors totaling 1,011 square yards






PressurePave: NW Summercrest Blvd

PressurePave: Shady Oaks Dr: 35 street segments were completed totaling over 3.3 miles of improved surface.




#### Crack Sealing performed at 136 locations, addressing 46,010 linear feet

\* does not increase pavement condition scores but serves as a cost-effective preventive treatment minimizing water infiltration and slowing the rate of deterioration



## Mill & Overlay - Ozark



Mill & Overlay – Bryan Drive 12 streets were serviced totaling over 28,000 square yards.


## In Summary



This year's Street Maintenance Program successfully delivering improvements across numerous locations, fully utilizing allocated funding, and leveraging staff resources to maximize contracted services.

#### Looking ahead to FY26:

- Beginning the procurement process earlier in the year could allow for contracts to be awarded by the end of calendar year, creating more uniform project launch schedules and providing additional time to complete work prior to the end of the fiscal year
- Continuing collaboration and coordination with the Asset
   Management Program and Capital Engineering
