Dear Robert Maul:

Thank you for contacting the Washington State Historic Preservation Officer and Department of Archaeology and Historic Preservation (DAHP), and for providing documentation regarding the above-referenced project. As a result of our review, our professional opinion is that the project area has the potential to contain archaeological resources. The project is in an area determined to be at "Very High" risk for containing archaeology according to the DAHP Archaeological Risk Assessment Model and is in proximity to fresh water sources, an environmental factor that can increase the risk of an inadvertent discovery. Given the scale of proposed ground disturbance, we recommend a professional archaeological survey to assess the additional tax parcel within the project area that has not yet been tested as part of previous predetermination survey efforts. We also recommend continued consultation with the concerned Tribes' cultural committees and staff regarding cultural resource issues.

These comments are based on the information available at the time of this review and on behalf of the State Historic Preservation Officer in conformance with Washington State law. Should additional information become available, our assessment may be revised.
