Park Overview

Location: 1099 38th Avenue, Capitola

Size: 108-space mobile home park

Owner: Millennium Housing Corporation (non-profit)

Acquisition: July 2011

City Role: Supported acquisition using Redevelopment

Agency funds



2011 City Financial Support

Loan Amount: \$2 million total, repaid in 2021

\$1M for acquisition

\$1M over 10 years for rehabilitation and rent subsidies

Total Affordable Units: 85 of 108

Active Rehabilitation Loans: 2 at \$112,000



Rent Controls

Initial rent caps (2011):

\$650 for owner-occupants

\$800 for non-owner occupants

Annual increases: Limited to Consumer Price Index (CPI)



Coastal Rail Trail Context

Adjacent Project: RTC Coastal Rail Trail – Segment 10

RTC Action: Conducted encroachment review

May 2024: RTC published Mobile Home Encroachment Options

Encroachment Coordination

March 2025: City facilitated meeting between Millennium & RTC

April 2025: Letter from CM to RTC and Millenium with proposed path forward

- Tolling Agreement: Pauses statute of limitations for legal claims and allows time for negotiation without litigation pressure
- Extend Deadline: Extend the deadline for the removal of encroachments
- Castle Mobile Home Estates Assistance Program
- Survey Coordination and Site Access

May 23, 2025: RTC provided proposed tolling agreement to Millennium
