Camas Hotel Loading Zone Request

Time Estimate: 10 minutes

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BACKGROUND: Camas Boutique Hotel building at 407 NE 4th Avenue was built in 1911. The hotel is the oldest commercial building in downtown Camas and does not have a designated parking lot for guests and visitors.

SUMMARY: The two parking spaces fronting the hotel on NE 4th Avenue are currently designated as 10-minute parking. The applicant, Prashant Gupta, is requesting these two spaces be designated as a loading zone.

This Request went to the Parking Advisory Committee on January 11, 2022. There was discussion regarding the potential benefits and differences between 10-minute parking spaces and a loading zone at this location. The Parking Advisory Committee has recommended to Council that these two 10-minute parking spaces be changed to a loading zone. The specifics regarding allowable use in a loading zone are attached to this agenda item for reference.
