PURPOSE OF REPORT:
WHAT IS BEING ASKED OF THE CITY COUNCIL:
The City Council is being asked to consider a request from a property owner to annex approximately 300 acres into the City.
BACKGROUND/ DISCUSSION: The owners of approximately 300 acres, contiguous to the northeastern boundary of the City, are looking to develop their property. For several years they have been working with the County of Lake in developing the property, which was a former hops farm, into a cannbis operation. This project is no longer viable and they are analyzing various other uses for the property. Uses under consideration could include cannabis as well as industrial or residential uses. The same owners have worked with the City on a few other projects within the City limits and at this point would prefer to work with the City on the development of the 2050 and 2122 Ogulin Canyon properties as well. They have submitted a formal request (attached) for the City to consider annexing the two parcels into the City limits. This would require an application through the Lake Local Area Formation Commission (LAFCO), by either the City or the property owner.
