


Recommended Action

Approve Monterey Avenue Railing Public Art Project and authorize the City Manager to execute a Professional Services Agreement with artist Bruce Harman in the amount of \$50,000 for the Project.



BACKGROUND

- Art & Cultural Commission responsibility to administer the public art fund
- Commission designated a project for railing prior to March 2020 but delayed due to COVID-19
- Railing is 625 feet long with 2-inch diameter galvanized steel pipe
- Art installation will not alter railing but decorate the railing




BACKGROUND




- In March 2023, a Call to Artist was published and 5 submissions were received
- The Committee reviewed all submissions and invited 3 artist to present a concept
- December 2023, all artists submitted samples for site viewing and feedback
- June 2024, the commission selected the proposed concept provided by Bruce Harmon and recommends the project to City Council for approval








FISCAL IMPACT
