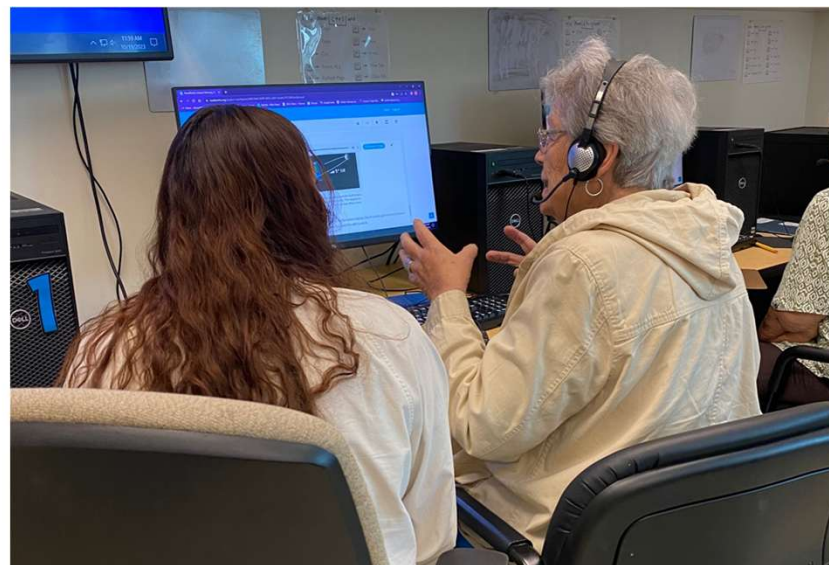


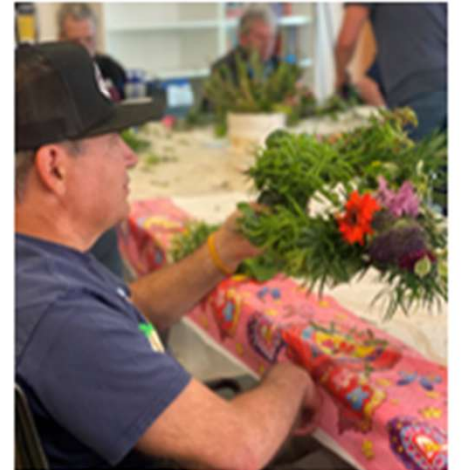

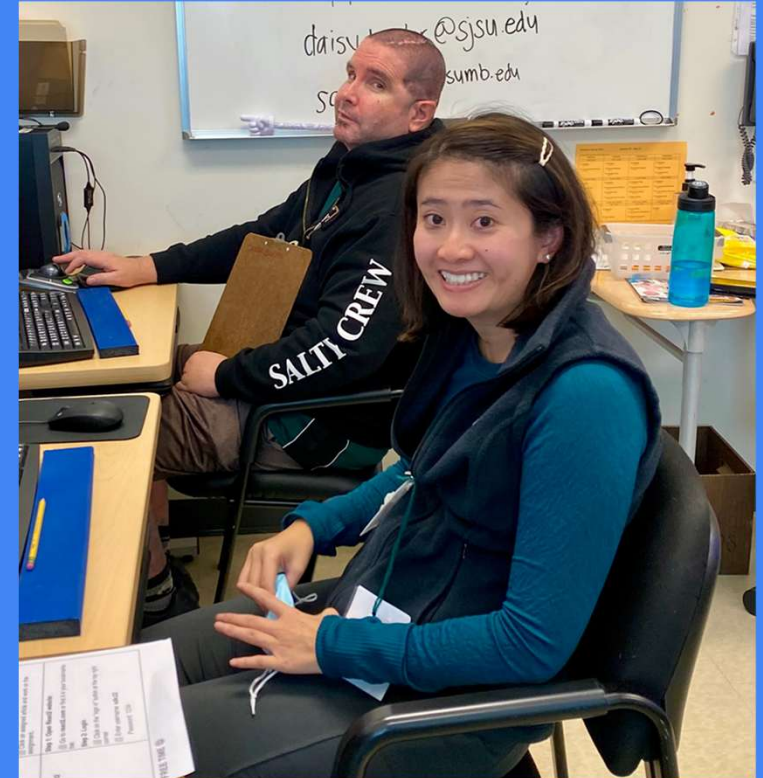

- ❑ 1 student in supported living, remainder at home with family caregivers



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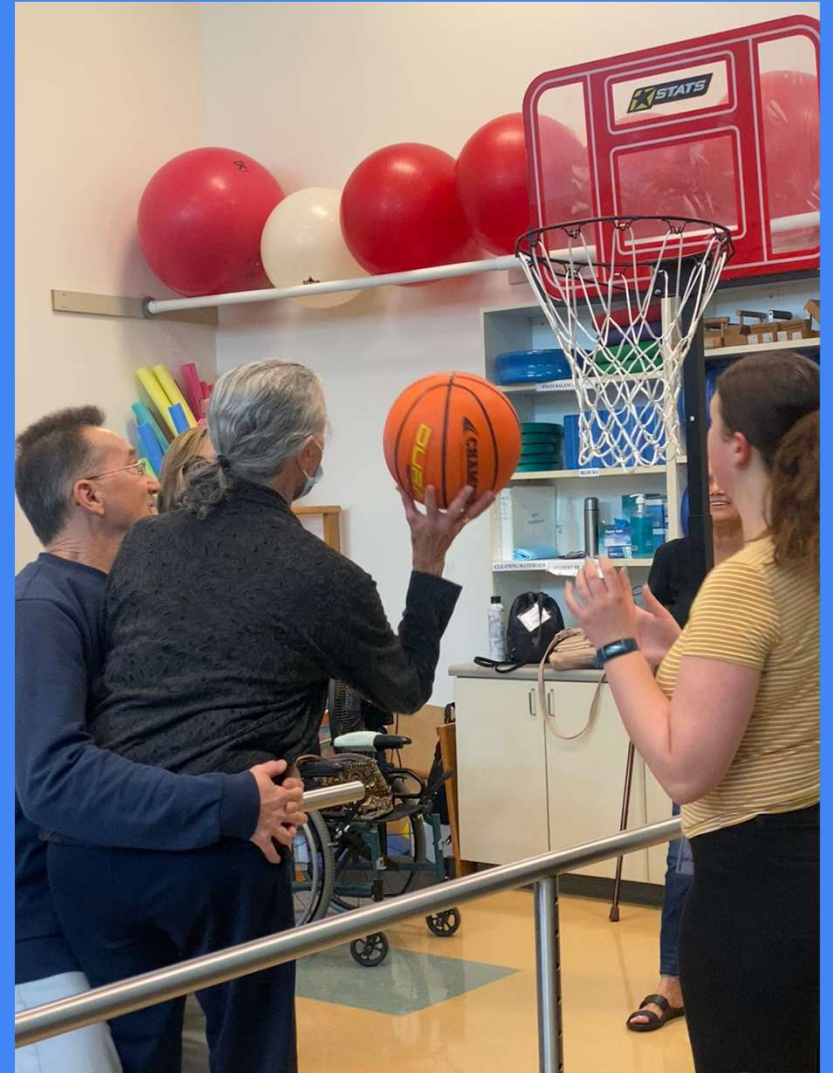
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- ❑ 2 low income receiving scholarship support

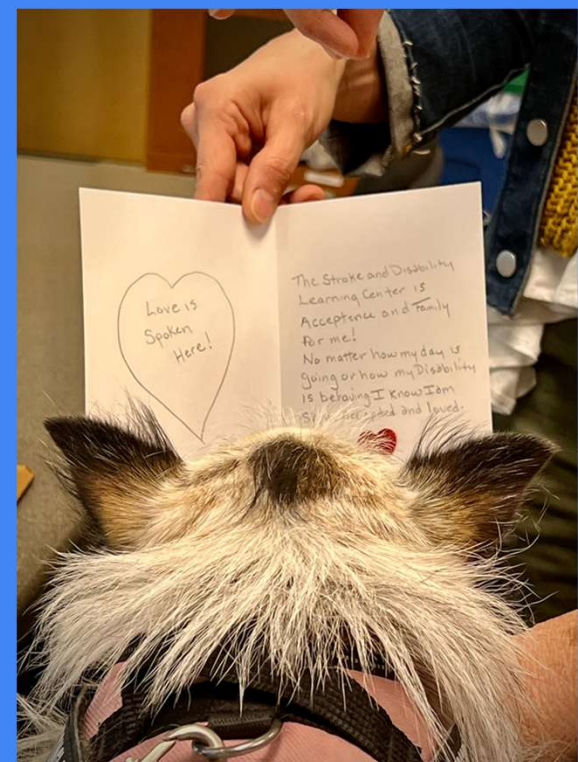

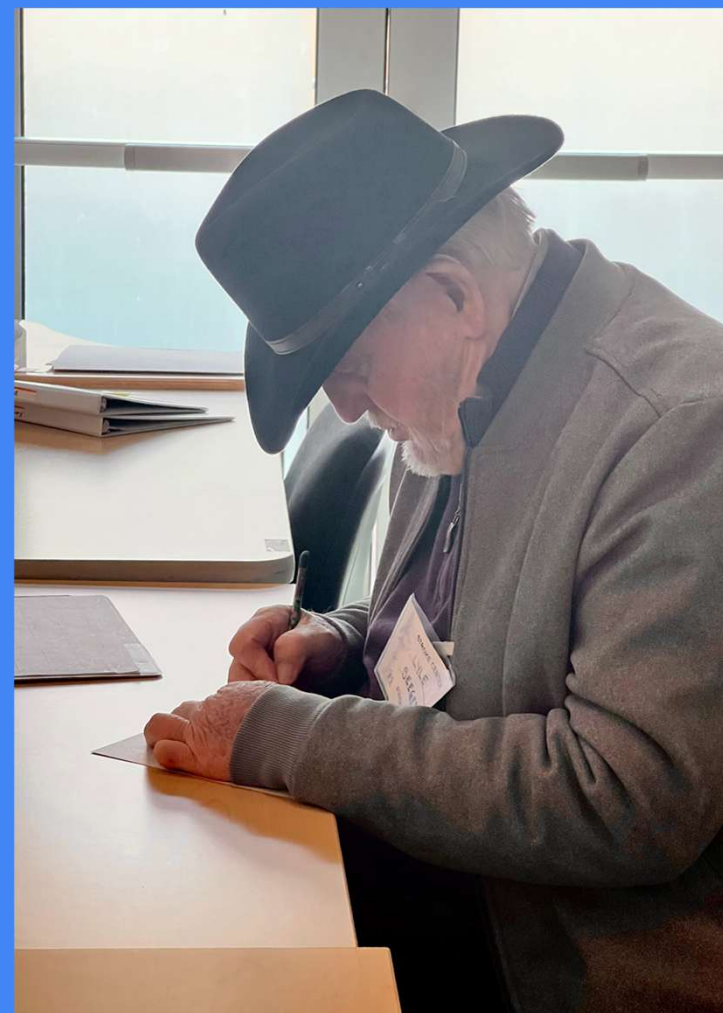

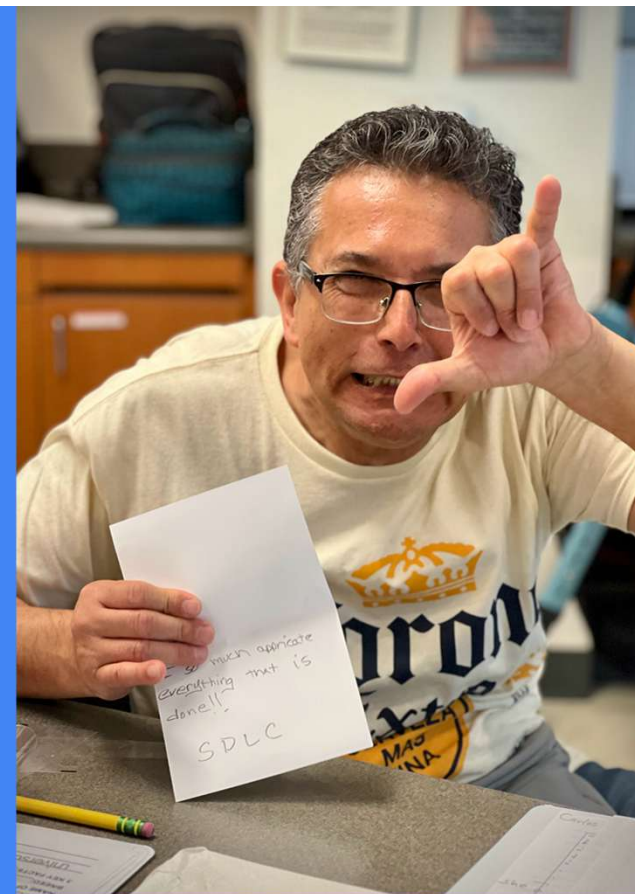
