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Executive Summary

Coachella Futbol Association (CFA)

More than a game, built by community, played with heart.

Coachella Futbol Association (CFA) is a recreational soccer league located in Coachella, California offering both youth and adult soccer leagues. CFA is dedicated to creating an inclusive and welcoming environment for soccer players of all skill levels, primarily serving families and community members who seek organized soccer activities. Focusing on fostering participation, skill development, and family engagement to provide a positive and supportive soccer experience within the local community. CFA will be providing a high level of play recreational league (per current leagues) as well as a youth beginners recreational league (not currently offered) to allow for all levels of participation without expectations or limitations to players just starting with the sport of soccer. CFA will provide the opportunity for existing club teams (CYSA and CVSL) to continue playing under Cal South and Coast Soccer League.

What is reason for doing this?

The Coachella Valley is an untapped region full of passionate youth and adult players. CFA is looking to develop a path for kids to follow both on and off the field that will carry them into becoming great members of society.

What CFA has to offer?

CFA is looking to offer a well organized league with structure and development at the forefront of what we do. The registration process will be consistent and fair, with assistance available for individuals or their parents/guardians who are unable to utilize the established platforms to submit their registration and other required submissions. Schedules will be provided at the beginning of the season enabling individuals and families the ability to plan ahead, understanding soccer is only one element of their busy schedules.

Currently, Coachella has an exceptional advanced level league with high quality players. Unfortunately, this does not provide much opportunity to kids who are just learning and want to try it out, or for parents who just want to keep their kids active and learn how to be a part of a team without the end goal of playing at an advanced level. This is the driving factor for offering a beginners recreational league, open to all players, with a neutral selection process, providing players a chance to grow and develop.



CFA will make a concerted effort to build a strong girls soccer program within the league, recruiting and supporting them as they grow and develop within the sport.

CFA will offer soccer clinics and camps to both beginners and youth trying to advance to the next level.

Understanding that soccer is only a part of what helps our youth become successful as they grow into adulthood, CFA will also offer career days. With local business and trades in attendance to provide information on what it looks like in their professions. Additionally, CFA plans to take youth into universities and experience a soccer game as well as a potential campus tour. These efforts are to provide the opportunity to these youth, who may not have avenue to expose them to different career paths and expand their mindset regarding their potential past their immediate surroundings. This is to plant a seed into our kids minds that there is more out in the world than just our East Valley and having to work right after graduating high school.

Every year at the beginning of Fall Season, CFA will offer an educational NCAA eligibility course that will help players and families who want to pursue playing soccer in college understand what is required. The goal is for youth, beginning at an early age, to understand what college coaches are looking for and what they expect academically from players. This course will be led by the president of CFA and Junior College Head coach, and a University coach who will provide insight and answer questions. Reality is that being a great soccer player is not enough. College programs are looking for kids with a good academic record, are great soccer players, and even better kids citizens.

CFA will also provide at least one college ID camp, bringing in college coaches from all levels to observe and evaluate CFA players. This will provide a chance for CFA youth players to be seen and, hopefully, an opportunity to play at the college level.

For those who are exceptional players and elect not to play at the college level but want to continue playing at an advanced level, CFA, through established connections, will facilitate the opportunity to have these players seen by and possibly play for current local semi-pro teams.

CFA would appreciate the opportunity to serve everyone in the community, from the beginner that is playing soccer as a hobby and fun to the individual who wants to play collegiately, semi-pro or someday even at the professional level.

This may seem like a lot to provide and a fear that the cost of providing these services may outprice the ability of the target cost increasing for the community. CFA is committed to establishing fundraising events and pursuing grant opportunities to make CFA a reality and maintain affordability for the community's hard-working families.

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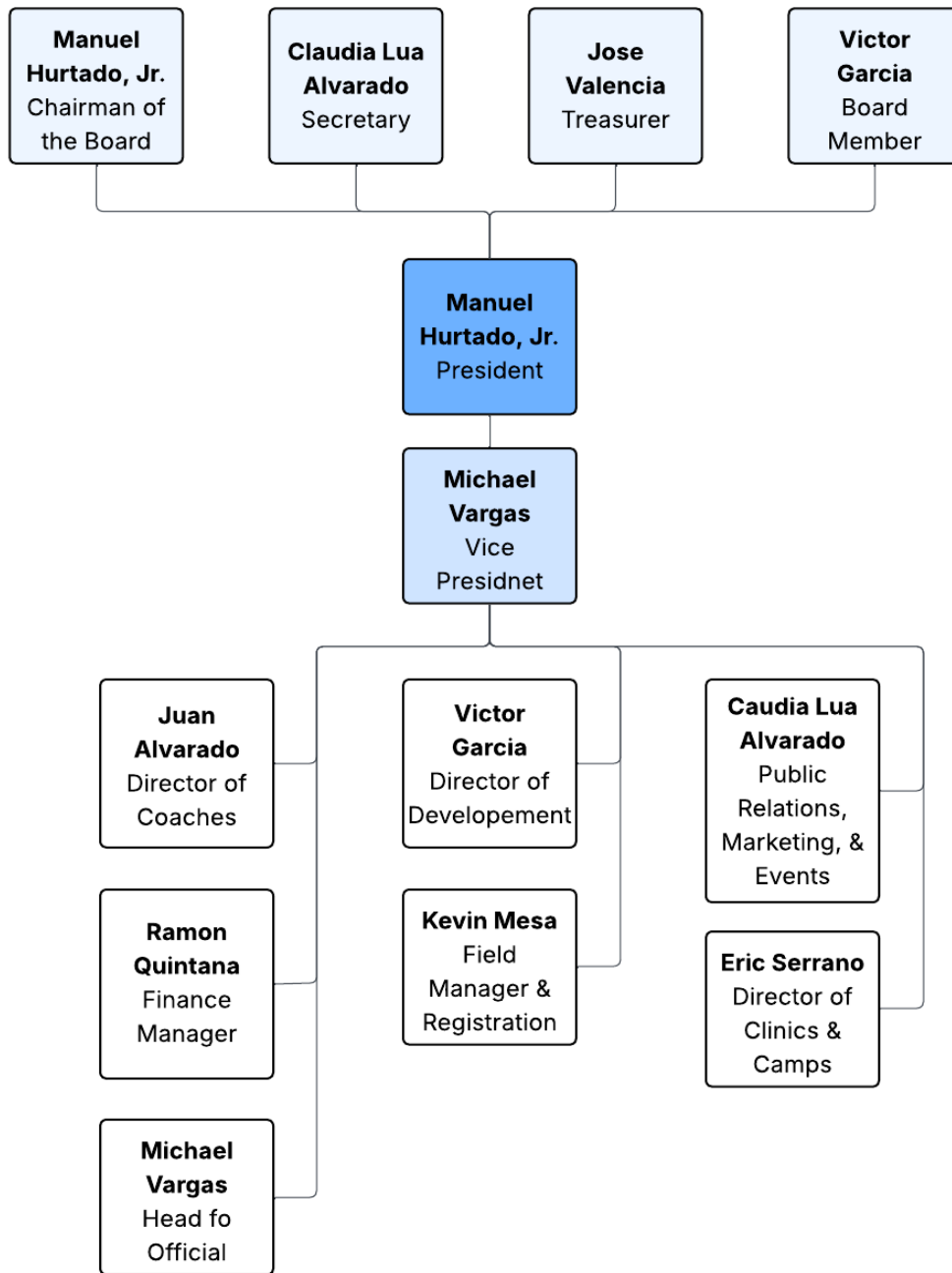

II. League Format and Season Overview (Adult and Youth)

A. Scheduling

a. Adult League

- i. League Teams - 89 teams based on CYSA existing league registration levels
- ii. Practices - none
- iii. Game days - One regular season game per week not including playoffs. Games for each division will be held on the same day each week. For example, women's adult league games will be held on Thursdays.
 1. Fall Season - 8 Games
 2. Spring Season - 8 Games
 3. Summer Season - 6 Games
- iv. Tournaments/playoffs -
 1. One playoff per season for Fall and Spring. No playoffs in summer season.
 2. Playoffs will last for two to three weeks depending on the number of teams in each division. The number of teams per division will depend on registration levels.
- v. Clinics and ID Camps - none

b. Youth Recreational League

- i. Teams - 24 teams. Estimated registration levels. This is a new offering that does not currently exist and is expected to grow over time. Additionally, girls teams do not currently exist, this will be promoted and the quantity will increase over time.
- ii. Seasons - Currently planning on offering the Youth Recreational League all three seasons, however, will re-evaluate based off of registration rates and feedback from participants in the recreational league whether to scale back to one or two seasons.
- iii. Practices - Teams are encouraged to practice at least one time per week at their own discretion and scheduling. Community days are available for teams to practice using City fields.
- iv. Game days - one game per week held on the same day each week for each division. For example, the 2012 division will have their games every Tuesday evening.
 1. Fall Season - 7 Games
 2. Spring Season - 7 Games
 3. Summer Season - 5 Games
- v. Tournaments/playoffs -
 1. One playoff per season for Fall and Spring. No playoffs in summer season.



2. Playoffs will last for two to three weeks depending on the number of teams in each division. The number of teams per division will depend on registration levels.
 - vi. Clinics - a minimum of two developmental clinics per year in the months of February and June.
 - vii. ID Camps - One to two ID Camps will be hosted annually for female and male youth ages 16 and up.
- c. Youth Highly Competitive League
- i. Teams - 111 teams based on CYSA existing league registration levels
 - ii. Practices - Teams are encouraged to practice at least one time per week at their own discretion and scheduling. Community days are available for teams to practice using City fields.
 - iii. Game days - one game per week held on the same day each week for each division. For example, the 2012 division will have their games every Tuesday evening.
 1. Fall Season - 8 Games
 2. Spring Season - 8 Games
 3. Summer Season - 6 Games
 - iv. Tournaments/playoffs -
 1. One playoff per season for Fall and Spring. No playoffs in summer season.
 2. Playoffs will last for two to three weeks depending on the number of teams in each division. The number of teams per division will depend on registration levels.
 - v. Clinics - a minimum of two developmental clinics per year in the months of February and June.
 - vi. ID Camps - One to two ID Camps will be hosted annually for female and male youth ages 16 and up.

B. Team Formation

- a. Youth Recreational Team Formation
 - i. Evaluations -
 1. A one-day evaluation will be held, open to all kids wanting to learn and play soccer.
 2. Several evaluation stations where coaches will evaluate skill levels and provide a score for each player.
 3. Players will be drafted into teams by a committee under the guidance of the league.
 4. Teams will be created utilizing the evaluation scoring for each player to create balance skill level teams.



5. If evaluated players are determined to possess advanced skill level, they will not qualify for the youth recreational league and will not be placed on a youth recreation league team. However, the League will place them on a team in the Highly Competitive Youth League.
 - ii. Age Group/Divisions - all age groups will have both boys and girls teams. Two ages are combined to provide an opportunity to supply fields for the teams and provide additional development. Initially, since there are no girls teams in existence, depending on registration levels, girls teams may be comprised of three years (i.e. 5/6/7 and 8/9/10) to create enough teams to compete against each other in the division. As girl registrations increase, girls teams will be as outlined below.
 1. 5/6 - Boys & Girls
 2. 7/8 - Boys & Girls
 3. 9/10 - Boys & Girls
 4. 11/12 - Boys & Girls
- b. Youth Highly Competitive League
- i. There are existing teams playing in the Coachella leagues. These teams compete at a very high level and the teams are formed through individual recruiting processes. These teams will be kept as is due to their competitive level.
 - ii. Age Group/Division - Each age group will have its own division from 6–18 year olds.
 - iii. There are also approximately 12-16 club teams that are currently playing through the existing leagues here in Coachella (CVSL & CYSA) and also play in the Cal South Coast Soccer League. We understand that these club teams are currently registered under the current league names (i.e. CYSA Xolos and CVSL PSG). We will honor those Club teams to remain playing under those names and host those scheduled home games they are required. This will continue to give local kids who want to play at an even higher level a chance to play against kids across Southern California and potentially Nationally and Internationally.
- c. Adult League
- i. The Adult League teams are formed individually and the League has no part in the formation of these teams as is the current practice of these divisions.
 - ii. Age Groups/Divisions:
 1. Men's Primera (Division 1, 14+)
 2. Men's Segunda (Division 2, 14+)
 3. Men's Veteranos (35+)



- 4. Men’s Veteranos 1975 (50+)
- 5. Women’s Libre (14+)
- 6. Women’s 25+

C. Ages served by the league

- a. Youth Recreational League - Ages 5-18 years
- b. Youth Highly Competitive League - Ages 6-18
- c. Adult League - Ages 14+

D. Registration and season dates

- a. The registration window will begin four to five (4-5) weeks prior to the start of season depending on the league
- b. Template Registration Timeline
 - i. Adult League and Youth Highly Competitive League Team Registration
 - 1. Registration begins: 4-weeks prior to the start of season
 - 2. Registration closes: Closes on the first pre-season friendly match according to the division within the league.
 - 3. Season start date: September 23, 2025
 - ii. Youth Recreation League Player Registration
 - 1. Registration begins: 5-weeks prior to the start of season
 - 2. Registration closes: The evaluation date is the last date to register.
 - 3. Evaluation date: 3-weeks prior to the start of season
 - 4. Players notified of team placement: One-week prior to the start of season.
 - 5. Season start date: One week after Adult and Youth Highly Competitive League begin

E. Registration methods

- a. Online registration - Sports Connect online registration platform for team and individual participants
- b. Walk-in registration - Walk-in registration will be available on designated registration days held at the field. Registration assistance will be available in-person. The goal is to have registration and payment done on-line but it is understood that this may take some time to get everyone accustomed to this new process.
- c. Payment methods - Our goal is to move all payments on-line to eliminate cash payments both for safety and fraudulent reasons. We understand that this will take time as this will be new to existing parents/player
 - i. Debit/Credit - Payments will be accepted on-line with registration (Debit or Credit).
 - ii. Cash - Cash will be accepted on in-person registration days. Receipts will be provided for all cash transactions to ensure all funds are accounted for. Please see D for details.



F. Grievance Process/Policy

CFA Grievance Policy

Purpose:

To provide a structured process for players, parents, or coaches to address complaints or disputes within a youth soccer league, ensuring fair and timely resolution.

General Guidelines:

24-Hour Rule: Wait 24 hours after an incident before filing a grievance to allow for a cooling-off period.

Informal Resolution First: Attempt to resolve the issue directly with the involved parties (e.g., coach, team official) through a calm, face-to-face discussion.

No Retaliation: Leagues prohibit retaliation or discrimination against anyone filing a grievance in good faith.

Formal Grievance Process

1. Submission:

- Submit a written grievance within 7-8 days of the incident (timeline may vary by league).
- Use the league's official grievance form, available on their website or from the league office.
- Include:
 - Full names and contact information of all parties involved.
 - Detailed description of the incident, with specific factual allegations.
 - Supporting evidence (e.g., documents, witness statements).
 - Desired resolution or relief.
 - Submit to the league's Grievance Director or designated official via email, certified mail, or hand delivery.



2. Review:

- The Grievance Director reviews the submission for completeness and applicability.
- Incomplete forms may be returned with a request for additional information.
- The subject of the grievance is notified and given 5 days to respond in writing.

3. Investigation:

- The Grievance Director conducts an investigation, which may include interviews or document review.
- The grievance is forwarded to a Grievance Committee, typically composed of neutral league officials or board members.

4. Decision:

- The committee may rule based on documents or hold a hearing at their discretion.
- Parties are notified of the decision in writing.
- The committee's decision is final unless an appeal process is available.

5. Appeal (if applicable):

- File an appeal within 14 days of the decision, often requiring a fee
- Submit an appeal form to the league's Board of Directors.
- No new evidence is typically allowed unless materially changed circumstances exist.
- The Board reviews all documents and issues a final ruling.

IV. Coaches and Referees

A. Background Checks

- a. All coaches, referees and any other person acting in an official capacity will be required to take a statewide criminal background check each year that they participate.
 - i. Location: Desert Live Scan, Palm Desert
 - ii. Live Scan will be paid by the League.

B. Certifications

At CFA both coaches and referees will be certified for the age group that they are serving by a Grassroots license certified by United States Soccer, and CFA will have a coaching certification that will be provided and ran by US Certified Soccer Coaches.

C. Trainings

Recruiting and training for both coaches and referees as a priority for this league. This will be done by connecting with the local community as well as connecting with local high schools and our junior college for potential existing players wanting to get involved.



V. Rules governing league and tournament play

FIFA rules will apply if not modified within

Some rules qualify for specific or all league play styles. Attention to details of league style rules.

Teams will be placed into divisions based upon year born. Teams that span more than one age group will be placed into the division of the oldest player on the team. The tournament administration will make every effort to place teams into divisions with similar skilled players.

Game play Rules:

For 3v3, Number of Players: The maximum number of players on a team is 7; three field players and substitutes (A team must have a minimum of 2 field players). Players may only play on (one) team per division. There are no goalkeepers in 3v3. Coed teams must have a minimum of one female player on the field at all times; this only applies to adult teams.

For 5v5, Number of Players: The maximum number of players on a team is 10; 4 field players, one goalkeeper and substitutes (A team must have a minimum of 3 field players). Players may only play on (one) team per division. Coed teams must have a minimum of two female player on the field at all times; this only applies to adult teams.

For 7v7, Number of Players: The maximum number of players on a team is 14; 6 field players, one goalkeeper and substitutes (A team must have a minimum of 4 field players). Players may only play on (one) team per division. Coed teams must have a minimum of three female players on the field at all times; this only applies to adult teams.

For 9v9, Number of Players: The maximum number of players on a team is 18; 8 field players, one goalkeeper and substitutes (A team must have a minimum of 5 players). Players may only play on (one) team per division.

For 11v11, Number of Players: The maximum number of players on a team is 22; 10 field players, one goalkeeper and substitutes (A team must have a minimum of 6 field players). Players may only play on (one) team per division.



3v3,5v5, & 7v7: No Slide Tackling: There is absolutely no slide tackling. Players must stay upright and "on their feet" and may not make contact with an opposing player.

Goal Scoring: A goal may only be scored from a touch (offensive or defensive) within a team's offensive half of the field (Ball must be completely on the offensive half of the field: No full court shots. Ball must be in the attacking half). If a player in their defensive end kicks the ball across midline and the ball hits another player (offensive or defensive) and the ball goes in the goal, a goal will be awarded.

Goal Kicks: May be taken from any point on the goal line. All Goal Kicks are indirect kicks.

3v3, 5v5 & 7v7- Goal kicks cannot travel more than half field in the air. If goal kick travels further than half field, a dead ball will be granted to the opposing team at the point the ball crossed half field.

Opening Possession: The Home team will determine possession before the start of the game. The away team will determine the direction.

Game Duration: There are no timeouts during small sided games. The time of the first half may be reduced if a team is not ready at game time. Game lengths may be subject to change during playoff or tournament play. Games tied after regulation play shall end in a tie, except in the playoffs. A team, at the discretion of the referee, will forfeit at game time if they are not present.

3v3 Games consist of two 12-minute halves separated by a two minute halftime period OR the first team to reach 12 goals, whichever comes first.

5v5 Games consist of two 15 minute halves separated by a two minute halftime period OR the first team to reach 12 goals, whichever comes first.

7v7 Games consist of two 20 minute halves separated by a two minute halftime period OR the first team to reach 12 goals, whichever comes first.



9v9 Games consist of two 30 minute halves separated by a two minute halftime period OR the first team to reach 12 goals, whichever comes first.

11v11 Games consist of two 35 minute halves separated by a two minute halftime period OR the first team to reach 12 goals, whichever comes first.

Playoff Rules: During playoffs, if regular time ends in a tie. It moves into an "Overtime" period. Overtime consists of a "golden goal" period with the team leading prior to the tie, deciding kickoff/direction. The first team to score in overtime is the winner. If no team has scored in the 3 minute overtime, the winner shall be decided by a shootout. The three players from each team that are remaining on the field at the end of the overtime period, will enter a rotation of penalty kicks alternating teams with each kick, with the higher scoring team winning after the first round. If the score remains tied after the first round of penalty kicks, a sudden death penalty kick format until one team scores unanswered. If one team has received a red card during the game, a remaining roster player (other than the red carded player) may be chosen to kick in the rotation of penalty kicks. If the red carded player is the last remaining roster player, one of the two field players may kick twice.

Penalty Kicks: Shall be awarded if, in the referee's opinion, a scoring opportunity was nullified by an infraction (the infraction does not automatically result in a red card). Penalty kicks are direct kicks taken from a centered designated spot outside the box. Except for the kicker and opposing goalie, all players must be outside the penalty box and at least 10 yards from the penalty mark until the ball is kicked. The ball must roll forward. Once the kicker starts their approach toward the ball, they may not interrupt their movement. Once the kicker plays the ball, they cannot play the ball again until the ball is touched or played by a player from either team, including the goalkeeper. The goal keeper must have both feet in contact with the goal line or the goal line's vertical plane until the ball is kicked. Goalkeeper may move laterally. Goalkeepers may use their hands on penalty kicks. Both the kicker and goal keeper must be on the field at the time of infraction. A penalty kick may be awarded even if time has expired.

3v3 a direct kick taken from the center of the midfield line with all players behind the midfield line and the player taking the kick.



5v5 & 7v7: MLS pks: Penalty taker gets a running start, 1v1 vs the goalkeeper. The ball must roll forward. Once the kicker starts their dribble toward the goal, they may not stop their forward movement.

9v9, 7v7, 11v11: A direct kick taken from a spot inside the 18 yard box with all players behind the 18 yard line and the half moon.

Offside: A player is in an offside position when nearer to the opponent's goal line than the ball (unless in their defensive half of the field or has at least two opponents between them and the opponent's goal line). A player is not penalized for being in an offside position if the ball is received directly from a goal kick, corner kick, or throw-in. It is not an offense to be in an offside position. A player is only penalized for being in an offside position if, at the moment the ball touches or is played by a teammate, that player is involved in active play (e.g., interfering with play or with an opponent, or gaining an advantage by being in that position).

** No offsides in 3v3, 5v5, & 7v7.

Cautioned Players (Yellow Card): Players that receive two yellow cards in one game will result in a red card. (Please see Red card rule) Any player accumulating three yellow cards during a tournament will automatically be suspended for their next game (no exceptions).

Player Ejection (Red Card): Referees have the right to eject a player or coach from the game for continual disobedience or as a result of an incident that warrants sending off. The team may then continue with their remaining players, however, if the player receiving the red card was on the field of play, the team must complete the entire game a player short. The player receiving the red card will automatically be suspended for their next game (no exceptions). Players that are red carded need to leave the immediate playing area, including the fan and team areas. If a player is red carded for fighting, they will be ejected from the tournament and banned from the facility for the duration of the event.

Coach/Parent Ejection: Referees have the right to eject a coach or parent from the game for continual disobedience or as a result of an incident that warrants ejection. Coaches or parents who are ejected by the referee or tournament official must leave the field and area around the field before play will continue. If a coach or parent refuses to leave, the game may be forfeited in favor of the opposing team.



Dead Ball Rule: In all dead ball situations, defending players must stand at least 5 yards away from the ball. If the defensive player's goal is closer than five yards, the ball shall be played five yards from the goal box, in line with the place of the penalty.

9v9 & 11v11 Out of Bounds/Throw-Ins The ball must completely cross the goal line/touchline - whether on the ground or in the air - to be considered out of bounds. The side of the goal frame is out of bounds. The thrower must have both feet on the ground on or behind the touchline; the thrower must also use both hands, throwing the ball from behind and over the head in one continuous motion. The thrower may not play the ball until it has been touched or played by another player. A team cannot score on a throw-in unless the ball is touched or played by another player. If a throw-in does not enter the field of play, the ball is awarded to the opposing team at the spot of the throw. A player attempting to interfere with a throw-in in any way will be issued a yellow card for unsportsmanlike conduct.

3v3, 5v5 & 7v7 Kick Ins: The ball shall be kicked into play from the sideline instead of thrown in. The ball is considered in play when the ball is touched with a foot and moves one full rotation. All kick ins are indirect with the exception of corner/penalty kicks. This is an indirect kick, and a goal cannot be scored from this kick.

Goalkeepers: The goalkeeper may use their hands to control the ball within the penalty box. A goalkeeper has 8 seconds from when they control the ball with their hands to put the ball back into play. A goalkeeper may not touch the ball with their hands when a player on their team deliberately kicks the ball to them, or when receiving a ball directly from a throw-in by a teammate. A goalkeeper may touch the ball with their hands when deliberately passed from their own teammate by the head, chest, or knee. A player may not use trickery to circumvent this rule.

No goalkeepers for 3v3 - Instead, there is no ball contact allowed within the goal box; however, any player may pass through the goal box. If the ball comes to rest in the goal box, a goal kick is awarded regardless of who touched the ball last. Any part of the ball or player's body on the line is considered in the goal box and is an extension of such. Once the ball has broken the plane of the goal box, if the ball is touched by the defensive team, a goal will be awarded. If the offensive player touches



after the ball has broken the plane, a goal kick will be awarded. The plane of the goal box extends upward.

5v5 & 7v7 Goalkeepers players can pass back to their own goalkeeper retain possession with hands. If goalkeeper retains possession of the ball in hands, they cannot punt across half field. While in possession, only by throw can the ball make its way over the half field maker.

Kick Off: May be taken in any direction.

Player Registration: All players must be registered on their team's roster before the season/tournament deadline.

Substitutions:

3v3, 5v5 & 7v7 Substitutions can be made on the fly.

9v9 & 11v11 Both teams may substitute on goal kicks, kickoffs, injuries, yellow cards, or red cards. On throw-ins and corner kicks, the defensive team may only substitute if the offensive team substitutes. Players wishing to substitute must get the official's attention and be beckoned onto the field by the center official.

Schedule Changes: It is the responsibility of the coach or team captain to check the schedule for any changes for each season or tournament game.

Delay of Game: Any player may be cautioned with a yellow card if it is deemed by the referee that the player is intentionally wasting time. eg: if a player intentionally kicks the ball long distances away from the playing field in order to waste time.

Scoring: Games will be scored according to the following: 3 points for a win; 1 point for a tie; 0 points for a loss. A forfeited game is scored as a 3-0 win for the team present.

Tiebreakers: Heading into further stages of league or tournaments, teams that are tied in points will be solved by, (1) goal difference (2) head to head games (3) Pk shootout. When there are 3 teams with the same amount of points (3-way tie) the goal differential, goals scored or goals against will decide who wins. If all still remain tied a coin flip will determine the tie breaker. Odd flip wins.



Protests: Protests are strongly discouraged as this is a friendly league or tournament. Referee judgment calls are not grounds for a protest.

Referees / Timing: There will be no abuse of the referees tolerated, verbal or otherwise. Any indication of such behavior by a coach or parent will result in immediate removal from the tournament site. No abuse of any player, coach or referee will be tolerated. Please keep all comments (cheering) positive. The first whistle starts the clock on all fields & game ending whistle ends games on all fields. Teams must be ready to enter the field at least 5 minutes prior to scheduled game time. Game will be called off if team does not show within first half or 15 minutes, depending on type of play.

Age of Participants: Youth- The age group of each team is determined by the birthdates of the oldest player on the roster and the age group he/she will be playing in after league dead line.

Coed Rules: A coed team may be made up of any combination of male and female players. However, during play, there must be at least one female player on the field at all times.

Sportsmanship: Good sportsmanship is to prevail at all times. Coaches will be held responsible for the conduct of themselves, their players, players' parents and spectators.

Uniforms: All players must wear jerseys/shirts during play and each team must bring both a light and dark colored jersey/shirt. If both teams are wearing the same color, a coin flip in pool play will determine which team must change. In playoffs, the higher seed will have the option. League officials and referee must approve players wearing proactive cast, hard cast will not be allowed. Braces will exposed metal will not be allowed.

Jewelry: All jewelry must be completely covered and secured. Safety is still our top priority. Any jewelry that remains a risk to any participant (even if covered) will not be permitted. The only exception will be players wearing medical bracelets.

Equipment: All players must wear shin guards. Any player without shin guards will not be allowed to play. Here are the following ball sizes for each age group: U6/U8=Size 3 U9/U12=Size 4 U13&up= Size 5



Note: The League or Tournament Director has the right to move or reschedule games, as well as the right to shorten game times.

* The League or Tournament Director will have final authority on all event disputes and issues as well as interpretations of Tournament Rules *



VI. Organization Bylaws

BYLAWS OF COACHELLA FUTBOL ASSOCIATION

A Not-for-Profit Corporation
Organized Under the Laws of California

Article I - Offices

The principal office of the corporation ("Corporation") in the state of California shall be located in the city of Coachella, county of Riverside. The Corporation may have other offices, either within or outside of the State of California, as the Board of Directors may determine or as the affairs of the Corporation may require.

The Corporation shall maintain in the state of California a registered office, and a registered agent whose office is identical with the registered office, as required by the Nonprofit Corporation Act. The registered office may be, but need not be, identical with the principal office in the state of California, and the address of the registered office may be changed from time to time by the board of directors.

Article II - Members

Section 1: Class of Members

The Corporation shall have 1 class of members. The designation of the class and the qualifications and rights of the members of the class shall be as follows: all board members shall have equal voting rights and responsibilities.

Section 2: Election of Members

Members shall be elected by the board of directors. An affirmative vote of 75% of the directors shall be required for election. Except in the initial election of members, all applicants for membership shall file with the secretary a written application in such forms as the board of directors shall from time to time determine.



All applications for membership shall be presented promptly for consideration and investigation to the board of directors or to the admissions committee, if an admissions committee has been appointed by the board of directors; and, if an admissions committee has been appointed, it shall report its recommendations promptly to the board of directors. A list of applications for membership shall from time to time be posted at the principal office of the Corporation mailed to each member of the Corporation.

Not earlier than 30 days after a list of applications has been posted or mailed to members, the board of directors shall pass upon each application included in said list and either accept or reject it. After an applicant has been rejected, that person may not make another application for membership within one year thereafter.

Section 3: Voting Rights

Each member is entitled to only one vote on each matter submitted to a vote of the members.

Section 4: Termination of Membership

The board of directors, by affirmative vote of 75% of all of the members of the board, may suspend or expel a member for cause after an appropriate hearing, and may, by a 75% vote of those present at any regularly constituted meeting, terminate the membership of any member who becomes ineligible for membership, or suspend or expel any member who shall be in default in the payment of dues for the period fixed in Article XII of these bylaws.

Section 5: Resignation

Any member may resign by filing a written resignation with the secretary.

Section 6: Reinstatement

Upon written request signed by a former member and filed with the secretary, the board of directors may, by the affirmative vote of 75% of the members of the board, reinstate the former member to membership upon such terms as the board of directors may deem appropriate.



Section 7. Transfers of Membership

Membership in this Corporation is not transferable or assignable

Article III - Not For Profit: Purpose

Section 1. Purpose

Coachella Futbol Association is a non-profit Corporation and shall be operated exclusively for the operation of a recreational soccer league and charitable purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or the corresponding section of any future Federal tax code.

Section 2. Powers

The Corporation shall have the power, directly or indirectly, alone or in conjunction or cooperation with others, to do any and all lawful acts which may be necessary or convenient to affect the charitable purposes, for which the Corporation is organized, and to aid or assist other organizations or persons whose activities further accomplish, foster, or attain such purposes. The powers of the Corporation may include, but not be limited to, the acceptance of contributions from the public and private sectors, whether financial or in-kind contributions.

Section 3. Nonprofit Status and Exempt Activities Limitation.

Notwithstanding any other provision of these Bylaws, no director, officer, employee, member, or representative of this Corporation shall take any action or carry on any activity by or on the behalf of the Corporation not permitted to be taken or carried on by an organization exempt under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code as it now exists or may be amended, or by any organization contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of such Code and Regulations as it now exists or may be amended. No part of the net earnings of the Corporation shall inure to the benefit or be distributable to any director, officer, member, or other private person, except that the Corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in the Articles of Incorporation and these bylaws.

Section 4. Distribution Upon Dissolution.



Upon termination or dissolution of the Corporation, any assets lawfully available for distribution shall be distributed to one (1) or more qualifying organizations described in Section 501(c)(3) of the 1986 Internal Revenue Code (or described in any corresponding provision of any successor statute) which organization or organizations have a charitable purpose which, at least generally, includes a purpose similar to the terminating or dissolving this Corporation. The organization to receive the assets of the Corporation shall be selected in the discretion of a majority of the managing body of the Corporation, and if its members cannot so agree, then the recipient organization shall be selected pursuant to a verified and agreed upon neutral third-party mediator or neutral court appointee.

Article IV - Meetings

Section 1. Annual Meetings

The board will have 6 annual meetings held on the 2nd Tuesday of every other month starting June 2025 for the purpose electing board members and for the transaction of such other business as may come before the meeting regarding the operation of the soccer league. If the day fixed for the annual meeting shall be a legal holiday in the state of California, the meeting shall be held on the next succeeding business day. If the election of board members shall not be held on the day designated here for any annual meeting, or at any adjournment of the annual meeting, the board of directors shall cause the election to be held at a special meeting of the members as soon after as is convenient. No board member will miss more than 1 meeting per year.

Section 2. Special Meetings

Special meetings of the members may be called by the president, the board of directors, or not less than 75% of the members having voting rights.

Section 3. Place of Meeting

The board of directors may designate any place, either within or outside of the state of California, as the place of meeting for any annual meeting or for any special meeting called by the board of directors. If no designation is made or if a special meeting be otherwise called, the place of meeting shall be the principal office of the Corporation in the state of California.

Section. Notice of Meetings



Written or printed notice stating the place, day and hour of any meeting of members shall be delivered, either personally or by mail, to each member entitled to vote at such meeting, not less than 30 nor more than 45 days before the date of such meeting, by or at the direction of the president, or the secretary, or the officers or persons calling the meeting. In case of a special meeting or when required by statute or by these bylaws, the purposes for which the meeting is called shall be stated in the notice. If mailed, the notice of a meeting shall be deemed to be delivered when deposited in the United States mail addressed to the member at their address as it appears on the records of the Corporation, with postage thereon prepaid.

Section 5. Informal Action by Members

Any action required by law to be taken at a meeting of the members, or any action which may be taken at a meeting of members, may be taken without a meeting if a consent in writing, setting out the action so taken, shall be signed by at least 75% of the members entitled to vote with respect to the subject matter of the action.

Section 6. Quorum

The members holding 75% of the votes which may be cast at any meeting shall constitute a quorum at such meeting . If a quorum is not present at any meeting of members, a majority of the members present may adjourn the meeting without further notice.

Section 7. Proxies

At any meeting of members, a member entitled to vote may vote by proxy executed in writing by the member or by their authorized attorney in fact. No proxy shall be valid after 11 months from the date of its execution, unless otherwise provided in the proxy.

Section 8. Voting by Mail

Where directors or officers are to be elected by members or any class or classes of members, the election may be conducted by mail in the manner that the board of directors shall determine.

Section 9. Option: Order of Business at Annual Meeting

The order of business at the annual meeting of the members shall be as follows:



- a) Roll Call
- b) Reviewing and approving of minutes from last meeting
- c) Reports from President, Secretary, and Treasurer
- d) Election of board members (if any)
- e) Transaction of other business as denoted in any notices or otherwise

Article V - Board of Directors

Section 1. General Powers

The affairs of the Corporation shall be managed by its board of directors. Directors need not be residents of the state of California or members of the Corporation.

Section 2. Number, Tenure and Qualifications

The number of directors shall be 4. Each director shall hold office for 3 years. The directors shall not be personally liable for the debts, liabilities or other obligations of the Corporation. The directors and officers of the Corporation shall be indemnified by the Corporation to the fullest extent permissible under the laws of the State of California .

Section 3. Regular Meetings

A regular annual meeting of the board of directors shall be held without other notice than noted in this Section, immediately after, and at the same place as, the annual meeting of members. The board of directors may provide by resolution the time and place, either within or outside of the state of California, for the holding of additional regular meetings of the board without other notice than the resolution.

Section 4. Special Meetings

Special meetings of the board of directors may be called by or at the request of the president or any two directors. The persons authorized to call special meetings of the board may fix any place, either within or outside of the state of California, as the place for holding any special meeting of the board called by them.

Section 5. Notice(s)



Notice of any special meeting of the board of directors shall be given at least two days previously by written and delivered by e-mail. If mailed, such notice shall be deemed to be delivered when deposited in the United States mail in a sealed envelope so addressed, with postage prepaid. Any director may waive notice of any meeting. The attendance of a director at any meeting shall constitute a waiver of notice of such meeting, except where a director attends a meeting for the express purpose of objecting to the transaction of any business because the meeting is not lawfully called or convened. Neither the business to be transacted at, nor the purpose of, any regular or special meeting of the board need be specified in the notice or waiver of notice of such meeting, unless specifically required by law or by these bylaws.

Section 6. Quorum

A majority of the board of directors shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at any meeting of the board; but if less than a majority of the directors are present at the meeting, a majority of the directors present may adjourn the meeting from time to time without further notice.

Section 7. Manner of Acting

The act of a majority of the directors present at a meeting at which a quorum is present shall be the act of the board of directors, unless the act of a greater number is required by law or by these bylaws.

Section 8. Board Vacancies

Any vacancy occurring in the board of directors and any directorship to be filled by reason of an increase in the number of directors, shall be filled by the board of directors. A director elected to fill a vacancy shall be elected for the unexpired term of the director's predecessor in office.

Section 9. Compensation

Directors as such shall not receive any stated salaries for their services, but by resolution of the board of directors a fixed sum and expenses of attendance, if any, may be allowed for attendance at each regular or special meeting of the board; but nothing contained here shall be construed to preclude any director from serving the Corporation in any other capacity and receiving compensation. The board of directors may accept on behalf of the Corporation any contribution, gift, bequest, or devise for the nonprofit purposes of this



Corporation (so long as it is not for their personal gain and is solely for effectuating the purposes of the Corporation).

Section 10. Informal Action by Directors

Any action required by law to be taken at a meeting of directors, or any action which may be taken at a meeting of directors, may be taken without a meeting if a consent in writing, setting out the action so taken, shall be signed by all of the directors.

Section 11. Audit Rights

Every director shall have the absolute right at any reasonable time to inspect and copy all books, records, and documents of every kind and to inspect the physical properties of the Corporation and shall have such other rights to inspect the books, records, and properties of this Corporation as may be required under the articles of incorporation, other provisions of these bylaws, and provisions of law.

Section 12. Indemnity

The Corporation hereby agrees to hold harmless and indemnify each of its directors, officers, employees and agents (the "Indemnitee") from and against, and to reimburse the Indemnitee for, any and all judgments, fines, liabilities, amounts paid in settlement and reasonable expenses, including attorney's fees actually and necessarily incurred, as a result of or in connection with any threatened, pending or completed action, suit or proceeding, whether civil, criminal, administrative or investigative, other than one by or in the right of the Corporation to procure a judgment in its favor, including an action, suit or proceeding by or in the right of any other corporation of any type or kind, domestic or foreign, or any partnership, joint venture, trust, employee benefit plan or other enterprise for which the Indemnitee served in any capacity at the request of the Corporation, to which the Indemnitee is, was or at any time becomes a party, or is threatened to be made a party, or as a result of or in connection with any appeal therein, by reason of the fact that the Indemnitee is, was or at any time becomes a director or officer of the Corporation, or is or was serving or at any time serves such other corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust, employee benefit plan or other enterprise in any capacity, whether arising out of any breach of the Indemnitees fiduciary duty as a director, officer, employee or agent of such other corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust, employee benefit plan or other enterprise under any state or federal law or otherwise; provided, however, that no



indemnity pursuant to this section 12 shall be paid by the Corporation (i) if a judgment or other final adjudication adverse to the Indemnitee establishes that the Indemnitee's acts were committed in bad faith or were the result of active and deliberate dishonesty and were material to the cause of action so adjudicated, or that the Indemnitee personally gained in fact a financial profit or other advantage to which the Indemnitee was not legally entitled; or (ii) if a final judgment by a court having jurisdiction in the matter shall determine that such indemnification is not lawful. The termination of any such civil or criminal action or proceeding by judgment, order, settlement, conviction, or upon a plea of nolo contendere or its equivalent, shall not, of itself, create any presumption that the Indemnitee acted in bad faith and/or was dishonest. The obligation of the Corporation to indemnify contained herein shall continue during the period the Indemnitee serves as a director, officer, employee or agent of the Corporation and shall continue thereafter so long as the Indemnity shall be subject to any possible claim or threatened, pending or completed action, suit or proceeding, whether civil, criminal, administrative or investigative, by reason of the fact that the Indemnitee was a director or officer of the Corporation or served at the request of the Corporation in any capacity for any other corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust, employee benefit plan or other enterprise.

Article VI - Officers

Section 1. Officers

The officers of the Corporation shall be a president, one or more vice-presidents (the number to be determined by the board of directors), a secretary, a treasurer and such other officers as may be elected in accordance with the provisions of this article. The board of directors may elect or appoint the other officers; including one or more assistant secretaries and one or more assistant treasurers, as it shall deem desirable, to have the authority and perform the duties prescribed by the board of directors. Any two or more offices may be held by the same person.

Section 2. Election and Term of Office

The officer's of the Corporation shall be elected 3 years by the board of directors at the regular annual meeting of the board of directors. If the election of officers shall not be held at such meeting, it shall be held as soon thereafter as is convenient. New offices may be created and filled at any meeting of the board of directors. Each officer shall hold office until his or her successor shall have been elected and shall have qualified.

Section 3. Removal



Any officer elected or appointed by the board of directors may be removed by the board of directors whenever in its judgment the best interests of the Corporation would be served by removal of the officer, but such removal shall be without prejudice to the contract rights, if any, of the officer so removed.

Section 4. Vacancies

A vacancy in any office because of death, resignation, removal, disqualification or otherwise, may be filled by the board of directors for the unexpired portion of the term.

Section 5. President

The president shall be the principal executive officer of the Corporation and shall in general supervise and control all of the business and affairs of the Corporation. He or she shall preside at all meetings of the members and of the board of directors. He or she may sign, with the secretary or any other proper officer of the Corporation authorized by the board of directors, any deeds, mortgages, bonds, contracts, or other instruments which the board of directors has authorized to be executed, except in cases where the signing and execution shall be expressly delegated by the board of directors or by these bylaws or by statute to some other officer or agent of the Corporation; and in general he or she shall perform all duties incident to the office of president and such other duties as may be prescribed by the board of directors .

Section 6. Vice-President

In the absence of the president or in event of the president's inability or refusal to act, the vice president (or in the event there be more than one vice-president, the vice-presidents in the order of their election) shall perform the duties of the president, and when so acting, shall have all the powers of and be subject to all the restrictions upon the president. Any vice-president shall perform such other duties as may be assigned to him or her by the president or by the board of directors.

Section 7. Treasurer

If required by the board of directors, the treasurer shall give a bond for the faithful discharge of his or her duties in such sum and with such surety as the board of directors



shall determine. He or she shall have charge and custody of and be responsible for all funds and securities of the Corporation; receive and give receipts for moneys due and payable to the Corporation from any source, and deposit all such moneys in the name of the Corporation in such banks, trust companies or other depositories as shall be selected in accordance with the provisions of Article VIII of these bylaws; and in general perform all the duties incident to the office of treasurer and such other duties as may be assigned to him or her by the president or by the Board of Directors.

Section 8. Secretary

The secretary shall keep the minutes of the meetings of the members and of the Board of Directors in books provided for that purpose; see that all notices are given in accordance with the provisions of these bylaws or as required by law; be custodian of the corporate records and of the seal of the Corporation and see that the seal of the Corporation is affixed to all documents, the execution of which on behalf of the Corporation under its seal is authorized in accordance with the provisions of these bylaws; keep a register of the post office address of each member which shall be furnished to the secretary by that member; and in general perform all duties incident to the office of secretary and such other duties may be assigned by the president or by the Board of Directors.

Section 9. Assistant Treasurers and Assistant Secretaries

If required by the Board of Directors, the assistant treasurers shall give bonds for the faithful discharge of their duties in such sums and with such sureties as the board of directors shall determine. The assistant treasurers and assistant secretaries, in general, shall perform the duties assigned to them by the treasurer or the secretary or by the president or the Board of Directors.

Article VII - Corporate Committees

Section 1. Committees of Directors

The Board of Directors, by resolution adopted by a majority of the directors in office, may designate and appoint one or more committees, each of which shall consist of two or more directors, which committees, to the extent provided in the resolution, shall have and exercise the authority of the board of directors in the management of the Corporation; provided, however, that no such committee shall have the authority of the board of directors in reference to amending, altering or repealing these bylaws; electing, appointing



or removing any member of any such committee or any director or officer of the Corporation; amending the articles of incorporation; adopting a plan of merger or adopting a plan of consolidation with another Corporation; authorizing the sale, lease, exchange or mortgage of all or substantially all of the property and assets of the Corporation; authorizing the voluntary dissolution of the Corporation or revoking proceedings therefor; adopting a plan for the distribution of the assets of the Corporation; or amending, altering or repealing any resolution of the board of directors which by its terms provides that it shall not be amended, altered or repealed by the committee. The appointment of any such committee and the delegation of authority shall not operate to relieve the board of directors of any responsibility imposed upon it by law.

Section 2. Other Committees

Other committees not having and exercising the authority of the board of directors in the management of the Corporation may be designated by a resolution adopted by a majority of the directors present at a meeting at which a quorum is present. Except as otherwise provided in the resolution, members of each such committee shall be members of the Corporation, and the president of the Corporation shall appoint the members of the committees. Any member may be removed by the persons authorized to appoint such member whenever in their judgment the best interests of the Corporation shall be served by such removal.

Section 3. Term of Office

Each member of a committee shall continue as a member until the next annual meeting of the members of the Corporation and until his or her; successor is appointed, unless the committee shall be terminated sooner, or unless the member be removed from the committee, or unless the member shall cease to qualify as a member of the committee.

Section 4. Chairman for Meetings, etc.

One member of each committee shall be appointed chair by the person or persons authorized to appoint the members of the committee.

Section 5. Vacancies

Vacancies in the membership of any committee may be filled by appointments made in the same manner as provided in the case oft_1e original appointments.



Section 6. Quorum

Unless otherwise provided in the resolution of the board of directors designating a committee, a majority of the whole committee shall constitute a quorum and the act of a majority of the members present at a meeting at which a quorum is present is the act of the committee.

Section 7. Rules

Each committee may adopt rules for its own government not inconsistent with these bylaws or with rules adopted by the board of directors.

Article VIII - Documents, Agreements, Checks, Deposits & Funds

Section 1. Contracts

The Board of Directors may authorize any officer or officers, agent or agents of the Corporation, in addition to the officers so authorized by these bylaws, to enter into any contract or execute and deliver any instrument in the name of and on behalf of the Corporation, and such authority may be general or confined to specific instances.

Section 2. Checks, Drafts, etc.

All checks, drafts or orders for the payment of money, notes or other evidence of indebtedness issued in the name of the Corporation, shall be signed by those officers or agents of the Corporation and in a manner as shall be determined by resolution of the board of directors. In the absence of this determination by the board of directors, the instruments shall be signed by the treasurer or an assistant treasurer and countersigned by the president or a vice-president of the Corporation.

Section 3. Deposits

All funds of the Corporation shall be deposited to the credit of the Corporation in the banks, trust companies or other depositories as the board of directors may select.

Section 4. Gifts to Directors

The board of directors may accept on behalf of the Corporation any contribution, gift, bequest or devise for the general purposes or for any special purpose of the Corporation.



Section 5. Taxes/Document Availability

Subject to review of the Corporation's CPA and CFO, the Corporation shall provide its Internal Revenue forms 990, 990-T, 1023 and 5227, bylaws, conflict of interest policy, and financial statements to the general public for inspection free of charge.

The Corporation shall also make the aforementioned documents on its internet website: (pending) to be viewed and inspected by the general public.

The documents shall be posted in a format that allows an individual using the Internet to access, download, view and print them in a manner that exactly reproduces the image of the original document filed with the IRS (except information exempt from public disclosure requirements, such as contributor lists). The website shall clearly inform readers that the document is available and provide instructions for downloading it and the Corporation shall not charge a fee for downloading the information. Documents will not be posted in a format that would require special computer hardware or software (other than software readily available to the public free of charge). The Corporation shall inform anyone requesting the information where this information can be found, including the web address. This information must be provided immediately for in- person requests and within 7 days for mailed requests.

The Corporation shall submit the Form 990 to its board of directors prior to the filing of the Form 990. While neither the approval of the Form 990 or a review of the 990 is required under Federal law, the Corporation's Form 990 shall be submitted to each member of the Board of Director's via (hard copy or email) at least 10 days before the Form 990 is filed with the IRS.

Section 6. Investments.

The funds of the Corporation may be retained in whole or in part in cash or be invested and reinvested from time to time in such property, real, personal or otherwise, or stocks, bonds or other securities, as the Board of Directors may deem desirable.

Article IX - Books and Records

The Corporation shall keep correct and complete books and records of account and shall also keep minutes of the proceedings of its members, Board of Directors and committees having any of the authority of the board of directors, and shall keep at the registered or principal office a record giving the names and addresses of the members entitled to vote.



All books and records of the Corporation may be inspected by any member, or their agent or attorney for any proper purpose at any reasonable time.



Article X - Fiscal Year

The fiscal year of the Corporation shall begin on the first day of August and end on the last day of July in each year.

Article XI - Corporate Seal

The Board of Directors shall provide a corporate seal, which shall be in the form of a circle and shall have inscribed the name of the Corporation and the words “Corporate Seal: Coachella Futbol Association”.

Article XII - Waiver of Notices

Whenever any notice is required to be given under the provisions of the state of California Nonprofit Corporation Act (or other so named law) or under the provisions of the articles of incorporation or the bylaws of the Corporation, a waiver in writing signed by the persons entitled to the notice, whether before or after the time stated there, shall be deemed equivalent to the giving of notice.

Article XIII - Bylaw Amendments

These bylaws may be altered, amended or repealed and new bylaws may be adopted by a majority of the directors present at any regular meeting or at any special meeting, if at least two days written notice is given of intention to alter, amend or repeal or to adopt new bylaws at the meeting.

Article XIV - Tax Exemption Provisions

Section 1. Limitations on Activities

No substantial part of the activities of this Corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation (except as otherwise provided by Section 501 (b) of the Internal Revenue Code), and this Corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements),. any political campaign on behalf of, or in opposition to, any candidate for public office.



Notwithstanding any other provisions of these bylaws, this Corporation shall not carry on any activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a Corporation exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or (b) by a Corporation, contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code.

Section 2. No Private Gains or Entitlements Allowed

No part of the net earnings of this Corporation in any manner shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to, its members, directors or trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that the Corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes of this Corporation.

Section 3. Post Termination and Distribution of Assets

Upon the dissolution of this Corporation, its assets remaining after payment, or provision for payment, of all debts and liabilities of this Corporation, shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of Section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose. Such distribution shall be made in accordance with all applicable provisions of the laws of the state of California and subject to the provisions noted in these bylaws.

Section 4. Private Foundation Requirements and Restrictions

In any taxable year in which this Corporation is a private foundation as described in Section 509(a) of the Internal Revenue Code, the Corporation (1) shall distribute its income for said period at such time and manner as not to subject it to tax under Section 4942 of the Internal Revenue Code; (2) shall not engage in any act of self-dealing as defined in Section 4941 (d) of the Internal Revenue Code; (3) shall not retain any excess business holdings as defined in Section 4943(c) of the Internal Revenue Code; (4) shall not make any investments in such manner as to subject the Corporation to tax under Section 4944 of the Internal Revenue Code; and (5) shall not make any taxable expenditures as defined in Section 4945(d) of the Internal Revenue Code.



Article XV - Conflict of Interest & Compensation Authorization Policies

The purpose of this conflict of interest policy is to protect this tax-exempt Corporation's interest when it is contemplating entering into a transaction or arrangement that might benefit the private interest of an officer or director of the Corporation or any 'disqualified person' as defined in Section 4958(f)(1) of the Internal Revenue Code and as amplified by Section 53.4958-3 of the IRS Regulations and which might result in a possible "excess benefit transaction" as defined in Section 4958(c)(1)(A) of the Internal Revenue Code and as amplified by Section 53.4958 of the IRS Regulations. This policy is intended to supplement and not replace any applicable State and Federal laws governing conflict of interest applicable to nonprofit and charitable organizations.

VIII. Additional Player Development/Assistance

A. Development off the field

CFA believes that coaches and sports leagues are in a unique position where they are able to help develop youth in more ways than just on the soccer field. CFA will Coordinate two college/university visits annually which will include getting a tour of the campuses, seeing a college soccer game, and getting to listen to college players about their experience.

CFA will provide additional divisions than ones that are currently available in the Coachella leagues to help with player development. These separate leagues/formats of play will include 7vs7, 5v5 for ages not currently offered.

CFA will inform and assist all of our City of Coachella family members in filing the City of Coachella Parks and Recreation Foundation Sponsorship Program once a year for a reimbursement Scholarship of 50% as it is available.

D. True Pathway

The pathway consists of opportunities at the Academy, College, Semi Professional and Professional Levels. IX. Community Engagement/Events

CFA believes in being an active participant in the community, and providing resources that extend past the soccer field to better our Youth's lives in the present and future. A. *Insurance*

CFA will maintain in full force and effect the requested insurance levels while naming the City of Coachella and their officers and employees as additional insured.

Combined single limit for bodily injury and property damage: \$1,000,000

B. *Fiscal Responsibility*

All transactions will be recorded and income derived from registration fees and other fundraising shall be used solely for expenditures associated with providing league program activities and other community/player development events provided herein.

CFA will work to transition the participants from cash payments for registration fees to more secure digital payment platforms.

C. *Online Platform*

CFA will establish and maintain an online calendar accessible by the City and league participants for game schedules, training camps, league organizational information, bylaws, etc.

D. *Zero Tolerance Policy*

All staff, coaches, volunteers, parents and spectators are encouraged to conduct themselves in an appropriate behavior. CFA has a Zero Tolerance Policy that extends to coaches, parents and spectators.



CFA Zero Tolerance Policy

All COACHES/PARENTS/SPECTATORS must follow the Coachella Futbol Association (CFA) Code of Conduct at all times during all CFA events. This General Code of Conduct outlines the expectations for behavior and conduct for everyone involved in our leagues and events.

All staff, including coaches and managers, should familiarize themselves with the One and Done Policy. This policy ensures that any instances of serious misconduct are dealt with swiftly and effectively to maintain the integrity of the sport.

If a PARENT/SPECTATOR is sent-off from a game, the parent will serve a minimum 3-game suspension to be enforced by the league, team manager and team coach. A suspended parent that comes to a game during their suspension will result in the game being forfeited and the coach and manager being suspended from the next 3-games.

If there is a second incident of a PARENT/SPECTATOR send-off from the same team, the team will be placed on probation for the remainder of the season. A third incident will result in the team being dropped from the league.

If a COACH is sent-off from a game, the coach will serve a minimum 3-game suspension from coaching ANY TEAM IN THE League. A second coach send-off for the same coach will result in a 1-month suspension from coaching ANY team in the league.

Referee abuse by a PARENT/SPECTATOR will result in the player of the offending parent/spectator being listed as ineligible for the remainder of the season from all games in league.

Issues involving parents from opposite teams that results in the game being stopped before it's completed will result in the game being a double forfeit and the next scheduled game will also be forfeited for each team. Any further issues and the team will be dropped from the League.

PARENTS/SPECTATORS that verbally or physically assault any venue staff or CFA staff at any league event will have their player banned from participating in the League for the remainder of the season.

ANY PERSON who touches, confronts, chases, bullies, follows, cusses at, threatens, waits for, tries to fight, attacks or assaults a referee will be banned FOR LIFE from the CFA League.
