# Dispatch Console Infrastructure

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The Motorola dispatch console upgrade project supports the continued modernization and long-term resiliency of the City's public safety communications environment.

Dispatch consoles serve as the primary operational interface for Public Safety Communications personnel to manage emergency and non-emergency radio traffic between Police, Fire, EMS, and partner agencies.

These systems support dispatcher situational awareness, incident coordination, responder safety, and interoperability with surrounding jurisdictions, allowing Communications personnel to quickly coordinate mutual aid and maintain visibility into incidents that may impact the City.

# Existing Console Environment

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The City is currently operating on Motorola MCC 7500 dispatch consoles within the existing Police Department facility.

These consoles have reached end-of-life and are approaching the limits of manufacturer supportability.

As part of the new Police Department construction project, the long-term plan has been to transition Public Safety Communications operations into the new facility utilizing a modernized console platform aligned with the City's future operational and technology needs.

# Motorola AXS Platform Transition

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This project transitions the City from the legacy MCC 7500 platform to Motorola's newer Command Central AXS dispatch console platform while supporting the relocation and deployment of the consoles and supporting infrastructure into the new Police Department facility.

The AXS platform provides a modern and fully supported dispatch environment designed to improve operational efficiency, resiliency, maintainability, and long-term sustainability for the City's emergency communications operations.

# Procurement Strategy

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This procurement will be completed through the Texas Department of Information Resources (DIR) contract, ensuring competitive pricing and compliance with state procurement requirements.

The console one-time costs will be funded through the Police Department Construction budget. With the reoccurring costs coming from the BTX-IT Budget.

One Time - \$775,374

Maintenance Year 2-5 - \$232,695

# Cost Savings Opportunity

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During discussions with the City's new Motorola representative, BTX-IT identified a limited promotional opportunity providing approximately 25% cost savings on the dispatch console equipment.

- Systems Hardware and Equipment -\$559,767
- System Integration Services - \$472,972
- TX-DIR Discount - **\$81,364**
- Timing Incentive - **\$176,000**
- Total - \$775,375

Because replacement of the MCC 7500 platform was already planned as part of the new Police Department construction project, staff determined that advancing procurement now would provide the best overall financial value to the City.

# Long-Term Operational Sustainability

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The proposed Motorola Command Central AXS solution provides an estimated 20-year lifecycle and includes full Motorola support services and comprehensive training for all Public Safety Communications personnel.

The platform is designed to provide a resilient, fully supported, and future-ready communications environment that supports the City's long-term public safety operational needs within the new Police Department facility.

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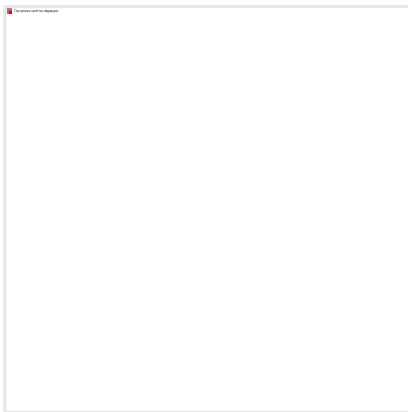

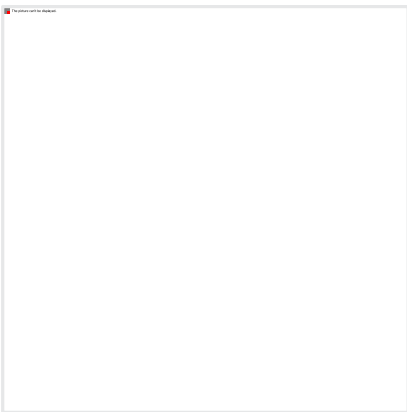

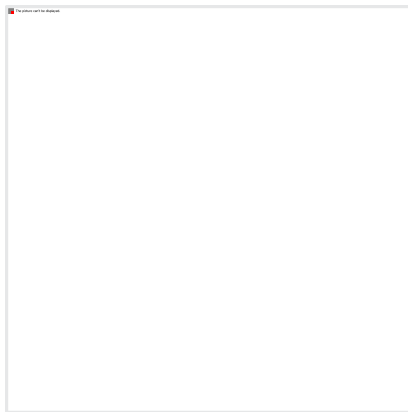
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Provides project funding prior to issuing the bonds not to exceed \$800,000

# Recommendation

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1. Approve an Ordinance amending the five-year Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) for Fiscal Year 2026-2030.
2. Approve a resolution declaring intention to reimburse an amount not to exceed \$800,000 for certain capital expenditures with proceeds from debt; and placing time restrictions on the issuance of tax-exempt obligations
3. Approve a contract with Motorola for the purchase of AXS Consoles, backend equipment migration, staff training, and five years of support for \$1,008,069.00
