

Background



- Staff provided updates on street maintenance needs and planning to the Infrastructure & Development Committee and City Council:
 - August 2024 Infrastructure and Development
 - November 2024 City Council
 - February 2025 Infrastructure and Development
- City Council established a dedicated Street Maintenance Fund in October 2024 as part of the Fiscal Year 2025 Budget that provided an additional \$1,623,878.

Street Maintenance Fund

October 2024 – January 2025

 Collaboration and field verification process of the asset management recommendations for specific street segments and treatments.

January 2025 – February 2025

- Advertised formal solicitation on January 24th. Staff held two pre bid meetings. 38 companies downloaded the contract documents, and six bids were received on February 27th.
 - Mill and Overlay
 - Stabilization
 - Asphalt Crack Seal
 - Concrete Joint Seal

PressurePave

PressurePave is an innovative, patented system designed to preserve pavements that might otherwise be slated for mill and overlay processes. This system uses a unique pressure-injection method to apply crack sealant into the pavement while simultaneously overlaying it with a durable thin asphalt layer.

PressurePave




City Council approved revisions March 3rd including increasing the City Manager's signature authority for contracts up to \$100,000. Crack sealing and concrete joint sealing contracts were both under this threshold and are underway.

Contract Recommendations

- <u>Donelson Construction</u>: is a sole-source provider of the patented PressurePave application. They have been in business since 1973 serving cities such as Irving, Cedar Park, San Angelo, Waxahachie, and Midlothian.
 - > \$628,203 contract recommended for PressurePave
- Anderson Asphalt and Concrete Paving: provided the most advantageous bids for the mill & overlay and stabilization portions of the solicitation. They have been in business for over 25 years serving cities such as Frisco, Forney, Seagoville, Keller, and Justin.
 - > \$978,905 contract recommended for 2" Mill & Overlay and stabilization

Schedules / Next Steps

- Administrative contracts are currently being scheduled, with work commencing as soon as possible.
- If Council approves this action, staff will immediately begin scheduling and coordinating with Donelson Construction and Anderson Asphalt to initiate the remaining phases of the project.
 - Project communication will be managed jointly by the contractor and Public Works staff through:
 - Door hangers
 - Outreach to HOAs (where applicable)
- Updates to the road construction map on the City's website
- All work associated with this project will be completed by the end of the fiscal year.
