CONSIDERATION ITEMS:

2.1) Discuss and Consider: Emergency Medical Services Interlocal Agreement between the City of Bertram and the City of Burnet

City Manager David Vaughn reported that he, along with several other City staff members, met with representatives from the City of Bertram to discuss the current interlocal agreement. The group reviewed the existing terms and costs for providing EMS services under the current agreement. It was noted that the terms of the existing EMS agreement have not kept pace with the actual cost of providing these services. Mr. Vaughn reported that while the agreement terminated in 2008, both parties have continued to operate as if it were in effect, and the agreement as written may automatically renew on October 1st unless a 90-day notice is provided to terminate it. Based on Council's direction, the City will proceed with terminating the agreement, with the goal of establishing a new agreement that more accurately reflects the cost of service. EMS services will continue without interruptions during negotiations for a new agreement.

2.2 Discuss and Consider: Façade and Signage Grant and the Business Continuity Code Grant

Assistant City Manager Keith McBurnett highlighted the Council's recently selected priorities, one of which is beautification. He noted that the proposed grant program aligns with that priority and would enable the City and the BEDC to provide financial assistance to local businesses. This assistance could support projects such as renovations of signage and facades, or the purchase of essential equipment. The program is still in its early stages, and many details remain to be discussed and finalized.
