OUR APPROACH

Casco is a small town that offers a rural lifestyle near the regional service centers of Windham and Bridgton. As part of the greater Lakes Region, much of Casco's economy relies on lake-related tourism. Our team's experience in this area - including the Windham Open Space Plan & related park planning, and the Raymond and Standish Comprehensive Plans, as well as our knowledge of best practices for open space planning regionally, prepare us to meet Casco's unique needs and create an Open Space plan that works for town staff and volunteers.

Conservation & Access - The first Big Idea from the Comprehensive plan is to protect Casco's wealth of forested lands, waters, and scenic natural landscapes. These natural resources make Casco a special place to live and visit, and support a tourism-based economy of summer camps and resorts. Conservation is important to Casco, with vast areas of the town enrolled in the tree growth tax program, largely stewarded by two major landowners. However, because most natural resources are privately owned, there is limited and informal public access. Our work will analyze opportunities to increase collaboration between private landowners and land trusts, balancing the need for conservation of resources with the desire for recreation and access.

Identifying Opportunities & Connectivity - Casco grew up as a town of villages, which were highlighted as revitalization opportunities in the comprehensive plan. Recreation can be a key part of economic development and identity for these villages. Two of the deliverables for this project will be an opportunities/linkages map and a mini master plan of an opportunity area. These designs will identify potential trail connections with a focus on connecting open space to Casco's villages, new opportunities for open space and recreation, and priority parcels for collaboration with private landowners. AKLA's mini master plan will sketch opportunities for recreation, wayfinding, and multigenerational programming at a specific site.

Building Resilience - Resilience and sustainability are key values identified in the Casco Comprehensive Plan. Our open space plan will prioritize these values by incorporating Maine state climate data into our mapping and analysis, looking at conservation priorities through the lens of natural resource resilience and water quality, and incorporating challenges exacerbated by climate impacts, like invasive species, into our recommendations.



Implementable Plans - We're proud of the way our long-range plans have provided seamless transitions to implementation for municipal staff. The Windham Open Space Plan, a collaboration between NSP and AKLA, identified priority conservation areas with a vision for design. The plan was used to secure funding to acquire a high-priority parcel less than one year after the plan was adopted by the Town Council. AKLA's mini master plan design for the multi-use property has been implemented, and the East Windham Conservation Area opened to the public in 2024.

Community Engagement - Meaningful community engagement is key to the consensus-based approach on which all our plans are based. NSP is a leader in creating inclusive engagement through a combination of in-person and digital opportunities, with a flexible approach that adapts to results as the project develops. We collaborate with municipal staff and volunteers, working with stakeholders to gain targeted feedback while also using a ground-up approach through pop-ups, digital and traditional marketing, and community events to hear from as many voices as possible.











SCOPE OF WORK

The scope of work that follows is an example of the process our planning team recommends based on the RFP and project timeline. This scope is intended to be illustrative of a typical process; a more detailed scope will be developed as part of the contracting stage if the NSP/AKLA team is selected for this project.

Task 1: Project Meetings

Close coordination with Casco staff will keep us on track through this planning project. The project begins with a kick-off meeting with Casco staff and a site visit to learn more about Casco, discuss and refine our approach, and to better understand the scale and inventory of open spaces, parks, trails, and other town-owned facilities, and village locations. Various members of our team will meet monthly as needed, and your NSP project manager will coordinate directly with staff and hold monthly check-in meetings. Towards the end of the project, we'll hold meetings with the Open Space Commission and Select Board to review the draft plan and recommendations.

Task 2: Existing Plans & Conditions

NSP will complete a review of existing plans and reports, as well as regional and state initiatives. NSP and AKLA will collaborate on gathering data on existing conditions, facilities, and assets, including geospatial data, town data, and climate data. NSP will create a basemap in ArcGIS. The background information and geospatial data collected in this phase will form the foundation of our plan and recommendations. The GIS data will be packaged and shared with Casco at the conclusion of the project.

Task 3: Public Participation

NSP and AKLA will develop a public participation plan at the start of the project to be reviewed by Casco staff. We propose pop-ups at Casco Days as the major community touchpoint, where the project team and municipal staff can table to share the project with the public and solicit input on maps and open-ended questions. Building our public engagement into this well-attended event will ensure that a wide range of the Casco community is reached, including residents and summer visitors. Additional opportunities to reach the public in person and online will be discussed as part of the participation plan development. We'll summarize the input from the public to inform our plan drafting.

Using the results of the public participation with the data collected in the previous task and regional context, we'll create a comprehensive needs assessment that identifies priority open spaces for conservation, potential new trails and connections to existing bike/ped infrastructure and villages, and community recreation needs. AKLA will create a map of open spaces, recreational trails, wildlife corridors, villages, and linkage opportunities, as well as a "mini master plan" that visualizes improvements for one key site, including open space or trails, wayfinding, and programming opportunities. NSP and AKLA will also create an implementation guide with a priorities matrix that considers the identified needs alongside public feedback on priorities. The matrix will prioritize the strategies and provide phasing options based on efficiency, potential to incorporate strategies alongside other initiatives, and funding sources.

NSP and AKLA will compile all materials and products including narrative, maps, designs, graphics, recommendations, and the implementation plan into a visually engaging first draft report, presented to the Open Space Commission and Select Board at meetings and available for public review online, followed by a final report that incorporates feedback and edits.

The town of Windham has a history of working lands and outdoor recreation that have made rural character essential to the town's identity. These assets, like many in the communities of southern Maine, have seen incredible pressure due to significant growth and development in recent years.

The Windham Open Space Master Plan, the town's first, called for better protections of wildlife corridors, streams and rivers, while also identifying geographic areas that did not have direct connections to open space or recreational facilities. The plan identified the need to multiply the value of these assets (identified as an 'activity area') with trails between local and regional destinations, like the Sebago to the Sea Trail. The town's acquisition of a 700-acre parcel, adjacent to Lowell Preserve, is one direct result of this plan. AKLA developed the Master Plan for this parcel, and it was opened in 2024.



The town of Yarmouth has an extensive trail network and park system, and vast coastal resources. Popularity and population growth has put pressure on these assets, and the Open Space Plan identified ways to mitigate increased use.

Developed in collaboration with Town departments, the Royal River Conservation Trust, and local volunteers, the Yarmouth Open Space Plan focused on three goals: maintain and enhance town-owned properties; prioritize new acquisitions of valued open space; and update town ordinances and policies to include an open space acquisition policy and protect park and conservation lands in perpetuity.

Recommendations also called for regional coordination and partnerships with nonprofits and neighboring communities to create a network of regional open space assets, and sharing the resources to manage and steward.

Raymond is a small town known for its lakes, forests, and scenic landscapes. North Star Planning was contracted to lead this comprehensive plan update, completing all state-required elements and helping the Comprehensive Plan Committee tackle local challenges. 
