Opening Statement

Dear Members of the City Council,

Thank you for the opportunity to submit a proposal to continue providing youth sports services to the residents of Coachella. My name is Alma Rosas Aceves and I am a proud Coachella resident—a widowed Hispanic woman in her 60s who has devoted the past 16 years to building and leading a youth and adult soccer league that has become a cornerstone of our community through the Coachella Youth Sports Association Soccer League (CYSASL).

While our league has achieved exceptional competitive success—winning every available championship, including the 2025 Cal South State Cup U15 Governors Olders Division—our mission has always gone far beyond trophies. Our league has become a safe space, a second home, and a vital support system for hundreds of children, most of whom come from underprivileged Hispanic families in one of the region’s most economically challenged areas. We’ve watched these young athletes grow not just in skill, but in confidence, character, and community pride. For many, soccer is more than a game—it’s one of the few structured, positive outlets available to them.

A key reason for our impact has been the City’s ongoing support, especially continued access to local soccer fields at Rancho Las Flores and Bagdouma Park. This access is not only appreciated—it is essential. It enables us to meet growing demand and ensures that a trusted, proven program remains a guiding force in our children’s lives.

We are aware that new leagues are seeking entry into our city, and we welcome healthy competition. However, displacing a long-standing program with deep roots and demonstrated community benefit would, we believe, be a disservice to the youth we serve. Our league has always operated with integrity, passion, and measurable results. We are constantly evolving—improving our structure, quality, and reach—all while maintaining affordability, which is vital to the families we serve.

To strengthen our program even further, we have formed a strategic partnership with Open Soccer Alliance USA, LLC (DE)[™] (OSA), a nationally respected organization known for its expertise in player development and league operations. This partnership will enhance every aspect of our league—from coaching and administration to field maintenance and player support—while ensuring we remain true to our core mission: keeping our program affordable, accessible, and impactful for Coachella families.

Together with OSA, we are not just preserving our legacy—we are building a stronger future. This collaboration allows us to improve logistics, add resources, support our coaches, and open up new athletic and educational pathways for our youth. It is a partnership built on shared values and designed for long-term community benefit, which we explain in more detail in the enclosed proposal.

Our youth programs accommodate players from ages 4 to 17, while our adult divisions provide ongoing opportunities for continued participation and physical activity.

- Each player submits a form (signed by coach and guardian), ID or birth certificate, and a recent photo for ID.

- Note: Dates vary depending on division size.

H. Grievance Process:

- Incidents reported to referees and reviewed by board.
- Results posted online and at coach meetings.
- Grievance reports may be submitted online, via email, or in person.

X. Fee / Rate Structure

3. a) Registration Fees

A core principle of CYSASL is to maintain affordable league fees so that all youth—regardless of socioeconomic background—can access high-quality soccer programming. We believe that financial barriers should never stand in the way of a child’s opportunity to play, grow, and thrive through sports. Soccer is more than just a game—it fosters physical health, teamwork, discipline, and personal development. By keeping costs low, CYSASL champions inclusion, equity, and opportunity for families across the Coachella Valley.

Our strategic collaboration with Open Soccer Alliance USA (OSA) allows us to deliver professional-grade programming without compromising on quality. Through this partnership, our league benefits from OSA’s established infrastructure, including league management systems, administrative resources, year-round tournaments, and access to experienced coaches and operational staff. In addition, OSA provides access to regional and national sponsorships, which help subsidize player fees and fund local program development.

Every player in our league has access to OSA EDGE, a dedicated development pathway connecting youth talent to collegiate and professional soccer opportunities. This integrated structure empowers us to maximize community impact while maintaining the highest standards, ensuring that players benefit from quality coaching, safe facilities, and meaningful developmental support—without placing an undue financial burden on families.

No Kid Left Behind. Every Child Deserves a Chance to Play.

- Youth Team Registration: \$100 (covers both Fall and Spring tournaments)
- Early Registration (Youth Only): \$45
- Regular Registration: \$50
- Reinforcement: \$10 (for players playing up a division in the same club)

- Note: Each team is responsible for paying referee fees for each game.

Coachella Youth Sport Association Soccer League

General Provisions

- 1a.** As stipulated in the regulations, all regular meetings shall be held every Wednesday at 6:00 p.m. at the specified location (CET on Ave. 49 and Grapefruit).
- 2a.** As stipulated in the regulations, it is the obligation of all full members to attend all regular and mandatory meetings or to send a representative. All assistants and coaches must bring their ID badge.
- 3a.** Full members are entirely free to appoint a representative, who must comply with the provisions of the previous article.
- 4a.** All representatives designated by full members, as stated in the rules, are also recognized as delegates.
- 5a.** These delegates appoint their own sub-delegates, both of whom must be registered with the administrative jurisdiction board. Both delegates are required to attend all weekly and mandatory meetings.
- 6a.** The board of directors will issue a valid credential to delegates and sub-delegates, certifying their membership in this organization.
- 7a.** For all delegates and sub-delegates who do not attend weekly meetings, it is the delegate's responsibility to obtain the information shared at said meeting.
- 8a.** When a delegate or sub-delegate wishes to speak on a specific item during a meeting, he or she must inform the staff and follow the proper procedure. They must sign in upon arrival at the meeting.
- 9a.** If a delegate or sub-delegate wishes to request a role or schedule change, he or she must submit a written request at least two (2) weeks prior to the Wednesday for which the change is being requested.
- 10a.** Meetings should be kept as brief as possible. When there is no need to discuss a particular item, delegates and sub-delegates have the right to speak once and, in final cases, a second time.
- 11a.** As everyone knows, this is a nonprofit organization; however, contributions such as registration fees and donations are still necessary. No refund will be issued if a team withdraws before the end of a tournament.
- 12a.** The organization has financial obligations to fulfill and therefore insists that all contributions be made as soon as possible. Each player must be registered and paid for; otherwise, they will not be allowed to play.



13a. All contributing members attending meetings are required to show respect to the Board, assembly members, committees, and other participants.

14a. All association members are required to respect and comply with the bylaws, regulations, and agreements issued by the assemblies. Failure to do so will result in removal.

15a. Any team participating in tournaments not affiliated with the CYSA League is solely responsible for its actions. In the event of any incidents involving players, coaches, or referees, the CYSA League is exempt from any legal liability. Likewise, teams wishing to participate in external tournaments must sign a document releasing CYSA from all responsibility.

For Teams (B)

1B. For any team in U10 and above, the maximum number of registered players allowed per team is eighteen (18) players, fully registered and with a valid credential. This applies to ages 10 and up.

2B. For any team in U8 and below (ages 6 to 8), the maximum number of registered players allowed per team is fourteen (14) players, fully registered and with a valid credential.

3B. Under no circumstances is any team, in any division or category, allowed to exceed the number of players specified in the previous statements.

4B. Any team that wishes to register new players must first release the same number of players as those they wish to add. In case credentials are lost, the replacement cost is \$5.00 per credential.

5B. Teams will have the entire duration of the cup tournaments to make any roster changes involving player additions or removals.

6B. When referring to winning or losing by forfeit, the score shall be recorded as a 1-0 result.

7B. At the beginning of a game, if a team fails to present valid registration, credentials, or permits allowing players to participate without registration, they will have until the end of the first half to provide such documentation. If they fail to do so, the team will forfeit the match and will be responsible for covering the referee fees for both teams.

8B. If a team participates in a tournament or even a friendly match and loses by forfeit, they are obligated to pay referee fees for both teams. Friendly matches organized by the League are governed by league rules, including disciplinary sanctions.

9B. Teams that forfeit three matches, in addition to fulfilling the requirements stated in the previous article, will forfeit their deposit and be removed from the remainder of the tournament.



10B. Any team that fails to show up for the final match of any tournament will forfeit their deposit.

11B. Any team that fails to appear for their scheduled playoff games will lose their deposit and any form of awards.

12B. Without exception, no team is allowed to field unregistered players in any match. Any team that does so will forfeit the match in which the unregistered player participated.

13B. When a team has an excessive number of players and wishes to form two or three teams, the coach and applicant must clearly indicate which team each player belongs to. No player is allowed to participate in a team for which they are not properly registered.

14B. No team in the same division may have players participate with another team, even if the player belongs to the same owner, club, or organization. (Example: if a player is on Team A, they cannot play for Team B.)

15B. No team may field reinforcement players, even if they are not from the same team or club. If this occurs, the team will forfeit the match.

16B. Any team that leaves the field or abandons the game while there is still time on the clock will forfeit the match, even if they were winning. (Only the referee may suspend a game.)

17B. Any team found to have players who do not meet the age requirement for their division will forfeit all points earned in matches where said players participated.

18B. Please note that competitive teams in the age categories of 11 years and older must have a minimum of seven players to start a match. They will be given until the end of the first half to complete their roster. If the roster is not completed by then, they may continue with the same number of players for the remainder of the match. The official ball size for this category is #5.

19B. In the Pony and Mini Pony Divisions, the minimum number of players required to start a match is five (5). In the U10 division, the minimum is six (6) players. The official ball size for this category is #4.

20B. The only way a team may have a player act as a reinforcement is if that player is registered in a lower division than the one they will reinforce, and the team must have the same name and belong to the same club as the player.

21B. Only the first match of the day will be granted a ten (10) minute grace period.

22B. At the beginning of each match, each team must provide one game-ready ball in good condition to be used during the match.



(C)

1C. According to the regulations, no player is allowed to play soccer while wearing any jewelry, including earrings, bracelets, chains/necklaces, medals, or any material jewelry.

2C. A player who is expelled from a match due to a direct red card, unsporting behavior, or the accumulation of yellow cards will be sanctioned as follows:

- **First offense:** Suspension for one (1) match
- **Second offense:** Suspension for three (3) matches
- **Third offense and beyond:** Suspension will be double the penalty of the second offense

3C. A player who accumulates three (3) yellow cards will be sanctioned as follows:

- **First offense:** Suspension for one (1) match
- **Second offense:** Suspension for two (2) matches
- **Third offense:** The player will be suspended from the tournament

4C. A player who commits physical aggression against an opponent or teammate will be sanctioned as follows:

- **First offense:** Suspension for three (3) matches
- **Second offense:** Suspension for five (5) matches
- **Third offense:** The player will be suspended for the remainder of the tournament

5C. A player who retaliates with physical aggression will be sanctioned as follows:

- **First offense:** Suspension for three (3) matches
- **Second offense:** Suspension for five (5) matches
- **Third offense:** The player will be suspended from the tournament



6C. A player who is cited for any kind of verbal aggression toward referees, coaches, teammates, opponents, or spectators will be sanctioned as follows:

- **First offense:** Suspension for one (1) match
- **Second offense:** Suspension for three (3) matches
- **Third offense:** The second offense penalty will be doubled

7C. A player who responds to verbal aggression will be penalized as follows:

- **First offense:** Suspension for one (1) match
- **Second offense:** Suspension for three (3) matches
- **Third offense:** The second offense penalty will be doubled

8C. A player who insults or threatens a referee during or after a match will be sanctioned as follows:

- **First offense:** Suspension for three (3) matches
- **Second offense:** Suspension for five (5) matches
- **Third offense:** Suspension from the tournament

9C. When a player, whether on or off the field, incites or provokes violence, they will be penalized as follows:

- **First offense:** Suspension for three (3) matches
- **Second offense:** Suspension for six (6) matches
- **Third offense:** Suspension from the tournament

10C. Any players who participate or are involved in a physical brawl will be penalized based on:

- The referee's report and complaints submitted by clubs and spectators. Penalties will be imposed accordingly.



11C. A player who commits any form of physical aggression toward a referee will receive the following sanction:

- **Permanent ban** from playing in this soccer league

12C. Any player who is expelled or sanctioned may not play for any other team or in any other category while they are under suspension.

13C. All teams must be free of debt before they are authorized to participate in the semifinals and finals. Otherwise, the team in debt will not be allowed to participate.

14C. The head coach and assistant coach are responsible for maintaining order among the players and the team's supporters.

15C. If supporters invade the field, the team will face severe punishment.

16C. Any disruptive behavior caused by supporters will negatively affect the team.

17C. The competition rules are subject to change based on the needs of the organization.

Coaches and Team Officials

1D. When a referee reports a coach, team official, or assistant for insulting a player, whether from their own team or the opponent's, they will be penalized based on the severity of the offense and may receive a suspension ranging from three (3) to five (5) games.

2D. A coach, team official, or assistant who verbally offends or makes insulting gestures toward the opposing team's staff or supporters may be sanctioned with a suspension of three (3) to five (5) games, depending on the severity of the action, and may also be fined.

3D. A coach or team official who persistently argues referee decisions during a match will be ejected from the field and may also receive a suspension of one (1) to three (3) games, depending on their behavior (or a monetary fine).

4D. A coach or team official who insults or makes offensive gestures toward the referee will be suspended for five (5) games (or face a monetary fine).



5D. Any coach, team official, or assistant who physically assaults a referee will be **permanently banned** from coaching in this league.

6D. Any coach, official, assistant, or team supporter who is reported for consuming alcoholic beverages, tobacco, or using any illegal drugs inside the facilities or parks used by this Association for practices or matches will be asked to leave the premises. The incident will be reviewed during a meeting to determine the appropriate suspension.

7D. A coach, team official, or assistant who knowingly recruits a player already registered with another team, deceiving the player and their parents to join their own team, will be penalized.

8D. Coaches, team officials, and assistants are responsible for maintaining order among the players and the team's supporters.

9D. A coach, team official, or assistant who incites or creates a disturbance will be suspended for three (3) to five (5) games, depending on the severity of the infraction.

10D. Supporters from both teams are not permitted to be on the same side of the field. The league assigns specific areas for each team's supporters.

Uniforms (E)

1E. Each team is responsible for presenting players in full uniform, including jersey, shorts, socks, etc. Players not in complete uniform will not be allowed to participate in the game. Teams have until the third matchday to comply, during which time numbered pinnies may be used.

2E. Jerseys must have large, clearly visible numbers on the back.

3E. Shin guards are a mandatory part of the uniform. Players without them will not be permitted to play.

4E. No team is allowed to field players wearing duplicate jersey numbers.

5E. All teams have until the third matchday of the cup tournament to be properly uniformed.

6E. If the goalkeeper must play another field position, they must wear the full uniform appropriate for that position.

7E. If both teams coincidentally have similar uniforms, one of them must change jerseys or wear pinnies. The team listed as the visiting team is required to make the change.



Supporters (F)

1F. Any misconduct caused or incited by a team's supporters will negatively impact the team.

2F. If supporters invade the field, their team will be penalized as follows:

- **First offense:** \$150 fine
 - **Second offense:** \$200 fine
 - **Third offense:** Suspension of the team from the tournament

Internal Rules of Competition

The internal rules of competition are subject to change depending on the organization's needs. Any such changes or cancellations will be made during an extraordinary meeting, which must be attended by at least 70% of fully authorized members.

Organizational Structure

This organization is composed of two governing bodies:

1. Board of Directors

This body may change as needed and is solely responsible for voting on changes.

2. Sports Department

The Sports Director must have sufficient experience in athletics. He or she must submit a written letter outlining their experience to the Board of Directors. The Board will evaluate the letter, followed by a vote in which all organization delegates are eligible to participate. The Board of Directors reserves the right to remove or modify any member of the Sports Department who fails to fulfill their responsibilities.
