**RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CAPITOLA REPEALING
RESOLUTION NO. 4233.1 AND ADOPTING THE FISCAL YEAR 2025-26 BAIL
SCHEDULE**

WHEREAS, the Government Code of the State of California, Section 66018 requires local agencies to notice and hold at least one open and public meeting prior to levying a new fee or increasing an existing fee; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Capitola has held a duly noticed public hearing on June 26, 2025, to consider amending existing fines charged for various infractions of the Capitola Municipal Code; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Capitola adopted Resolution No. 4233.1 amending the City's Bail Schedule on July 21, 2021; and

WHEREAS, the City of Capitola determines the fines for violating the Capitola Municipal Code; and

WHEREAS, since 2021, the City Council has adopted various Ordinances that impose fines and revise existing fines for various infractions, and the City Council wishes to incorporate those fines into the City's Bail Schedule; and

WHEREAS, as noted in Exhibit A, some provisions of the City's Municipal Code describe certain infractions, but do not prescribe a specific fine. Those fines are listed in the Bail Schedule, attached as Exhibit A, and adopted with this Resolution; and

WHEREAS, the fees comply with Article XIII-C of the California Constitution because they are either (1) charges imposed for a specific benefit conferred or privilege granted directly to the payor that is not provided to those not charged; or (2) charges imposed for a specific government service or product provided directly to the payor that is not provided to those not charged, and which do not exceed the City's reasonable costs of providing the service or product; or (3) charges imposed for the reasonable regulatory costs to the City for issuing licenses and permits, performing investigations, inspections, and audits, and administrative enforcement and adjudication thereof; and

WHEREAS, the fees are set in amounts that are no more than necessary to cover the reasonable costs of the City's activities that are funded by the fees, and the amounts bear a fair and reasonable relationship to the payor's burdens on, or benefits received from, the City; and

WHEREAS, staff has conducted a thorough review of the City's Bail Schedule and has determined and recommends City Council approval of the proposed additions, deletions, and corrections presented to the City Council at its meeting on July 26, 2025.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Capitola:

1. Hereby finds, with respect to the fees listed in the Bail Schedule, that there is a reasonable relationship between the amount of the fee and the estimated reasonable cost of providing the type of service for which the fee is imposed; the allocation of the cost to each fee payor bears a fair and reasonable relationship to the fee payor's burdens on, and the benefits

received from, the City; and the fees do not exceed the reasonable cost of providing the service for which the fee is charged;

2. Hereby adopts and authorizes such Bail Schedule. Any fees and charges previously adopted by resolution and not being modified in Exhibit A are incorporated for ease of reference only and without modifying or amending such fees or the underlying approvals in any manner;

3. Hereby finds, with respect to each fine listed in the Bail Schedule, that the amount is consistent with the Eighth Amendment and similar to other agencies in the region.

4. Hereby approves the updated Bail Schedule, which will become effective July 1, 2025, except for fees imposed on a development project that apply to the filing, accepting, reviewing, approving, or issuing of an application, permit, or entitlement to use, which will become effective August 26, 2025, 60 days after the adoption of this resolution.

5. Hereby authorizes and directs the City Manager or their designee to take all actions necessary and proper to implement this resolution.
