Mike Chappell Park Restroom Replacement





- Only two flush toilets in the park currently.
- Current restroom building donated in 1985 and does not meet the needs of park users.
- If approved, all portable toilets will be removed.
- Design will have multiple toilets for men and women plus meeting/event space that can be reserved.



Requested infrastructure (design is only an idea)



- Applied for matching LWCF Grant for new playground at Lake Park
 - Funds are available but still waiting on final decision from NPS.
 - Requested funding (\$450k) through Economic
 Development Initiative to fund new restroom, playground, and picnic shelter.
- The playground was one of the most requested amenities from the Lake Park master plan process.



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Big Idea

Develop a joint community center, senior center, aquatics facility at the current community center location





Big Idea

Working out a lease agreement with Sunny Point to extend Mike Chappell Park – play space, ball fields, etc. are in short supply

Improve our existing amenities: e.g. restrooms and community space
