
This table illustrates the cash flow of the General Fund.






Sales and Use Tax









American Rescue Plan Act Fund

The City has accepted \$6,816,235 of the Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds per the American Rescue Plan Actapproved by Congress in March.

The funds are distributed in two tranches – the first received on June 30 for \$3,408,118

The second to be distributed a year later for the same amount.

The City has four years – using the guidance from the US Treasury – to spend the funds.






Fund Composition of Investment Portfolio




Investment Portfolio Balance




Yield Curve - Interest Rates












... As House Prices Tear Ahead

CoreLogic single-family house prices, % change yr ago, Aug 21




