I'm genuinely excited to see the North Shore take shape. The growth and opportunity in this area were part of what drew me to Camas, and I look forward to being able to walk or bike up there as it develops. However, I'm concerned that the current proposal for the Village at North Shore Transportation Plan does not fully reflect the transportation and safety requirements outlined in the North Shore Design Standards.

Those standards were created with significant community input and clearly call for protected bike facilities, safe pedestrian crossings, and roadway designs that keep vehicle speeds appropriate. These elements are critical for residents moving between homes, schools, parks, and future commercial areas. Without them, everyday travel becomes more stressful and less safe. Given the City's commitment to resident safety and well-being, ensuring that new infrastructure supports all users should be a priority.

Because this project sets the foundation for the entire North Shore area, it is essential that the adopted standards guide decisions now. Painted bike lanes and narrow sidewalks along major corridors do not align with what the community supported and miss a rare chance to build safe streets from the start, rather than retrofitting later.

I respectfully ask that the City ensure the approved design standards are fully applied to this project, especially the protected bike and pedestrian elements that make the area safe, functional, and welcoming for everyone.
